

Greetings....Happy Easter!

In the Gospel today, we hear of Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb of Jesus and finding it empty. We hear her say, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." She is confused, what has happened to Jesus, where has he been taken? When Peter and the other apostle arrive, we hear one believes but we don't know about the others. More confusion?

Aren't we sometimes confused in our own lives and unsure of how to proceed as we try to move forward? Don't we sometimes doubt ourselves and the decisions we have made in life? On Good Friday, we heard Jesus cry out "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" However, moments later, we hear him say with his dying breath, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." The scriptures tell that Jesus was like us in all things except sin. Maybe in his humanity Jesus had that moment of confusion, but he quickly places his life in the hands of His Father, God.

What of ourselves? We all have those moments of human weakness, those times of doubt and confusion. When the apostles are told Jesus has risen and that he has defeated death, they have a difficult time believing even though they have been told all along that this is what would happen. In seeing the risen Jesus, they finally come to believe. As we celebrate Easter, are we able to see God at work in our own lives; do we recognize Him even amidst those times of confusion and doubt?

As we celebrate Easter by spending time with family, friends, and loved ones, let us all take some time to give thanks for the gift of our faith as well as for our God who assures us that if we persevere in the faith, we will not be defeated, not even by death itself. Help us remember if we are looking for God and are willing to see him, we will see His presence and his work all around us.

Finally, on behalf of the Holy Trinity church and school staff and all of us here at Holy Trinity, I want to welcome all who have joined us today, especially our visitors. We are glad you are here!

Patience.

The word haunts me this Easter. Yes, the promise of all ages has now been fulfilled in the Resurrection, and we rejoice.

Even so, we have to wait for our slow selves to understand. We are forced to learn patience.

Remember how Jesus was so unhurried when he learned that Lazarus, his friend, was dying in Bethany, not far away from where he was? He delayed four days going there. In other words, he waited "forever," in emotional time. Mary and Martha, those close friends of Jesus, did without him as they buried their brother and grieved. Jesus finally got there and each sister cried out words that tore into him.

You could have saved our brother!

Jesus wept.

And then he replied, "I am the resurrection and the life."

On this day we rejoice because we can see that this statement of his was true. This day it is spread out before us in the Great Celebration of Easter.

We followers of God and his Christ take a long long time to get beneath the surface of this feast, to put ourselves into the hands of what, after all, is not a money-back guarantee, but a promise. "You will be my people and I will be your God." It is so tough for us to drink the milk of trust in the same way a child drinks at its mother's breast. We have to decide to entrust still another sluggish part of ourselves to God and to his promise.

Maybe the length of the Easter Vigil Service helps us to take in this fact. In the full service there are ten readings, including the Epistle and the Gospel, together with a candle-lighting-ceremony ("Light of Christ"), and numerous Baptisms. Patience is the name of the game at Easter Vigil. Maybe it is for the same reason Jesus made the two sisters wait.

The darkness of Easter Vigil, lit only by candles, lets us hear, in sequence, how God created us and blessed us, how he called upon and counted on Abraham, how he rescued the Hebrew people as they ran from their captors in the desert journey (and ran from God too).

For a "brief moment," we are told, God lost patience and turned away, but then "with enduring love" took his people back, offering water to the thirsty and grain to the poor. Can we trust this? How much?

You will be my people and I will be your God.

Finally the Gospel is proclaimed, announcing an empty tomb! The women in the story believe. The men don't. At least not right away.

How about you? Do you believe? Is Jesus risen or is he not? Is it just a child's fable, after all?

On this glorious Easter weekend, after we have reacted just like the disciples on those seemingly never-ending post-crucifixion days, and even after we sing songs about resurrection, still we do it by faith and trust. We hear it anew, maybe now more profoundly.

We wait, joyfully. Halleluiah!

Ultimately we are asked which path we will follow. The skeptical, calculating path of doubters, or the trusting, patient route of those who keep learning to believe—above all and after all—in the tender mercy of God.

Halleluiah!

SAINT OF THE WEEK & OUR SCHOOL NEWS

Julie Billiart, Virgin and Religious, 1751-1816



Mary Rose Julie Billiart was born at Cuvilly, in northern France, to the family of a farmer-merchant on April 8, 1751. This saint was exceptionally gifted. Though she had little education, Julie, as a child of seven, had memorized the catechism and was teaching the other children of her village about its lessons.

Recognizing the extraordinary holiness of this young girl, her

pastor allowed Julie to receive her First Holy Communion and be confirmed at the age of nine. (These sacraments were reserved to adults at this time in the Church.) At the age of fourteen, Julie took a private vow of chastity and dedicated her life to teaching the poor.

Two traumatic events happened in Julie's young life. A robbery of her father's store when Julie was only sixteen made the already poor family even more destitute. To help her family, Julie went to work in the fields. The second event had even more dire consequences. When she was twenty-two, Julie was sitting next to her father at a café when someone fired a shot at him. The shock of this incident left Julie partially paralyzed and unable to walk.

Confined to her bed, Julie spent several hours per day in prayer and continued to catechize the young children of the town who would gather by her bed. Her reputation for holiness was well known throughout the area. With the beginning of the French Revolution in 1789, Catholics were under suspicion for siding with the royalists. With Julie's reputation, she became the subject of the revolutionaries' wrath. No longer safe in her home, Julie fled to Compiegne where she remained for several years. During this period, Julie experienced a vision in which God was calling her to found an order of sisters dedicated to teaching.

After some time, a friend moved her to Amiens where Julie met Françoise Blin de Bourdon, Viscountess of Gizaincourt. The two, though from vastly different backgrounds, were both holy and prayerful women. This led to a great friendship and, ultimately, to the

establishment of the teaching order.

With the guidance of Fr. Varin, the superior of the Fathers of Our Faith, and with the concurrence of the bishop of Amiens, an order of sisters was established in 1803 for the purpose of saving the souls of young girls and training teachers. Julie, Françoise, and two other women took their vows on October 15, 1804.

It was also in 1804 that Julie, during a novena offered by her confessor, was asked by the priest to pray for an intention that he had. Five days into the novena, on the feast of the Sacred Heart, the priest said to her, "Mother, if you have faith, take one step in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus." Mother Julie, after twenty-two years of paralysis, stood up and was cured.

In 1809, misunderstandings with the bishop of Amiens caused the order to move to Namur, Belgium where they were welcomed by the bishop and where the motherhouse of the order, the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, remains today. Over the next few years, Mother Julie traveled around Europe and established several convents. In early 1816, Mother Julie became ill and died on April 8 of that year.

Today, the Sisters of Notre Dame have convents in Europe, North America, Latin America, Africa, and Asia.

St. Julie Billiart was canonized in 1969 by Pope Paul VI. Her feast day is celebrated on May 13. St. Julie is the patron of those suffering from illness or impoverishment.

Julie's message today: God will give us all of the strength and knowledge that we need to accomplish the mission that he has given us.
