HEAVEN'S GATE

Jesus tells two parables about someone asking a favor at a late hour. They teach us a lot.

Maybe you remember the first one, which Jesus told <u>two weeks ago</u>. He said there was a man knocking on a friend's door at midnight, wanting to borrow some bread. The friend yelled back,

Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.

But he does. Jesus says:

I tell you, if he does not get up to give him the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

Jesus interpreted as follows:

I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.

Doesn't it feel good knowing that constant prayer will get the door opened?

Well, hold back that feeling for a while. Look at this Sunday's <u>Gospel</u>. Here again someone is knocking on the door late at night, but receives nothing. The master of the house says,

I do not know where you are from.

The one(s) knocking reply: "But we ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets."

Look carefully at those words: The askers are mere casual acquaintances, if that. Something like this: we liked what you did, and now we want more!

The master says,

I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!

Ouch. What about "ask and you shall receive"? As if to rub it in, Jesus says,

There will be wailing and grinding of teeth when you see the saved ones —
Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets —
looking down from heaven

while you are being cast out!*

What is going on here? Is Jesus just in a bad mood? We know that he is "making his way to Jerusalem" when he tells this parable, walking straight into the crucifixion, and maybe he is just anxious.

Yet notice that, in his prior parable, even though the owner opens the door just to get the noise stopped, the interruption was being caused by a friend—even if a rude one—who would not stop asking for what he needed. That parable told us to keep asking God, our friend, for what we need, even though he may be a bit grumpy.

But in the parable for this Sunday, the people outside are not friends and in fact they have no relationship at all to the man in the house. The parable states that they knew about him only from parties and from the streets. They heard him preaching, but did nothing. They did not come to his house at a reasonable time and begin a friendship. No amount of midnight knocking will make up for it.

What is our lesson? That God keeps the door open long beyond what we would expect, all the way to the end. But if we are too busy partying and dancing, then finally there is nothing he can do. He has to accept our decision to stay outside.

The message? Get to know God now. Do not delay till you get to heaven's gates and have nothing to show for yourself.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST AND MARTYR 1894-1941



Maximilian was the prior of the largest friary in the world located at Niepokalanow, a small village near Warsaw in Poland. When World War II began in 1939, Hitler's Germany quickly overran Czechoslovakia. Father Kolbe prayed for the world, but he knew that his country was going to be involved. Poland, in fact, was next.

When Poland fell in September, 1939, the friary was taken over by

the Nazis and turned into a deportation camp for refugees, political prisoners, and Jews. Yet Kolbe and the few priests remaining saw this as an opportunity to conduct a ministry to the sick and terrorized prisoners.

Hitler's plan was to exterminate the Jews, the governing class and the intellectuals. The remainder of the population would be forced into slave labor for the Nazis. Priests were to preach what the Nazis told them and to keep the people submissive. This was not a plan which Maximilian Kolbe could subscribe to. Arrested in February, 1941, he was found guilty of writing unapproved materials and sentenced to Auschwitz, the infamous concentration camp.

Maximilian was assigned to a labor detail. The guards beat prisoners who, through exhaustion, fell down on the job. One time, Maximilian collapsed under a heavy load. He was beaten, then shoved into a ditch and left for dead. Another prisoner got Maximilian to the camp hospital where he miraculously survived and regained his strength. After his recovery, Maximilian was assigned to another work detail. In his barracks, he continued his ministry, offering encouragement and his food ration to his fellow prisoners.

Prisoners who tried to escape, if caught, were subjected to a slow and agonizing death as a lesson to others. If a prisoner was successful in an escape attempt, the Nazis would select several of their barracks mates to die. This happened in Kolbe's barracks, and ten of his fellow prisoners were chosen to be starved to death in a bunker. One cried out, "My poor wife! My poor children! What are they to do?"

Hearing this, Kolbe stepped up to the commandant and offered to die in the man's place. The Nazi officer accepted his offer. Maximilian marched off with the other prisoners to the windowless bunker where all food and water were cut off. Normally, those assigned to die in the starvation bunker could be heard wailing and crying in despair and attacking one another. This time, the camp heard singing .Father Kolbe, a gentle shepherd, was leading his flock to Jesus, the Great Shepherd.

On August 14, 1941, the Nazis needed the bunker so they went in to carry out the bodies. Kolbe, barely alive, was sitting against the wall with a smile on his face, as if seeing some distant vision. The Nazi doctor injected him with a poison and, in a moment, Father Maximilian Kolbe was dead, still with a smile on his face.

Maximilian Kolbe was canonized as a saint on October 10, 1982. We celebrate his memorial on the date of his death, August 14.

Maximilian's message today: Maximilian Kolbe was a 20th century martyr who gave up his life for another. In many ways, we all suffer as martyrs in some form. Think of those with AIDS or cancer, or those who have undergone a traumatic change in their lives, such as a death or divorce. It is how we approach this suffering, this martyrdom, which counts.

The next time some seemingly intolerable event takes place in your life, try a prayer accepting this as God's will and offering this to God


