The Carpenter's Son

This week the other shoe drops.

As opposed to last week, when Jesus spoke in a Nazareth synagogue, this Sunday we hear the people's reaction to his message.

A hint: they will try to throw him off a cliff.

To see why, look at how bold Jesus was. First he searched out a Messiah-prediction from the book of Isaiah:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. (Isaiah 61: 1-3)

The people loved him for this.

Except when he applied the reading to himself!

He said, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Gospel)! As everyone knew, "this scripture passage" was known to refer to the Messiah. They saw clearly that Jesus was claiming to be the very Messiah!

Stunned! They were stunned. He had grown up in their midst. He was the carpenter's son, the one they used to see weekly in this same synagogue. Why in the world would a local man invent such a bizarre story?

We already know why.

At the Jordan river, when he had received baptism, the heavens had opened up and the Holy Spirit descended upon him and a voice from the heavens said, "You are my beloved son, and in you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:21-22)! It was the Father's voice, right out loud!

Jesus' public ministry had begun. He was openly anointed as beloved servant of God, or Messiah.

Immediately he fled to the desert to brood and pray. His divinity formerly had been lodged mainly at the depths of his human awareness. Now it had to be drawn up into consciousness, out loud, and dealt with.

He knew he was human as well as divine. But he was attracted to wrong answers too, ones suggested by the devil, who in the desert had said, turn your divinity into self-satisfaction, into power, into reputation. Jesus was authentically tempted. But each time he refused.

Now, as Luke says, he had come back to Nazareth in the power of the Spirit. It becomes obvious why he had selected that passage from Isaiah at the synagogue. Isaiah's words were about him! He had heard it from God at his baptism.

How were the Nazarenes supposed to have any understanding of this? He looked like a madman, claiming equality with God! To them he was insulting his home town simultaneously with his people, with Israel, and with God.

"He is out of his mind!" they shouted.

Jesus told them that neither Elijah or Elisha, who were great prophets, could work their miracles in Israel but went elsewhere to do them. "No prophet is accepted in his own native place," he said.

Ah, so now he is one of the prophets!

They push him out to a cliff, planning to annihilate such a blasphemer. He escaped somehow but now the ball was in motion. This scene—and it is the very first one described in his public ministry—forecasts his remaining life. Loved and accepted at first, then led to his death.

In the coming months we will see him carry all of this out. What will he do? We must find out, because we are meant to be filled with the same Holy Spirit.

NCYC Informational Meeting Rescheduled



SAINT OF THE WEEK & PARISH NOTES

Dorothy, Virgin and Martyr, c. 303



There is a beautiful story told about St. Dorothy, who was persecuted during the reign of the emperor, Diocletian. The governor of Caesarea, Fabricius, imposed cruel punishments on Dorothy because of her refusal to worship idols or to marry. Dorothy spoke of the garden to which God would take her and the sweet fruits of the garden. The crowning blow for Fabricius occurred when two women, sent to induce Dorothy to give up her faith, were themselves converted. This led to a sentence of execution.

As Dorothy was being led to her execution, a young lawyer in the crowd, Theophilus, jeered at Dorothy and yelled at her to send him fruits when she reached the garden where she was going. Dorothy promised that she would. Just before her execution, Dorothy knelt and prayed. Suddenly an angel appeared with a basket containing three apples and three roses which Dorothy sent to Theophilus, telling him that she would wait for him in the garden. After tasting the fruit, Theophilus became a Christian and, later on, was himself martyred.

Based on the story recounted above, St. Dorothy is depicted in medieval art with flowers and fruit. She is the patroness of brides and of florists and gardeners. This saint is honored on the day of her death, February 6th.

Dorothy's message today: Dorothy is a witness to the importance of forgiveness, something all of us can imitate today. She forgave the one who callously taunted her, inviting him to share the glories of paradise.
