

Greetings,

First, I wanted to let you know that I did receive the results of the Church Pastoral Survey, which was given to the parish. I am grateful to all those who took the time to complete the survey. Your feedback and suggestions were greatly appreciated as I strive to be an effective and understanding Pastor for our Parish. Thank you to Tom Green and Gateways Pastoral Resources for administering the survey and putting together the results for me. The feedback and suggestions covered a multitude of areas and I am still working through them. On June 26th, I also participated in a pastoral transitions workshop where we studied more about successful transitions and successful parish leadership.

Additionally, one specific area was mentioned in the survey feedback that I did want to clarify. There were some in the parish concerned that this pastoral survey was replacing the Visioning work that the parish has already completed the past few years. I want to be clear; this survey was for my personal benefit and guidance as the pastor of this parish. The work of implementing the Visioning Report received by the parish is continuing with our Visioning Implementation Committee. We are making good progress in a number of areas. I plan to have a more detailed update in the fall when we all return from our summer activities and schedules.

Another suggestion from the survey, that I think is a good idea, is to reinstate the "Tuesdays with Father" that began with Fr. Michael. This would be an opportunity for families or groups to get together with me in your homes for dinner or just to socialize. As I continue to know the people of Holy Trinity better, these gatherings would be very helpful. Tuesday evening would work most weeks. Likewise, Sunday afternoon will usually work and would provide some added flexibility. If you or a group of friends/neighbors is interested, please contact me at the Parish Office or by email and we will get this underway again. I look forward to this chance to make some deeper connections. Thank you for the suggestion.

I want to say again how happy I am to be the pastor of my home parish and simply want to be the best pastor that I can be for Holy Trinity. I believe this survey will help in that effort. Again thank you to all who provided feedback and suggestions. There will be more opportunities in the future:)

MEET OUR SEMINARIAN

Hello你好 (Nee-How),



My name is Jason Lee and I am a seminarian for the Diocese of Des Moines from St. Boniface Catholic Church in Waukee, Iowa. This fall, I will enter Theology One at the St. Paul Seminary in St. Paul, MN for my theology studies. This summer, I have the pleasure of having a pastoral assignment, here at Holy Trinity.

I'm very excited to be at Holy Trinity and the Beaverdale area. I spent a lot of my childhood at my father's restaurant, the Rice Bowl Restaurant on Beaver Ave.

A bit about me, I grew up in a Chinese-American home and was raised in the Methodist faith tradition. As a Methodist, I was very active in my church as a teenager and even entertained the thought of pursing a vocation as pastor. I desired to preach the Gospel, teach the faith, and bring Christ to people. In high school, I encountered the Rosary from a classmate of mine. It was through her witness that I encountered Catholicism. Soon after, I began praying the Rosary and the Blessed Virgin Mary brought me to the Catholic Church in April 2014.

After entering the Church, I began thinking about priesthood. It seemed like a natural fit since I wanted to be a Methodist pastor. I attended Iowa State for my freshman year. I completed a Marian Consecration

through a book called *33 Days til Morning Glory*. The Virgin Mary placed it on my heart to apply for seminary. So, I transferred to the University of St. Thomas to attend the St. John Vianney College Seminary in Minnesota. While there, I grew in my Catholic faith, in my identity as a son of God and in prayer. Most Importantly, I fell in love with Jesus Christ and His Church. I graduated from St. Thomas in May of 2018.

Upon graduating, I took a job with a missionary organization called *Teach For Christ* in the Twin Cities. I was assigned an urban Catholic school called St. Pope John Paul II in Minneapolis. There, I functioned as a Teaching Assistant for grades 6th-8th, a 5th grade Religion teacher, soccer coach, and liturgist. I loved working with students and considered a career as an elementary educator. However, God had other plans. Throughout the year, God reminded me of the desires He placed on my heart to be a priest, to offer sacrifice, to be Christ to others, and to be the intimate friend of Jesus. With the encouragement of Fr. Parker, Bishop Pates, and my spiritual director, I decided to re-apply for seminary. This fall, I'll attend the St. Paul Seminary in Minnesota.

I want to extend my thanks to Fr. Mark and Holy Trinity Parish for the warm the welcome I've received! Know of my prayers for all you!

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READINGS

July 7, 2019

Reading I: Isaiah 66:10-14c Responsorial Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20 Reading II: Galatians 6:14-18 Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 or 10:1-9



Remembering

Jesus sent seventy-two disciples out to prepare each town he would visit. He gave his famous instructions about shaking the dust from their feet (Gospel).

Isn't it our duty to go out and spread the good news of the kingdom too? This Sunday we concentrate on that calling. Not a flat duty imposed by guilt or command, but by gratitude. Liturgical spirituality would say that it is in return for the great goodness of God to each of us and all of us.

Remember last week? Jesus was recruiting. He used tough language ("Let the dead bury their dead," etc.), and now he is giving army-like instructions as to how the seventy-two should act when they journey to the towns ("Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals"). Do we find ourselves ready to be sent out when we see, as far back as Good Friday, just how much God is willing do in order to love us and share our lives?

When someone loves you and stays with you, isn't it normal to respond with gratitude?

What was it that Jesus himself experienced that made him so grateful, that made him act with self-giving and surrender on the cross? We want to know because we are to imitate him.

One answer could be a theoretical one about the Trinity, about Jesus being the Second Person, close as close can be to the Father of love. But on Sunday we will have very earthy images that fill out that answer.

Take a look at the First Reading. It is a beautiful welcome home to a people who had been exiled from Jerusalem, who had hung up their harps because they did not want to sing in captivity.

The Lord tells them to

suck fully of the milk of [Jerusalem's] comfort, that you may nurse with delight at her abundant breasts! ... As nurslings, you shall be carried in her arms, and fondled in her lap; as a

mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you.

Maternal images, immediate, utterly compelling.

Peace flows from this motherhood of God. Our wild and wooly lives emerge from it and somehow always go back to it.

Jesus had been nurtured at Mary's breast. She was the mother who bore him and loved him and raised him. Through her and with her he was nurtured, and as well, at the breast of the Holy Spirit. His physical self had needs like everyone else, but his divine nature was now fulfilled, at all times, in the tender union that is the Trinity.

When he threw out his arms on the cross he asked the God who suckled him that most terrible of all questions, "Why have you forsaken me?" Even then, even in agony of soul and body, he remembered somehow the love that cradled him. His hope-against-hope let him stay on the cross.

You and me: when we forget the fond love God for our wriggling, snotty, childlike selves, we can still recognize that we knew such love in the past. And that we will know it again. We need to wait and pray, and, yes, suffer.

God is the crux of our lives. God sends us forth gracefully into the world. When someone loves us and stays with us, don't we keep learning to lovingly respond?

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Maria Goretti, Virgin and Martyr, 1890-1902



Saints don't necessarily have to have lived a long, sanctified life. This saint was only twelve years old when she was martyred.

Born the third of seven children to a poor farmer near Ancona, Italy, Maria was described by her mother as "happy, good, openhearted, without whim, but with a sense and seriousness far

beyond her years, and never disobedient." The family's circumstances meant that even the children had to work as farmhands for other people. Because of this, Maria and the other children received no schooling.

When Maria was nine, her father died. Maria's mother, sisters, and brother continued to work the fields while Maria cooked, sewed, and kept house for the family. At the age of eleven, Maria received her first communion, but the strongest test of her faith was yet to come.

The Gorettis were forced to take another family in to room with them. The son, an eighteen-year-old named Alessandro, soon began making indecent proposals to Maria. While she turned him down time and again, she never told anyone about them since Alessandro had threatened her and her mother if she told.

One day when Maria was home mending clothes and the others were working in the fields, Alessandro came home and tried to force himself on Maria. When she again resisted, the enraged youth stabbed her several times with a knife. Maria was rushed to a hospital where doctors tried in vain to save her, but, before she died on June 6, 1902, she forgave Alessandro and said that she wished to see him in heaven.

Alessandro was tried for Maria's murder and sent to prison. At first, Alessandro showed no remorse for his crime. But, after eight years, Maria appeared to him in a dream and his life changed completely. When his sentence was complete, Alessandro went to Maria's mother to beg forgiveness, which he received. He then became a Capuchin lay brother.

St. Maria Goretti was canonized by Pope Pius XII on July 25, 1950. Present at the canonization were her mother, her siblings, and Alessandro, her attacker.

This saint is the patron of youth and of teenage girls. She is honored by a memorial on July 6.

Maria's message today: "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." We say these words daily, but do we pay attention to what we are saying? Maria, mortally wounded, could forgive and pray for her attacker.

If Maria could forgive (and pray for) her killer, can you forgive someone who has done much less harm to you?


