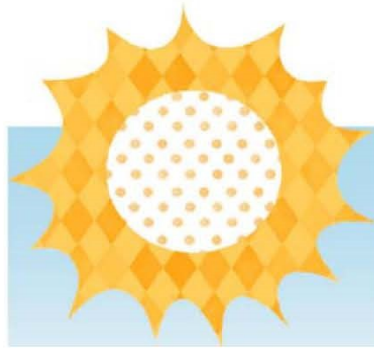

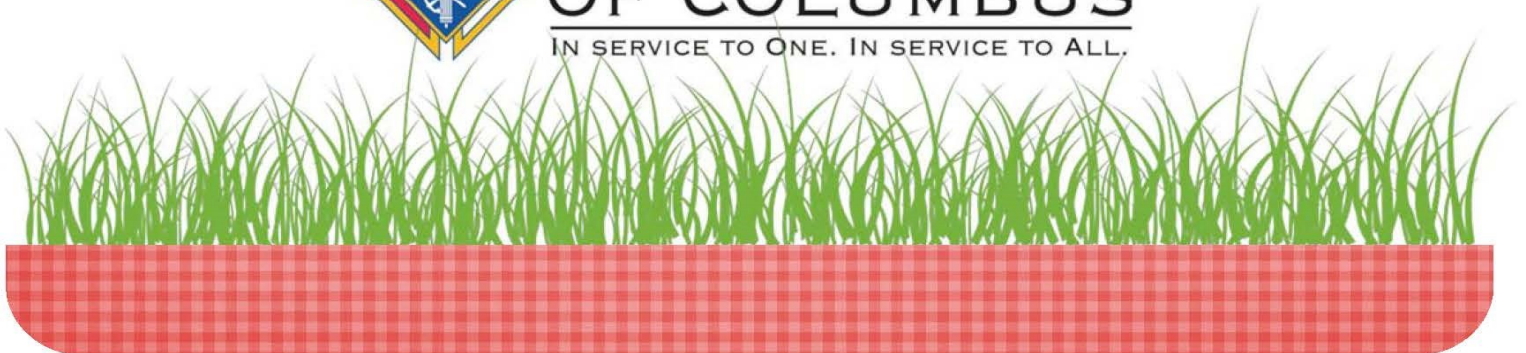

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READINGS

June 9, 2019

Reading I: Acts 2:1-11

Responsorial Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

or Romans 8:8-17

Gospel: John 20:19-23 or John 14:15-16, 23b-26



He Is Really Gone?

Sunday is the feast of the Holy Spirit.

Why not spend some time in what an Ignatian retreat director might give you to pray on? Your job would be not so much to “understand” the “points,” but to pray out of them. Use as many points as you want for prayer (and disregard the rest).

Intro: Remind yourself that you will be praying in the presence of God, the one who watches over you and loves you by name. Then sit quietly, with as much patience as you have available.

Then begin.

“What does the Holy Spirit mean to me?” To some people the Spirit is the one who causes an adherent to be “slain in the Spirit.” Others know it as somehow connected with the Trinity. Others have no idea. How do you come to the topic?

—pause and pray—

Point One: In the Gospel [the “B” selection*], Jesus says that, in his name, the Father is going to send “the Advocate to us: the Holy Spirit.” The English word advocate might be derived from the Latin *ad plus voco*, so it could mean “to speak for.” Thus, the Holy Spirit would be one who speaks on our behalf. But “Advocate” is only one translation of the Greek word, which is also rendered as “Paraclete,” “intercessor,” “teacher,” “helper,” and “comforter.” All these English words refer to someone who is called upon to aid another person and to defend them.

So begin your point knowing that the Spirit ...

helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. (Romans 8:26).

Ponder what it must feel like for the Holy Spirit of God to pray within you, to comfort you and help you when you call out.

—pause—

Point Two: Now imagine yourself as part of the dynamic story found in the First Reading:

You and the other disciples are gathered with in a house.

Suddenly a huge noise “like a strong driving wind” drowns everything out. Something like a tongue of flame appears and hovers in the air. Before you can think, it splits into numerous flame-like appearances, each of which hovers over a person in the room.

Then picture yourself preaching to the people gathered outside, who have at least 15 different languages represented among them. But they all understand.

Consider. What if you received this Spirit-flame? Is there a way everyone could understand you—in depth, in God’s love and truth?

—pause—

Point Three: In the Gospel [B] there is an immensely comforting statement by Jesus (women, please substitute “her”):

Whoever loves me will keep my word,
and my Father will love him,
and we will come to him
and make our dwelling with him.

Take time with each line. (Remember that “keeping Jesus’ word” means loving one another, not just keeping the law.) Consider the Father’s love for you personally. Let down your guard for a moment or two so you can be a home for Jesus and his “Abba.” Let the Holy Spirit pray within you.

—pause—

When you are finished with your prayer session, take time to thank God.

Call out to God and tell him where your heart is. Maybe God will give you a sense of who the Holy Spirit is in your personal daily life, in your progress from day to day.

As we said, it is the Holy Spirit’s feast.

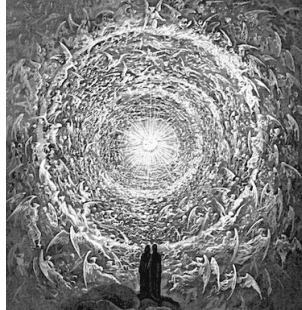

Closing the Circle

“Why do we have to hear all this stuff about the Trinity,” a gentleman asked at a talk I was giving. “Why can’t we just go to church and be good to each other?”

I replied, “well, we can ... because of the Trinity.”

Because the Triune God is not some kind of brainy speculation by scholars, it is simply the way we experience God in this world. Christian living is the Trinity in action.

Let me explain.

First, long ago human beings learned that there is only one God, who found “delight in the human race” (First Reading). Think of the many, many stories in the First Testament about God pursuing us, his labor to make a loving and holy covenant with us. “I will be your God and you will be my people,” he said. Like a marriage agreement.

Did this work? Well, not really. God became, by turns, angry, hurt, delighted, spurned, glorified, ignored, praised and rejected. Yet he kept coming back and back to renew the covenant, since God’s love is steadfast.

Second, we found out that God’s nature had always possessed another component.* God had not been alone or lonely, as in a desert. His very nature had always been to relate to others, to “pour himself forth,” as the First Reading puts it, and to receive back. This giving and receiving is the “Second Person,” or the “Word.” This Word was made flesh.

We saw him. Jesus laughed and cried and preached and turned over tables and cured folks, and was loyal to his people even to the end. “Everything that the Father has is mine,” he said (Gospel). That’s how we knew that Jesus was The Word and that the Word was God.

Gradually there came a third revelation about the Trinity. In Sunday’s Gospel Jesus hints about it: “I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now.” In other words, our small souls could never ever open to the great God—unless an actual presence of God gentled itself

down and began to dwell within us.

Do you get the two-way logic?

- Everything the Father has and is belongs to the Word.
- Everything that the Word has and is belongs to the Father.

This mutuality is a third “part” of God. It is the Spirit. It tells us who the Christ (God) is, and it bestows us (and the whole earth) back upon the Father, closing the circle.

What aliveness, what keenness there is in God: speaking to us, reaching out, flowing forth, and then receiving back. God is like liquid motion, like a dynamism in which everything is changing always, yet it remains always the same because it is rooted in love—because it is love.

We are invited into that circle of love.

Too theoretical? Allow me to put it more simply. Do you suffer? Do you love? God invites you to meld that pain and that care into the Trinity’s unending love.

SAINT OF THE WEEK & OUR PARISH SCHOOL

Mary Magdalen de Pazzi, Virgin, 1566-1607



Born into one of the richest and most powerful families in Italy in that era, this saint was christened Caterina in honor of St. Catherine of Siena. From an early age, the girl loved prayer and practiced penance. She also performed works of charity for the poor. She developed a love for the Blessed Sacrament while she was very young and liked being around anyone who had

just received Eucharist or anyone who was talking about the sacrament.

Caterina received her First Communion at the age of ten, rare at that time, and experienced the first of many ecstasies that she would experience in her lifetime when she was twelve years old. Her mother watched as Caterina, watching a sunset, was able to focus her mind totally on God.

Sent to a convent school when she was fourteen, Caterina lived such a holy life that the sisters predicted that she would become a great saint. From this experience, she told her parents that she wished to become a religious. While they were loath to give up their only daughter, being saintly people, they agreed to allow her to respond to her calling. In 1582, Caterina entered the Carmelite convent of Santa Maria degli Angeli. She chose this convent because of the rule which had the sisters receiving Communion daily, not a common practice at the time.

After entering the convent and, a few months later, receiving the veil, the young girl took the name Maria Maddalena (Mary Magdalen). Sr. Maria became quite ill and, fearing she might die, the superior allowed her to take her final vows in the Spring of 1584. Immediately after, Maria experienced a series of ecstasies for forty consecutive days. Seemingly at the point of death following this sequence, she had what was described as a miraculous cure and, despite a constant state of poor health, was able to carry on with all of the duties to which she was assigned.

For several years following, Maria suffered from terrible depression. The steps which she took to

overcome these trials so impressed her sisters that they were more convinced than ever of this young girl's virtue. Feeling that she was called to renew the Church, she wrote letters to the pope, cardinals of the curia, her archbishop, and others, twelve in all, asking them to make commitments to "The Renovation of the Church." Finally, on Pentecost in 1590, her sufferings from the depression and temptations abated.

Over the years, Maria filled several positions in the convent: teacher, novice mistress, and finally, in 1604, superior. In the last few years of her life, she was stricken with consumption and was forced to withdraw gradually from the life of her community. The terrible physical and spiritual pain with which she was afflicted lasted until her death in May 25, 1607.

An optional memorial honors this saint on the anniversary of her death.

Mary Magdalen de Pazzi's message today: God will give us the strength that we need to overcome any trials that come to us. We just need to ask for his grace.
