GREETINGS

During the Visioning Process, one of the things that the people of the parish expressed a desire for was transparency with regard to parish finances. I will continue to try to provide this information in a timely manner for our parish community. To this end, I have an update on our current tithing. As of August 18th, we are currently \$36,200 behind our budgeted tithing amount for the current fiscal year. (Note: No tithing was allocated to expenses for the Plaza Project). Our monthly tithing totals are based on the historic amounts for a particular month. Our July budget amount was fairly high this year, causing most of our current deficit. Moreover, this is not the direction that we want to move in with regard to our parish finances. We are currently trying to implement a number of visioning items that came from our visioning process as well as develop a master plan for the future of our parish. These items do come with a cost. If our income continues to decrease, it will be difficult to follow through on these plans. Holy Trinity has traditionally been a very generous parish, and I am confident that this will continue. I respectfully ask that we all review our tithing and see if we are up to date.

On a brighter note, we continue to work on the Annual Diocesan Appeal. We currently have 353 pledges. This is 50 pledges more than last year so that is good news. However, this comes from a parish of 1250 households, so we do have room for improvement. As parishioners continue paying off their pledges, we are very close to entering "official refund territory". When all pledges are completed, we are anticipating a refund of over \$10,000. As these funds will be used for a number of worthwhile projects, it is very important that all ADA pledges be completed. Again, thank you so much for your continued generosity to Holy Trinity Parish! If you would still like to make a pledge, please contact the Parish Office or me. We will be happy to assist you with this. You can also see me before or after any Mass.

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READINGS SEPT 1

Reading I: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

LET LOVE LIVE

It is said that we are made in the image and likeness of God. Sometimes this doesn't seem very likely.

Look at the "images and likenesses" that can settle into our hearts. Think about marriage, that institution which cradles the future of—not just of its delicate offspring—but also of the whole society, and which has become just a temporary arrangement, "just for the time being," followed by divorce.

And wouldn't you agree that sexual mores in the Western world are in the process of firmly and finally divorcing themselves from any consideration of commitment, responsibility and even care?

Aren't we tempted to addict ourselves to convenience, entertainment, internet, drinks, drugs, pleasures, pornography, and so on?

And how about the increasing number of very well known people—even priests and even bishops—who have wrecked the lives of children, some well-knowns still reaping pleasure from youths while still professing to be dedicated to the one who said "there is no greater love than to give up your life for your friend"?

I know, I know, the good has to be factored in as well. But with so much powerful evil stirred into the mix, what can be left of the image of God in human beings?

The poet E.E. Cummings wrote a particularly strong poem that includes the following lines:

King Christ, this world is all a-leak, and life preservers there are none, and waves that only he can walk who dares to call himself a man.*

By "man," cummings means "human being," of course, and the one he refers to in this poem did in fact become a man, one named Jesus. He let his "boat" be rocked and wrecked and finally sunk. Then he arose and walked and continues to walk the waves of our rough, drowning world. He is a man in the image and likeness of God. Within himself, in the place where it matters most, Jesus has complete openness to love. He lets it come in and he lets it go out to others.

Do you and I dare to unite with the image of such a human being? Deep within our own selves, in imitation of Jesus, are we capable of making room for such love? Can love-incarnate come to life in us if we gradually allow it to?

Yes. Love-incarnate wants to unite with us in the deep image and likeness of God. You and I have been created in it. This is the "image and likeness" we are made for.

If we addict ourselves instead, if we "exalt" ourselves, as Jesus puts it in the <u>Gospel</u>, we will wrap our souls in layer after layer of fraud. We will try to become our possessions, we will try to become what other people think of us, what culture manipulates us to be.

But our tiny boats of life actually are ship-worthy after all. If only we do not think they are ocean liners, able to grab whatever we want, we will "conduct our affairs with humility" (First Reading); we will allow God to love us and live in us.

And then we will be able to make a difference in the world. We will become the image and likeness of God's tolerance shining forth.

SAINT OF THE WEEK SEPT 1 2019

TERESA OF AVILA VIRGIN & DOCTOR 1515-1582



Teresa, sometimes known as Teresa of Jesus, was born in Avila in Castile, Spain. She was one of nine children of Don Alonzo Sanchez de Cepeda and his second wife, Doña Beatrice Davila y Ahumada. Teresa wrote of her large fPMily that "all, through the goodness of God, were like our parents in being virtuous, except myself."

At the age of seven, Teresa was already intrigued by the lives of the saints. She and a younger brother, Rodrigo, decided that the easiest way to become a saint was to be martyred since martyrs seemed to have bought heaven very cheaply by their sufferings. With that in mind, the two young children set off from home to travel to Morocco where, they were certain, they would be martyred and, thus, become saints. An uncle found them not too far from home and returned them to their frightened mother, so their sainthood was postponed.

After attending school in an Augustinian convent, Teresa becPMe a Carmelite nun in 1536. At that time, the convent parlor acted as the social center of the town. Many of the townspeople would come to the convent on Sunday afternoons; they and the nuns would sit in the parlor and discuss the issues of the day. Teresa participated in this and enjoyed it for some time, even to the point of giving up much of her prayer and meditation.

Teresa eventually cPMe to believe that the Carmelite order was too relaxed and began to fight for reforms. In that regard, she founded the St. Joseph Convent in Avila and several other convents in Spain for nuns who wished to live a cloistered life. These nuns cPMe to be known as the Discalced Carmelites for the sandals they wore (as opposed to the shoes which the other nuns wore). With St. John of the Cross, Teresa also founded a similar monastery for men.

Teresa chose her novices in a way which might seem strange to us. Before considering their piety, Teresa wanted to know about their intelligence and common sense. A person could train herself to piety, she felt, but not to good judgment. "May God preserve us from stupid nuns!" she exclaimed.

In her efforts to effect reform within the Carmelites, Teresa traveled all over Spain and wrote many letters and books which are regarded as classics of spiritual literature. Her book *Way of Perfection* was written for the guidance of her nuns and Foundations was written for their encouragement. But Teresa also wrote for the rest of the Church. Her book *Interior Castle* explains the contemplative life for the layperson.

Though a contemplative, Teresa managed to successfully blend a highly active life with spiritual meditation. She was a popular person who combined charm and wit with humility and courtesy, so that even her enemies respected her.

St. Teresa was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1970 by Pope Paul VI, the first woman so honored.

Teresa's message today: What a magnificent combination of characteristics this saint possessed: charm, wit, humility, courtesy, all combined with sanctity. Too often, we picture cloistered nuns as rather grim, but Teresa shows us that this does not have to be. We too should maintain a cheerful demeanor even as we practice penance and sacrifice.

How well do you succeed at keeping time for quiet prayer and meditation a part of your daily life?


