2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS



This school year, Year Holy Trinity received the Prairie Meadows Grant to purchase *Really Great Reading* materials and a new math curriculum for our transitional kindergarten program. Holy Trinity also received the State of Iowa Computer Science Grant-Professional Development for the Implementation of Computer Science standards into our classrooms as well as new Chromebooks for our STEM class.

Our staff is committed. to gaining new skills through continuing education and career training. Each staff member gained 120 hours of professional development. Some went above and beyond, underwent additional hours throughout the year, equaling 85 additional hours.





Seven groups of students, grades 3-5, participated in Battle of the Books, a diocesan extracurricular reading program designed to give students an opportunity to read books outside of the school curriculum, and then compete at school and with/against other schools. A third grade team from Holy Trinity came in first place in the Diocese for the competition in 2023.

Our 2022 Walkathon *Reinforcing Our Roots* met a record breaking \$40,000 goal to go towards a new playground. This will be paired with funds raised during the 2023 Walkaton fundraiser.

FAITH AND SERVICE



Fall of 2022, 82 students enrolled in Faith Formation, led by our volunteer staff. There were 34 Baptisms performed, 46 First communicants (2nd grade), and 39 individuals were Confirmed.

Student council hosted a donation drive for the Des Moines Refugee Support and over hundreds of items were donated to help families in need. Items included extra clothes, toys, toiletries, extra winter gear, and school supplies.







May was devoted to Mother Mary, and students celebrated a special May Crowning Mass. May Crowning was celebrated as a school and the 8th grade led a beautiful ceremony for our school to celebrate not only Mary but Joseph as well.

More than 165 participants and volunteers celebrated Vacation Bible School. All participants enjoyed a wonderful week of prayer, community, and fun!





EXCELLENCE



Kids Connection provides quality licensed child care for Holy Trinity families. Kids Connection increased their licensed capacity by 56% in the 2022/23 school year.

Technology integration into our classrooms provides advanced and interactive resources for our students. BenQ boards were installed in classrooms at the end of summer. These boards help increase involvement and allow teachers to be more flexible in their instruction.





Holy Trinity Nutrition Services takes great pride in our quality, presentation, and service to students and staff. Our menus offered a variety of nutritionally balanced and appetizing school meal choices for the students, staff, parents, and guardians of Holy Trinity Catholic School while following nutritional guidelines set by the USDA.











EXCELLENCE

Holy Trinity Catholic School participates in the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP). ISASP is a standards-based assessment designed to inform schools and families on how students perform on the Iowa Core Academic Standards. Students performing at the proficient level demonstrate adequate competency in the knowledge, skills, and abilities that meet the requirements for their grade level associated with academic readiness for college and a career in the subject area.

EXCELLENCE

Holy Trinity Catholic School applies the use of a standards-based evaluation tool, FASTBridge, for grades K-5 to identify student goals for learning and provide individualized student support to ensure these goals are met. This screening and early identification of student needs increases the speed of intervention and supports a building-wide multi-tiered system of support. These assessments help teachers better understand student progress and needs. Moreover, this additional layer of data allows teachers to focus on essential skills and better track student growth.

2022/23 FASTBridge Highlights:

- 88% of K-1 students are on track in early math skills.
- 28% of students in grades k-1 made aggressive growth in their early math skills.
- 80% of students in grades 2-5 were proficient in their math comprehension skills.
- 17% of students in grades 2-5 aggressively grew their math comprehension skills.
- 73% of students in grades 2-5 were proficient in their math fact fluency.
- 28% of students in grades 2-5 made aggressive growth in their math fact fluency
- 76% of students in grades 2-5 are on track or advanced in their reading fluency
- 75% of students in grades 2-5 are on track or advanced in their reading comprehension skills.

*Aggressive growth is defined as a score increase from fall to spring greater than 75 percent or more of their peers nationally.

**FASTBridge does not assign an "advanced" designation for grades K-1.

Students in grades 6-8 participate in the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. This assessment measures achievement and growth in math, reading, and language usage, providing teachers with data to help inform instructional strategies and create an individualized learning experience for each student.

2022/23 MAP Highlights:

- 77% of students in middle school scored average or higher on their MAP math test.
- 83% of students in middle school scored average or higher on their MAP reading test.
- 84% of students in middle school scored average











COMMUNITY



Holy Trinity became 1 of 18 schools in Iowa to renew its qualification as a Model Professional Learning Community School. Model PLC Schools must demonstrate a commitment to PLC at Work® concepts, implement those concepts for at least three years, present clear evidence of improved student learning, and provide data on a yearly basis that shows they continue to meet the criteria of the PLC at Work process.



Our school serves students and families from all faith backgrounds, ethnicities, races, and cultures. Student ethnic diversity was 28 percent.



An education at Holy Trinity Catholic School is an investment in a child's future. No family is turned away due to financial hardship. 37 percent of our students received assistance from the Catholic Tuition Organization, totaling \$139,772 to make a Catholic education possible.



Hundreds of Holy Trinity community members attended the Masquerade Gala, which raised over \$65,000 to support our school, \$20,000 of which supported our new Wit and Wisdom curriculum. Wit and Wisdom is a comprehensive K–8 English language arts curriculum crafted to help students build the knowledge and skills they need to be successful readers, exceptional writers, and effective communicators.

THE COST TO EDUCATE


We greatly appreciate and understand the financial sacrifice our families make to provide their children with an education at our school. However, tuition only covers a portion of the cost of educating a student at our schools.

TUITION AND COST TO EDUCATE


- Cost to Educate = \$7,489/student
