



FROM FATHER MARK | DATE APRIL 9, 2023

Greetings...Happy Easter!

In the Gospel today, we hear of Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb of Jesus and finding it empty. We hear her say, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." She is confused. What has happened to Jesus? Where has he been taken? When Peter and the other apostle arrive, we hear one apostle believes but we do not know about the other. More confusion?

Aren't we sometimes confused in our own lives and unsure of how to proceed as we try to move forward? We sometimes doubt ourselves and the decisions that we have made in life. On Good Friday, we heard Jesus cry out "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" However, moments later, we hear him say with his dying breath, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." The scriptures tell us that Jesus was like us in all things except sin. Maybe in his humanity, Jesus had a moment of confusion, but he quickly places his life in the hands of His Father, our God.

What of ourselves? We all have those moments of human weakness, those times of doubt and confusion. When the apostles were told Jesus has risen and that he has defeated death, they have a difficult time believing even though they have been told all along that this is what would happen. *In seeing the risen Jesus, they finally come to believe.* As we celebrate Easter, are we able to see God at work in our own lives? Do we recognize Him even amidst those times of confusion and doubt?

As we celebrate Easter and spend time with family, friends, and loved ones, let us all take some time to give thanks for the gift of our faith. We also give thanks for our God who assures us that if we persevere in the faith, we will not be defeated, not even by death itself. If we are really looking for God and are willing to see him, we will see His presence and his work all around us.

Taking the Journey TOGETHER

Easter Sunday

The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

God raised him up on the third day.

- In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter efficiently summarizes Jesus' life and death.
- Peter, whose denial of Jesus was heartrending, had now been given a new strength to tell the story of God's anointed one.
- The source of Peter's strength was his "witness"; he was one of the few who had been chosen "to eat and drink with Jesus after he rose from the dead". (Acts 10:41)

Reading II: Colossians 3:1-4

Set your heart on what pertains to higher realms.

- The two readings from the letter of Paul (we will use one or the other in our Liturgy of the Word) provide encouragement and insight to the newly baptized and to all Christians.
- The event of Baptism is a life-long journey that we renew every day.
- In both readings, Paul's point is clear: The Lamb of God has been sacrificed to give us fullness of life, and we must respond to that gift by the way we live our lives.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

Mary Magdalene came to the tomb.

- The Gospel reading is John's version of the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb.
- Central to the story is how the participants come to believe in the risen Lord.
- The disciples saw and believed, however the author calls attention to the "Beloved Disciple", who saw only the minimum yet believed.

BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | APRIL 9, 2023


Reading I Acts 10:34a, 37-43 | Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 | Reading II Colossians 3:1-4 | Gospel John 20:1-9

Question For The Children When have you seen someone do a good deed for someone else?

Question For The Youth Jesus' closest friends had trouble believing that the tomb was empty. Resurrection is surprising. What does Jesus' resurrection mean in your life?

Question For The Adults Name one way or time when you experience the presence of the Risen Christ? Is it at meals? With those whom you love? At other times?

Activity Of The Week Jesus' Resurrection offers us new life and new hope. Create a work space in your home with markers, stickers and construction paper of bright colors. As a family, make Easter cards to take or send to people in nursing homes.



Saint Of The Week Mark

Mark's Gospel is very likely the first one written (sometime between 60 and 70 while in Rome) and is the shortest of the four. He often goes into much more detail in describing Jesus' ministry than the other evangelists. In the Acts of the Apostles and the Letters of Peter and Paul, Mark is mentioned several times. He was the son of Mary at whose house in Jerusalem Peter and the other Apostles stayed. He was a cousin of Barnabas. He accompanied Paul and Barnabas on Paul's first missionary journey, and he was with Paul in Rome during Paul's first imprisonment. Mark was evidently a disciple of Peter who refers to him as "Mark, my son." An early, though uncertain, tradition about Mark is that he was the first bishop of Alexandria.

Mark's message today:

Imagine telling the story of Jesus' life to people who have never heard it before. Some of today's evangelists are the teachers of faith formation who tell Jesus' story to children.

Have you considered offering to teach or help in some way the Faith Formation program in your parish? Your help would be most appreciated.


