

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITY!

In 2011, the Iowa National Guard was partnered with the Kosovo Security Force through the National Guard Bureau's State Partnership Program. In 2013, then Governor Branstad signed the sister state agreement with the President Kosovo, which opened the door for the whole of Iowa society to interact and build partnerships with Kosovo organizations.

As some of you know, Mother Teresa is from the region. (Skopje, in North Macedonia) Due to her importance and influence, there is much respect and reverence for her throughout Kosovo. In fact, there is a Catholic Church basically in the heart of Prishtina (capital city of Kosovo) called Mother Teresa Cathedral. Kosovo is traditionally a Muslim (very secular) country, yet Mother Teresa is everywhere. In their daily conversations, in their art, and obviously hundreds walk by a building that holds her name.

lowa Sister States, in partnership with the Consulate of Kosovo (located in Des Moines), is putting together a trip for lowans who are either working on projects, or want to make new connections in Kosovo. This trip will be from Sept. 25 to Oct. 3. Costs include your own airfare and hotel. Trip organizers will put together a schedule for you, arrange your transportation and accommodations. We view this trip as a great way for members of our congregation to make a connection directly with the parish at Mother Teresa's Cathedral and to learn more about this uniquely secular country.

The Diocese is now **recommending**, not requiring, masks for parishioners over the age of five during all indoor liturgies and other indoor parish events. Although recent evidence has shown that breakthrough infections can occur in vaccinated individuals, and that vaccinated individuals can be contagious, it is also the case that infection is less likely for vaccinated individuals, and the risk of severe symptoms is much less likely. There are still ample benefits to vaccination, and our Catholic moral teaching consistently affirms the value of vaccination both for individuals and for the common good.

Additionally, masks will be required for all clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion during the distribution of communion.

Most importantly, as you have throughout the pandemic, please continue to witness to a spirit of unity and selfless care for others. By recommending masks we are allowing for more individual and communal discernment in mitigation strategies, but the most important thing is to exercise prudence and concern for the most vulnerable among us during this time. We will continue to monitor the public health situation closely, and if the situation continues to deteriorate we will take more stringent precautions.

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READING

Can You Hear?

There are people who talk all the time. At least so it might seem. You or I could be one of them and not realize it. Maybe it is just exuberance of personality, or a brain packed full of ideas that simply must poke their way out.

Mary is the great example of hearing and then speaking.

Or it could be self-centeredness. I have known folks who take their breath in the middle of a sentence instead of at the end so that they can rush to the next sentence without a pause at the period, leaving no room for anyone else to butt in. Am I being unkind? Not really. It takes all types.

But there is a lesson to be learned from this phenomenon, and it concerns each one of us.

The more we talk the less we listen.

Truly listen, I mean. If we talk all the time, our energy is taken up by our own thoughts and actions and effects. We miss one of the greatest treasures of all: the beauty of other people in their complexity and in their simplicity and their interiority. Alright, should we then just sit in silence and let others talk? No, no. We must take care to exchange with others. To talk, yes, but also to listen.

All true relationships, be they societal niceties or deep friendships, are founded on receiving and giving. We give the gift of attention to the other, and we receive it back from them.

That being said, the <u>Gospel</u> surely gives us a test case. Why does the newly pregnant Mary talk so much this Sunday? She has hurried to her cousin Elizabeth's house in the hill country, and hardly have they even said hello when Mary bursts into a long speech or song, the Magnificat. In it she even says that all generations are going to call her blessed! Talking about herself, so it seems.

But examine the words just before the Magnificat. Mary is actually responding to what Elizabeth has just said. "You are the mother of my Lord! Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."

In return Mary does let excited words pour from her mouth.

The Magnificat is not about Mary, it is entirely about God. She will be blessed by all generations, she says, not at all because she is herself something great, but because God's love and mercy are, and they will pour out through her to the world. Mary had a lifelong habit of listening to God's love. She sensed the Holy Spirit when she received it. Her reaction? To speak the divine Word into the world. She is the great example of hearing and then speaking.

The feast of the Assumption salutes this trust and openness in Mary. At the end she had been at one with God all her life, even in the searing passion and death of her son. The Assumption is not a mythical statement of fancy, it is an acknowledgment of how close Mary had been to Jesus all life long, and especially in his death.

It would have been superfluous for her to die again.

Question for Adults: How does your faith in Jesus nourish your own life? How does the Eucharist nourish you?


SAINT OF THE WEEK

John Eudes, Priest

John's early training came from the Jesuits, but his own interest was in the Congregation of the Oratory, a group of secular priests who took no vows, but had a common goal of reinvigorating the spiritual life of their communities. John was ordained in 1625 and celebrated his first Mass on Christmas Day that year. John sought and, after some delay, received permission to go to Normandy to minister to sick and dying and their families. His ministry was most welcome because many of the priests in the region had fled the area to avoid the plague.

John's message today: John ministered to the sick and to the fallen, conducted missions, founded religious orders, and established new devotions. When he felt overwhelmed by all the tasks he had taken on, he prayed for help from God and found new strength in that grace.

Do you stick with a mission until you feel satisfied that your share of the task is completed? Whom do you turn to when you feel overburdened by the demands in your life?
