GREETINGS.

As you know, we have begun the annual Diocesan Appeal. Our assessment this year is \$110,714; a slight decrease from last year. As I spoke about at the masses on March 5 and 6, the Appeal is an essential effort each year. It supports programs and ministries that no single parish can accomplish alone.

Among the programs and ministries supported by the Annual Appeal are: Encountering Christ – ministries that bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to all

- 390 engaged couples undergoing marriage preparation
- 35,000 households receive the Good News in The Catholic Mirror
- 6,291 children receive a holistic education in our Catholic Schools
- 16 Catholic Schools with professional training, supervision and oversight
- 9,185 children encounter Christ in parish faith formation programs Shepherding the Faithful – supporting our faith leaders
- 36 retired priests with medical care and retirement income
- 53 active priests with medical insurance provided exclusively by the Diocese
- 15 seminarians with formation and tuition expenses
- 109 Deacons and candidates with training, education and support
- 20 international priests with US Citizenship and immigration services

The above are only part of what your gifts to the appeal support. I will continue sharing more information throughout the appeal. I hope all parishioners will join me in supporting this year's Annual Appeal. Thank you in advance for your generosity!





I am pleased to announce that I have named Dr. Dan Ryan as president of the new regional system for the 12 Catholic schools in the Des Moines metro area. He will continue to serve as president of Dowling Catholic High School in addition to leading the region. Dr. Ryan brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the position and I am confident he will be an effective leader in this new combined role.

This appointment follows a national search led by Superintendent Donna Bishop and Steve Lacy who I recently appointed as regional board chair. Steve brings extensive leadership experience and business acumen as former CEO and executive chairman of Meredith Corporation. He has been a champion of Catholic education in Des Moines and has served in key leadership roles on the Dowling Catholic foundation board and other diocesan and nonprofit initiatives.

In his current role at Dowling Catholic, among his many accomplishments, Dr. Ryan has advanced the mission of Catholic education with a view toward present and future contexts. I have witnessed first-hand his effective leadership in the regionalization process and his work with pastors and principals over the last 18 months.

Collaboration has been a hallmark of Dr. Ryan's tenure. I am immensely grateful for his engagement with diocesan and community leaders on the Ignite campaign that will fund a new diocesan tuition assistance endowment. He has also focused on helping students and families across the state through his work with business leaders to enhance lowa's tax credit program. In the course of leading the strategic planning process at Dowling Catholic in concert with Superintendent Donna Bishop, he has attended to the shared mission and vitality of all Catholic schools.

As president of the region, Dr. Ryan will focus on building upon the current strengths of schools and providing school leaders with the resources and tools they need to be successful. One of his first priorities will be streamlining business operations so that schools may leverage collective resources and implement best business practices. Additional goals include increasing revenue for teacher compensation and opening the doors to more families through increased tuition assistance.

I look forward to seeing the fruits of this new collaboration across these 12 diocesan schools. We should all be grateful to Dr. Ryan for his willingness to accept this position, and for his personal integrity of faith and professionalism, his comprehensive vision and commitment to Catholic education.

NOTES ON THE MASS MAR 13 2022

AN OFFER YOU CAN REFUSE

Such a great offer, God's covenant with human beings. It will fit into just eleven words: *I will be your God and you will be my people*. In return for God's great love would we promise to love God above all things.

Our first parents had this relationship with God in the Garden of Eden. However, God watched with anguish as their free will, the gift he had given them, suddenly rejected his love.

God toiled to re-establish the covenant throughout history, as our First Reading shows. Fortunately, after many refusals on our part, God singled out a paltry old nomadic man named Abram and made to him what seems like an impossible promise: Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can., and Abram put his faith in the Lord. God credited it to him as an act of righteousness.

God was crediting Abram with having fulfilled the covenant! This meant

- receiving the offered love ("I will be your God")
- putting his faith in the Lord ("you will be my people").

In Sunday's story, an ancient sacrificial cult was about to take place. As the sun was about to set, Abram fell into a trance, and a deep terrifying darkness enveloped him. Fire appeared among the animals that he had slain. God spoke, promising a homeland, the "promised land," to Abram and his descendants.

This symbolized God's half of the covenant.

The other half was up to Abram and his wife Sara. It was more complicated. Finally, in their extreme old age Abraham and Sara did have a son, and the son's descendants kept the covenant—at times—but often did not. As time went by the covenant was ignored and forgotten.

Much later, when the time was right, God thought up a brilliant solution, so to speak. Instead of speaking from on high or through representatives, God himself would take shape on earth as one of the people. The second person of the trinity would become the Messiah, the Christ.

This Christ was to be the very love God had offered for so many centuries. And get this: he was also, at the same time, the people's loving response, since he was completely a human being! Think of it: as the God-man, Jesus was able to fulfill both halves of the covenant.

The transfiguration in Sunday's Gospel represents both the promise and its fulfillment! Jesus' clothes become dazzling as fire—a counterpart to the fire in the First Reading! A terrifying darkness closes in, just as it had with Abram. And within that darkness, God's voice repeats the covenant words: *This is my chosen Son; listen to him.*

In the cross and resurrection, the covenant would finally be fulfilled—on both sides, the Godly and the human. The result: you and I do not have to offer more and more sacrifices in order to achieve this fulfillment. We only have to let ourselves be joined to Jesus in his loving response to the Father.

How do we do this?

We begin it in Baptism. We continue it in each Mass, each communion we receive. We say "amen" to the covenant, so many times broken, but now established forever as the "new and everlasting covenant" of love, the cross and resurrection, received in the Eucharist.

Welcome to Lent!

READING II Philippians 3:17-4:1


GOSPEL Luke 9:28b-36

QUESTION FOR THE CHILDREN Jesus invites you to be close to him, to see him with clear eyes. What is Jesus like as a friend?

QUESTION FOR THE YOUTH What do you most want God to help you with?

QUESTION FOR THE ADULTS Sometimes we can see Christ with clear eyes, as the disciples did on that mountain. Share about such a time in your own life.

ACTIVITY OF THE WEEK Ask each family member to name one thing that he or she would like God's help with now. Allow time for each person to complete the sentence, "Ten years from now I would like to be..." Ask each person to name one thing he or she is doing now that will help to make that dream come true.



SAINT OF THE WEEK Peter, Apostle, Pope And Martyr

Even the great saints need God's forgiveness and grace. Peter, like the rest of us, turned away from Jesus for a time. He was a son of John and the brother of Andrew, but as a leading disciple of Christ, he famously denied even knowing him! Nonetheless, Christ built his Church on Peter, as his rock. And after the Resurrection, in a wonderful scene on the beach, Jesus invited Peter to reconciliation and forgiveness, and asked him to "feed my sheep." This feast is called the Chair of Saint Peter and commemorates Christ handing over the leadership of the Church to Saint Peter and his successors. We celebrate the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29.

PETER'S MESSAGE TODAY Peter provides a good example of Jesus' love for us. Peter denied Jesus three times, yet Jesus still loved Peter and did not withhold the position he had promised. Likewise, Jesus loves us and forgives us our sins when ask his forgiveness.

Have you asked for Jesus' forgiveness? If you will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil, have you begun to prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation?
