A collaborative planning initiative to support Catholic schools in the Des Moines region.

I am writing to provide an update on the progress made over the last month in forming the region. I am grateful for the collaboration of the many groups and individuals involved in this important initiative.

The pastors have reviewed the final draft of the bylaws which will be filed this month to establish the region as a legal and canonical entity. They will continue to meet monthly to help shape the region.

As Bishop Joensen recently announced, Steve Lacy has been named regional board chair. As former CEO and executive chairman of Meredith Corporation, Steve brings extensive business and leadership experience to the position. He has been an advocate for Catholic education for many years and has served in key leadership roles on the Dowling Catholic foundation board and other diocesan and nonprofit initiatives. Prospective members have been identified and I look forward to providing an update when these positions are finalized.

I have continued to meet with local board chairs, principals and leaders of the parent volunteer organizations as we establish a plan for how these groups will work together. These meetings have also addressed the importance of preserving the local identity of each school and strengthening the connection with the parish.

It has been established that community events such as the annual gala and other traditions will continue as they have in the past, and that fundraising dollars will stay at each individual school. Each school will also maintain their individual uniforms, faith activities, athletic teams and other aspects that make them unique.


Business managers continue to meet to share information regarding how each school currently operates and to discuss how they will collaborate in the regional model. Budgets and school operations will remain the same for the 2022-23 school year. A pilot school will implement a new business operations model in July 2022 with plans for the participating school to be announced early summer. Additional schools may also be engaged during the pilot period. All schools will be trained on a universal budget process in the fall of 2022 to begin in July of 2023.

Lastly, I would like to thank the principals for the opportunity to meet with the faculty and staff at each of the parochial schools. I have enjoyed the visits and appreciate hearing feedback from our teachers.

HOW ARE PARISH GOALS DETERMINED? A Clergy Committee comprised of 13 pastors from parishes throughout the Diocese was engaged to determine parish goals, which are based on 1.28 times the average annual offertory over the three previous years. A parish goal is not a mandate. Parishes will not be billed for the difference if they do not achieve their goal provided they put forth a good faith effort to reach the campaign goal.

# NOTES ON THE MASS APRIL 10 2022

## The Passion of Jesus

The Gospels portray Jesus as a very typical Mediterranean male. He is an obedient youngster. After returning from the pilgrimage to Jerusalem, “he went down with [his parents] and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them” (Lk 2:51).

As an adult, Jesus is obedient to his heavenly Father. “Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done” (Lk 22:42). (Recall that Luke omits this line from the Lord’s Prayer in Lk 11:2-4 and places it here for greater effect.)

Jesus imitated biblical heroes in his life. Luke and the other evangelists show this by drawing on Second Isaiah and on Psalms 22 and Psalm 69 in writing about Jesus.

Luke’s observation that “they cast lots to divide his clothing” is certainly borrowed from Psalm 22:18. The taunt of the leaders, “He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one” (Lk 23:35) echoes Psalm 22:8.

Jesus ranks among the finest biblical heroes who suffered in silence. The passion stories certainly make this point emphatically.

The homilist who wrote the Epistle to the Hebrews interpreted Jesus’ passion this way: “Because he was a son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him ... ” (Heb 5:8-10).

What does this mean for Christian believers who suffer?

The homilist explains: “Endure trials for the sake of discipline. God is treating you as sons; for what son is there whom his father does not discipline? ... We have had earthly fathers to discipline us, and we respected them. Should we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? God disciplines us for our good ... ” (read the entire passage, Heb 12:3-11).

There are at least two cultural challenges in today’s Scripture reading and the mystery Christians celebrate. One is to read an accurate translation of the ancient texts.

Inclusive language translations that omit “son” in the Hebrews passages as offensive to modern women and replace it with the plural “children” misrepresent Mediterranean culture and the Bible, which neither states nor implies that girls should be physically punished, and they unwittingly give permission to contemporaries who use the Bible as warrant for behavior to physically punish girls as well as boys.

The second challenge is how to translate a value or behavior from one culture in which it is acceptable and normal to another culture in which the same value or behavior is considered an abuse. Experts in human violence observe that every form of known family violence is acceptable in some cultures but considered abuse in others.

In this passion story Luke definitely proposes Jesus as a model to follow and imitate. This challenges modern believers to reconsider the biblical image and their image of God, God’s will, suffering, suffering innocently, response to suffering, and related ideas.

It still remains for all of us to devise appropriate ways to follow and imitate the Mediterranean Jesus, ones that are in harmony with values Western culture considers humane.

Cyril was a great teacher of the early Church. Because of Cyril's teaching skills, the bishop of Jerusalem asked him to prepare catechumens for Baptism. Cyril explained the beliefs of the Church to the catechumens. His lectures on the creed and the sacraments are the best records of the kind of instruction that catechumens were given in the early Church. Even after Cyril himself became the bishop of Jerusalem, he continued to give these lectures because he considered the work so important.

**CYRIL'S MESSAGE TODAY** Cyril took a strong stand for what he believed in. At the cost of placing ourselves in the middle of controversy, we too must sometimes stand up for what we believe.
