# \$1,500 TUITION GRANT!

#### NOTES ON THE MASS MAY 2 2021

#### SPIRITUALITY OF THE READING

#### **Cutting Back**

The <u>Gospel</u> for this coming Sunday of Easter has the familiar story about the vine and the branches. Jesus, vine, is rooted and stable and will always bring us all the nourishment we need.

Maybe you would like to stop there and contemplate such a rich image. Do so if you would like.

Because just beyond it there is the small matter of being pruned. To prune a plant is to cut parts of it off. Jesus mentions it twice in our reading: Speaking as the vine, he says that the Father takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes, so that it bears more fruit.

Ouch.

If we bring forth no fruit, we "will be thrown out like a branch and wither." If we bear some, we have to be pruned. We lose either way!

And it seems to be our fault:

If only I were a better person, if only I had done the right thing, if only the world were different, if only I had been dealt a better hand in the game of life, or, or, or. If I weren't so full of guilt I wouldn't have to be pruned. It is all my fault!

But guilt is a major feature of human life. "Everything goes wrong," it says. To tell the truth, many people take the crucifixion as a direct result of their own sins. "I caused this. My sins killed Jesus." This is not completely false, but it is out of control. How could your small sins take down the Lord of the universe? So could there be a better way to deal with guilt? Yes.

First, decide whether you are bearing no fruit at all. None. If that is really and actually true, then get help from someone, because spiritually you are dying. Most of us do bear good fruit—it is just that we don't remember that we do.

Second, with that settled, look at what pruning is. It is a way to make things better, make a better plant, a better tree, a better orchard. If you cut tired old branches from your Philodendron, for instance, it will begin to thrive again, not wither. Pruning encourages new growth and the overall health of the plant or tree.

Third, seen in that way, you and I do need to be trimmed regularly, don't we? Here is an example. Maybe unconsciously we have been thinking that we ourselves are the vine, independent of Christ, not just a branch. The reason pruning would help is not that we should be punished, but that it promotes health of the whole person, the whole garden, the whole orchard—the mystical body of Christ.

**Trust the steadiness of Jesus' gardener hand.** Trust even while suffering. Drink in your overflowing share of trust at Sunday's table of the Lord. Let the Word instruct you, let the body and blood of Christ, which was pruned to almost nothing, fill you and shape you.

Then you can say to the Lord with the rest of us, go ahead, trim whatever gets in the way! I am not the vine, I am a branch. My job is not to be perfect, it is to remain in you, Christ, and to let you do good within me and through me and us.

Question for Children: How do you keep yourself


connected to Jesus in your daily life?

Question for Adults: How does your own connection to Christ, the vine, affect your daily life? What image from this reading helps you see the importance of this connection to Christ?

Here is a family activity to further reflect on the Sunday readings:

 Go on a nature walk with your family and collect tree branches. When you get home, attach string to the branches and create a mobile. Remind each family member how Jesus is the vine, the support in each person's life, and how we serve as branches to spread his word to all.



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### St. Pancras, Martyr, d. c. 304

A young saint about who little is known is Pancras. He is thought to have been born in Phrygia around the year 290. He was brought to Rome by his uncle, Saint Dionysius, in the early Fourth Century where both were converted to Christianity. This was the period when the persecution by the emperor Diocletian was beginning. Though the circumstances are not known, it is believed that Pancras and his uncle were called upon to worship pagan gods and refused. Pancras, at the age of fourteen, was then beheaded. His uncle died later in prison.Pancras was buried in a cemetery in Rome, which later was named after him. In the Seventh Century, Pope Vitalian sent relics of St. Pancras to England as the evangelization of that land was getting underway. St. Augustine of Canterbury later dedicated the first church built in England to the saint. Today, many churches and public places in England, including a borough and a railroad station, are named after this saint. St. Pancras is a patron of children. He is also patron against false witness and perjury.

**Pancras' message today:** At any age, it is never easy to stand up for one's beliefs in the face of persecution, be it threat of death or just ridicule. This young saint had the courage to accept death rather than turn against his beliefs. *Pray that God will give you the moral fiber to answer scorn with strength if you are faced with abuse.*
