FROM FATHER MARK JUNE 5 & 12 2022

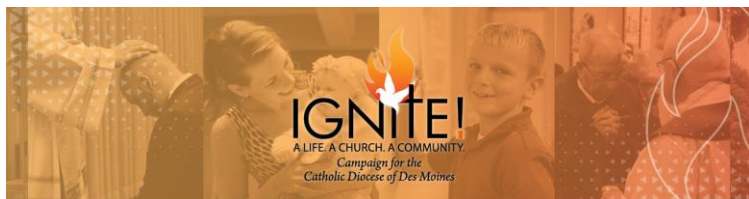

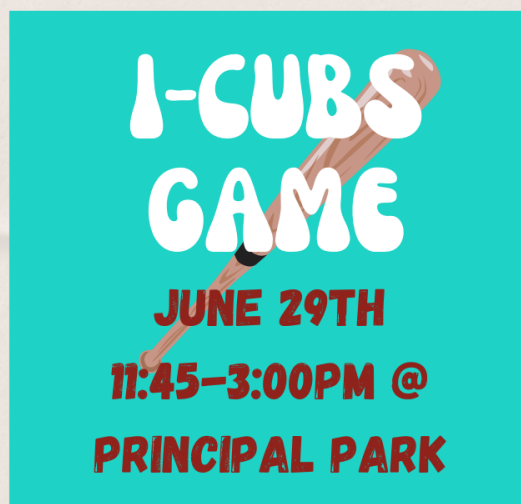

NOTES ON THE MASS JUNE 5 2022

The Holy Spirit

Sunday is the feast, at last, of the Holy Spirit. What is this famous presence we have heard Jesus promise for weeks? May I give you some “points,” just as a retreat director would do during a retreat?

Ask to be introduced to the Holy Spirit when you pray. Use as much as you want from the following for prayer and disregard the rest.

Preliminaries:

Remember that you will be praying *in the presence of God*, the one who watches over you and loves you by name. Sit quietly, with as much patience as you can.

“What does the Holy Spirit mean to me?”

To some people the Holy Spirit is the one who causes them to be “slain in the Spirit.” Others know it as some being connected with the Trinity. What do you believe? Many folks have no idea.

Point One:

In the Gospel, Jesus says that the Father is going to send “the Advocate, the Holy Spirit” in his name, to us. The English word *advocate* is derived from the Latin (which has *ad* plus *voco*, and meaning “to speak for”). So, the Holy Spirit *speaks for us*, on our behalf.

We have many translations of the Greek word. It is also rendered as “Paraclete,” “intercessor,” “teacher,” “helper,” and “comforter.” All these English words refer to someone who is called upon to aid another person and to defend them!

The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. (Romans 8:26).

Ponder the Holy Spirit of God praying within you.

Point Two:

Imagine being part of the story in the First Reading. You are gathered with the disciples in a house. Suddenly a huge noise, which is “like a strong driving wind,” drowns everything out. Something resembling a flame appears and hovers in the air. It splits into many flame-like presences, which hover over each person in the room.

They have at least 15 different languages among them. But they all understand. Picture yourself preaching or listening.

—p r a y q u e t l y—

Point Three:

Ponder the immensely comforting statement by Jesus in the Gospel:

Whoever loves me will keep my word,
and my Father will love him,
and we will come to him
and make our dwelling with him.

Take time with each line. (Remember that “keeping Jesus’ word” means loving one another, not just keeping the law.) Consider the Father’s love for all of you. Let down your guard for a moment or two in order to make a home for Jesus and his Father. Let the Holy Spirit pray inside you.

Go as long as you want. Then call out to God and say where your heart is. Maybe God will give you a sense of the Holy Spirit in your personal daily life, in your progress from day to day!

NOTES ON THE MASS JUNE 12 2022

Closing the Circle

"Why do we have to hear all this stuff about the Trinity?"

This question burst forth from a gentleman in the third row as I was giving a marvelous and subtle explanation of that topic.

"Why can't we just go to church and be good to each other?"

Would he allow me to explain, I asked.

The Triune God is not some kind of brainy speculation by scholars. It is the way we experience God in this world. To do what you said, "go to church and be good to each other," is the Trinity in action!

Would you allow me to explain?

First, long ago, human beings learned that there is only one God, and that he "found delight in the human race." Think of the many, many stories in the First Testament about God's pursuit of us, his laboring to make a loving and holy covenant with us: "I will be your God and you will be my people." Like a marriage agreement.

Well, as in a marriage arrangement, God became by turns angry, hurt, delighted, spurned, glorified, ignored, praised and rejected. Yet God kept coming back and back to renew the covenant. God's love remained steadfast, even if ours sometimes does not.

Then we found out that God's nature had always consisted of another component!

His very nature had always been to relate to others, to "pour himself forth," as the First Reading puts it, and to receive back. The "Second Person" had been at one with the "First Person" for all eternity.

So, this Second Person was made flesh, called by us the Word. We saw him. Jesus laughed and cried and preached and turned over tables and cured people, and was loyal to his friends even unto the end. "He said, 'everything the Father has is mine' (Gospel). That's how we knew he was The Word and the Word was God. Somehow, two persons in one God.

Then came a third revelation about the Trinity. Jesus hints about it in the Gospel: "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now." In other words, our small souls would burst with the greatness of God—unless God gentled himself down and would begin to actually dwell within us, guiding our understanding.

So Jesus promised to pour out the Holy Spirit into us. He tells us that the Spirit is God. "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he [God the Spirit] will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

Do you get the logic? Everything the Father has belongs to the Word. Everything that Jesus the Word has belongs to the Spirit. The Spirit is the third part of God, so to speak, and it bestows us and the whole earth back upon the Father, thus closing the circle.

What aliveness, what movement there is in God: speaking, reaching out, flowing forth, receiving back. God is liquid motion, a dynamism in which everything is changing always, yet always remaining the same because it is love. We are invited into that circle of love. Even in today's difficult world.

And that is why we hear "all this stuff about the trinity"!

Saint Of The Week Mary Magdalen de Pazzi, Virgin

From an early age Caterina loved prayer and practiced penance. She also performed works of charity for the poor. She developed a love for the Blessed Sacrament. She received her First Communion at the age of ten and was sent to a convent at the age of fourteen and entered the Carmelite convent of Santa Maria degli Angeli in 1582. She took the name Maria Maddalena (Mary Magdalene). She became quite ill, took final vows, experienced forty consecutive days of ecstasies, then a miraculous cure. She carried on with her duties, but suffered from terrible depression. She proposed a renovation of the Church by way of letters to the pope, cardinals, and bishops. She died of consumption after suffering physical and spiritual pain.

Mary Magdalen de Pazzi's Message Today God will give us the strength that we need to overcome any trials that come to us. We just need to ask for his grace.

BRING THE GOSPEL HOME JUNE 12 2022

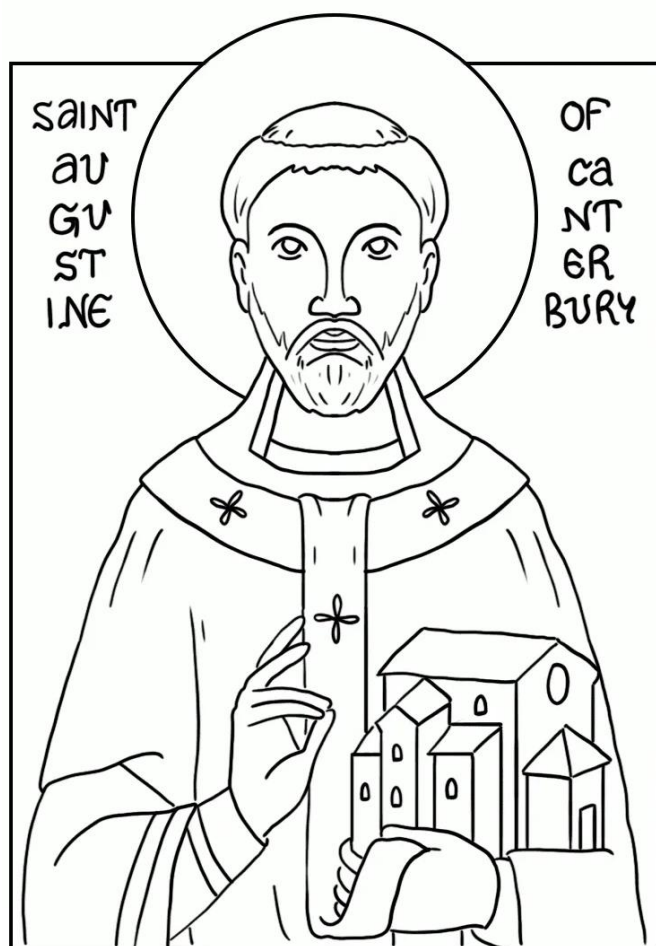
Reading I Proverbs 8: 22-31 | **Psalm** 8: 4-9 | **Reading II** Romans 5: 1-5 | **Gospel** John 16: 12-15

Question For The Children God fills us with love. How, this week, will you show your family - your mom, dad, brothers, sisters, grandparents, cousins - that you love them as God loves them?

Question For The Youth When Jesus left the world, He sent the Holy Spirit to be with us. Have you ever given something important to someone else as a sign of your love for them? Have you ever experienced the Holy Spirit as a similar gift to you?

Question For The Adults Today we celebrate the relationship of love among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In what similar community of love do you live?

Activity Of The Week As a family, take time to play a game that all enjoy. Talk about what you like about playing together. How does playing together help to bring the family closer?



Saint Of The Week Augustine of Canterbury, Bishop

Saint Gregory the Great, pope during Augustine's adult life, wanted to evangelize Anglo-Saxon England. He selected thirty monks, and their prior, Augustine. This group set out for England in 596. King Ethelbert was baptized the following year as well as many of his followers, though he did not force anyone to become Christian. Pope Gregory outlined for Augustine the steps that he should take to establish the Church of England. He was to substitute feast days of saints for heathen festivals. Pagan temples were to be purified and consecrated as Christian churches. Augustine continued to spread the faith and establish churches. He died seven years after arriving in England.

Augustine of Canterbury's Message Today Like many of us, Augustine had some doubts before he set off on his mission, but, with God's reassurance through the pope, he proceeded on to great successes.
