

FROM FATHER MARK JUL 18/25 2021

GREETINGS

As you know Sandy Stacy, our Pastoral Care Minster, will be retiring at the end of July. We completed our interviews for this position the first week of July and the position has been offered to and accepted by Dan Maxcy. Dan is currently in our permanent Deacon program for the Diocese and if all goes according to plan will be ordained next year. Dan is a member of St. Mary of Nazareth Parish. I am confident that Dan's background and personal skills make him a good fit for the position. We welcome Dan to Holy Trinity!

I also want to take this opportunity to personally thank Sandy for her work these past years. She has made my job as pastor easier and has been such an asset to the pastoral care team here at Holy Trinity. Thanks Sandy...enjoy retirement! You will be missed.

Further, Jim Wilwerding has decided to step away from his position as our RCIA director in order to spend more time with family. We thank Jim for his 11 years of service and we are very thankful for the many people he has helped to welcome into our Church and our Parish! Deacon Doug and Kim Renze of our Parish have graciously agreed to step into this role. Doug and Kim are currently part of our RCIA core team and I know they will do an excellent job. Thank you for saying "yes" Deacon Doug and Kim!

Some additional updates and information to share. We are currently considering replacing our Stations of the Cross. Our current set was purchased by Msgr. Stessman. While they are a nice set, they are pretty small and difficult to see from any distance. We are looking at a set of larger stations that would allow us to have a "way of the Cross" around our church. That is, the stations would likely be placed on the north and south walls. We will be placing a poster with a representation of the set that is being proposed and would appreciate the input of parishioners. Thanks.

We are also currently planning to install fire and smoke monitoring in our church. At present there are only alarms that must be pulled. These alarms do not place any calls and require that someone be present in the church to pull them. We are looking at a system similar to that in our school that monitors for smoke, heat, and fire and automatically calls our security company when an alarm is activated. As this is for our parish church and place of worship, we do want to provide this basic safety and security measure.

Finally, I am not sure I ever told the parish where our new bell system came from. The Van Orsdel family donated in honor of deceased members of the family. The previous system had been donated by the Freuh family of our parish. These have been a gift not only to our parish but to the entire Beaverdale neighborhood.

By way of an update, we continue to see more parishioners gradually return to in person worship as we slowly return to normal. We are continuing to livestream our weekday Masses as well as Saturday afternoon and the 8:30 Sunday morning Mass. A reminder: The dispensation from the Sunday and Holy Day Mass obligation for Catholics will be lifted as of the weekend of July 24/25. We look forward to continuing to welcome our parishioners back. 

Families who transfer their children to Holy Trinity Catholic School may be eligible for a tuition grant if you enroll between now and June 30, 2021. Tuition grants are available for each child in grades 1-7 for the first two years of enrollment.

YEAR ONE: \$1000 credit on full tuition for each eligible student

YEAR TWO: \$500 credit on full tuition for each eligible student

SEEKING EARLY EDUCATION ASSOCIATES

Holy Trinity Catholic School is currently seeking three fulltime associates for the 2021-2022 school year. This position reports Monday through Friday, 7:50 am - 3:20 pm assisting a lead teacher. Paraeducator certification preferred but not required.

Holy Trinity is a Preschool through 8th-grade building of around 400 students located in the Beaverdale neighborhood of Des Moines, Iowa. Here are some ways to help offset the cost of tuition:

- 1. Apply for CTO The Diocese of Des Moines established this in 2006 to provide tuition assistance to eligible families whose children attend one of the sixteen Catholic schools in the Diocese. The criteria for receiving assistance is based on family size and income. They award 10-50% to students TK-8th. Their second round of funding will close July 31. To apply for tuition assistance, please go to www.fairapp.com. There is a \$27 fee per family for processing the application and you need to have your 2020 taxes completed. Families will be notified of their tuition assistance awards near the end of August. Our school code is 450 and our password is cto450. Find out more about qualifying at tctodmdiocese.org
- **2. Donate to CTO** and get a tax credit (which is more valued than a tax deduction) again which could result in a greater refund from the IRS.
- 3. Tap into The Welcome Tuition Grant for new families transferring in from public school in grades 1-7. We provide \$1000 the first year and \$500 the second year toward tuition for each student that qualifies. This grant cannot be combined with CTO funds.
- **4. Get Your Own Referral Grant** -- Existing families who refer a family that enrolls get \$500 per family. So refer a friend and earn some savings on your own tuition!
- **5. Join the Parish**-- Active parish members pay a much lower annual tuition rate than out-of-parish.
- **6. Become Catholic** -- if you go through our RCIA program and complete it, you will qualify for the in-parish tuition rate. Contact the parish office at 515 255 3162 ext 128
- 7. Use 529 Savings plans--you can now use your College Savings plan toward elementary, middle and high school education. While this does not change the cost of tuition, it does provide a tax break that may result in a greater refund from the IRS. Plus there is no time limit to how long the funds must stay in the 529 so you can put the money in, take it out to pay and earn a tax deduction just for doing so.
- **8. Monthly Child Tax Credit Payments** -- this will start July 15 and offer many families \$200-\$300 each month in extra funds for their children. NOTES ON THE MASS JUL 18/25 2021

SPIRITUALITY OF THE READING

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Jeremias 23:1-6

The first reading is suggested by the observation in today's gospel that Jesus had compassion on the multitude "because they were like sheep without a shepherd." Although we should not sentimentalize the idea of shepherding (as talk of the "gentle Shepherd" might tempt us to do, although the Hebrew word for "shepherd" also means "to rule"), it is still true that the image of shepherd contains within it the notion of feeding and providing for the flock—in fact, much of what we associate with pastoral care. Jeremiah, writing toward the end of the reign of Zedekiah just before the final captivity in 587, looks back over recent reigns and condemns the last kings of Judah as shepherds who have misgoverned their flock. The denunciation concludes with the promise of a "righteous Branch". This scion of the house of David will be the Messiah, the ideal king. Jeremiah, of course, was thinking purely in historical terms—of the restoration of the Davidic monarchy after a period of exile. But his words kindled a hope in Israel which, in the perspective of Christian faith, finds its ultimate fulfillment in Jesus the Christ.

Reading II: Ephesians 2:13-18

This passage is the theological core of the letter to the Ephesians. Jew and Gentile have been brought together into a single community, the body of Christ. Christ on the cross (that is, by his death as the event of salvation) has fulfilled and abolished the law, not as moral demand, but as the way of salvation. Christians now keep the law *because* they have been saved by grace, not *in order* to earn salvation. Now both Jew and Gentile have access in one body to the Father. "Access" is a liturgical term denoting the approach to God in worship. Note the Trinitarian character of the final sentence: through Christ in one Spirit to the Father. Note, too, that Ephesians 2:13 alludes to Isaiah 57:19, while Verse 17 cites and provides its Christian application.

Gospel: Mark 6:30-34

This excerpt is highly composite. Mark 6:30-33 form a link between the mission of the disciples and the feeding of the multitude. They bear clear signs of Mark's editorial work.

Mark 6:30 points back to the mission of the Twelve (here only in Mark are the Twelve called "apostles," a term that was not originally a title but functional). Mark 6:31, often used in connection with retreats, points forward to the feeding. Mark 6:32 introduces a favorite theme of Mark's—teaching given in secrecy to the Twelve, though the fulfillment of this intention is delayed until Mark 8 (on the way to Caesarea Philippi).

Mark 6:34 is the beginning of a new pericope, the feeding of the multitude (cf. the variant in Mk 8:2). The reference to the shepherd motif is probably pre-Marcan and gives a special emphasis to the miraculous feeding. But the note about teaching looks redactional; Mark frequently emphasizes Jesus' teaching activity without giving the content of his teaching.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Focusing the Gospel

Key words and phrases: large crowd was coming to him, Where can we buy enough food, test him, he himself knew what he was going to do, had their fill.

To the point: What answer did Philip need to give Jesus to pass the test? When Jesus asks about where to buy food to satisfy the hunger of the large crowd, he is not thinking about a store and purchases. He is really asking a question about who he is. Jesus knows full well that the "where" of the food will be himself. The superabundance of food Jesus provides from so little is a sign of the fullness of Life—his very self—Jesus gives. So, Philip's answer? "Give them yourself."

Connecting the Gospel

... to the First Reading: Elisha begins with more barley loaves (twenty) and satisfies the hunger of a smaller crowd (one hundred people) with "some left over." Jesus begins with only a few barley loaves (five) and satisfies the hunger of a much larger crowd (five thousand) with "twelve wicker baskets left over." ... to experience: We Americans enter supermarkets and are faced with a superabundance of food that we take for granted. This gospel reminds us that it is not Quantity that satisfies but who gives us the food.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Ignatius Loyola, Priest Ignatius was the youngest of thirteen children of a noble family in the Basque region of Spain. He entered the military and had a promising career ahead of him until he was wounded during the siege of Pamplona in 1521. During his recovery, Ignatius spent the time reading religious books. These readings included a life of Christ and the lives of saints, both of which had a profound effect on him. After, he made a pilgrimage to Monserrat where he hung up his sword at Our Lord's altar. He then spent a year in retreat at Manresa where he experienced visions and began writing his Spiritual Exercises. All of this eventually led him to be the founder of the Jesuits, and a great leader at a troubled time of church history.

Ignatius' message today: The Jesuits today run many high schools and universities, which are known for high standards of education. While teaching the broadest range of subject matter, these institutions focus much time and energy in teaching about the Church.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

James the Greater, Apostle This James is called "the Greater" because his vocation to serve Jesus preceded that of the other apostle with the same name. James the Greater was the brother of John and the son of Zebedee. One tradition, derived from the information in several of the Gospels, tells us that James and John were first cousins of Jesus. With his brother, James was a fisherman working in his father's business until called by Jesus. Neither James nor John fully understood at first what they were being called to do. And yet, they responded to Christ with faith. Toward his death, James forgave his accusers by offering them a gesture of peace and goodwill.

James' message today: "Peace be with you, brother." What a wonderful offering by James to one who has falsely testified against him. The man who testified against James knew that he was giving false testimony, yet, when he realized his error, James forgave him.

If James can forgive one who has falsely accused him, think how much greater is God's forgiveness. Have you asked God's forgiveness for your sins?


