#### Notes on the Mass | January 28th, 2024

## Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

**Ordinary Time:** For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding

Reading I: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

I will put my words into your mouth.

- In the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses conveys God's word to the people.
- The promise of God delivered by Moses is that God will raise up another prophet.
- The true prophet will deliver God's word.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

I want you to be free of all worries.

- Some of the early Christian communities found Paul to be a true prophet.
- The Christians at Corinth apparently wrote to Paul, asking him a series of practical questions about how to live the Christian life.
- The First Letter to the Corinthians is Paul's answer to their questions.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

He has authority over all creation.

- The Gospels reveal Jesus to be the true prophet, the one who not only brings the word of God but who is the Word of God.
- In the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark, there are several stories illustrating Jesus' authority.
- Today's passage tells of Jesus casting out a demon. The people are amazed because the demon obeys Jesus.



#### Bring Home the Gospel | January 28th, 2024

Reading I Deuteronomy 18:15-20 | Psalm 95: 1-2,6-7,7-9 | Reading II 1 Cor 7: 32-35 | Gospel Mk1:21-28

Question For The Children Name some bad things that you want to pray that Jesus will take away from our world.

**Question For The Youth** Jesus was able to free the man from the unclean spirit within him. What do you hope Jesus will free you from? What is happening in the world that need Jesus' help?

Question For The Adults What are the evils in today's world that you pray God will free us from?

**Activity Of The Week** As a family make a list of people who need Jesus' help. As a family, pray for these people who are in need through the power of Jesus' name and word. List ways your family can take action and bring the healing power of Jesus to others.

Saint Of The Week -Agatha, Virgin and Martyr, Third Century



Agatha is another of the early saints about whom most our knowledge is based on legend. She was born in Sicily, either Catania or Palermo, both of which claim her as a patron, and was martyred in Catania, most likely during the persecution of the Roman emperor Decius around the middle of the third century.

Agatha dedicated herself to God and a life of chastity. When she refused the advances of a Roman consul, he denounced her as a Christian and subjected her to torture and indignities to change her mind. But Agatha's continued dedication to God and her calm acceptance of torture only infuriated her captors. They cut off her breasts and rolled her over red-hot coals until she died.

Early Christian art depicted Agatha holding a tray with her breasts on it. In the middle ages, the breasts were mistaken as two loaves of bread. This led to the custom of blessing bread on St. Agatha's feast day and bringing the bread to the altar on a tray.

Sometime after her death, an eruption of Mt. Etna was stilled after the people prayed to St. Agatha for intercession. As a result, people have continued to ask St. Agatha to protect them from fire. She is also a patron of nurses, and she could well be an appropriate patron for a woman undergoing a mastectomy.
