

Dear Families,

I hope the school year is off to a great start. Though we are now just a few weeks into a new school year, I am writing with an important update regarding the enrollment process for the 2024-25 school year.

As you may be aware, in January of 2022 the twelve Catholic schools in Des Moines formed a new entity - Des Moines Regional Catholic Schools. The regional model allows us to centralize business functions, leverage collective resources and implement best business practices which will sustain the future of our schools. Some of the changes you will notice this year include a revised enrollment process which gives current families priority.

Enrollment for the 2024-25 school year will open October 2, 2023, for current families. The process must be completed by November 15, 2023, to receive priority. As a current family, you will receive priority admission for your student(s) now attending Holy Trinity as well as any children who will be enrolling for the first time in Early Childhood through 8th grade. Please note that enrollment for your new student will be determined by availability and our admission consideration process. After November 15, we will open enrollment to families in our parish. From there, we will open enrollment to new families in the broader community.

The enrollment fee will be \$100 per student and will be paid through a new system - Blackbaud Tuition Management. Blackbaud will replace FACTS for all fees and tuition management services beginning with the 2024-25 school year.

We are in the midst of the budget process to determine the tuition for the 2024-25 school year which will be shared no later than February. Affordability remains a top priority as the region works to increase teacher compensation to match public school pay within five years. Increases in tuition assistance through Catholic Tuition Organization (CTO), Diocesan Tuition Assistance (DTA) and other sources will help offset any tuition increases for families with demonstrated need. Many will also benefit now from Education Savings Accounts (ESAs) and all families will qualify for the 2025-26 school year. We can assure you that the financial impact for all families will be taken into account when establishing tuition. Please do not let cost deter you from registering your child at this time. We encourage all families to take advantage of these resources which will help fund a Catholic education for your child for years to come. To determine when your family will qualify for an ESA, please visit https://educateiowa.gov/pk-12/students-first-education-savings-accounts.

A communication will follow on October 2, 2023, which will provide instructions on steps for priority enrollment. We recognize that the revised enrollment process is taking place earlier than what you are accustomed to. We appreciate your assistance as we implement this new process. Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time | For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Ezekiel 18:25-28 | Turn from what is sinful to what is just and right.

- The belief that children are destined to bear the burden of their parent's sins was popular in Ezekiel's time.
- God's people felt that the exile was unfair, that God was punishing them for the sins of their ancestors.
- In today's passage, Ezekiel points out; however, that each of us suffers for our own sins.

Reading II : Philippians 2:1-11 | Make my joy complete.

- The Letter to the Philippians presents Christ as the perfect example of obedience.
- Christ, through obedience, has shown God-likeness so completely that the name of God can be given to him.
- The model, then, that Paul held up for Christian behavior was the model of the obedient Son.
- Note that in this year, this same reading was read on the Feast of the Holy Cross. You may wish to use the short form this Sunday.

Gospel : Matthew 21:28-32 | Many will enter the reign of God before you if you do not repent.

- In today's parable, Jesus compares two sons to two groups of people. The first group spoke piously but did nothing; the second group included sinners who eventually acted in faith and repentance.
- The sin of the virtuous might be their refusal to act, their refusal to believe.
- The repentance of the sinners revealed their belief and resulted in action.

Question For The Children | How do you show your love for Jesus by doing what he asks, even when it is difficult?

Question For The Youth | Today's parable reminds us that it isn't what we say that counts as much as what we do. How would someone know you are a Christian through your actions?

Question For The Adults | How and when were you like each of the sons in the Gospel?

Activity Of The Week | Discuss a problem that is not being addressed that needs an immediate solution. This can be something at home or in the community. Talk about possible solutions. Pick out one thing that you can do this week. Decide on a time when you will do it together.



Saint Of The Week - Cosmas and Damian | According to legend, Cosmas and Damian were twin brothers born in Arabia. They studied medicine in Syria and later became widely known for their medical skills which they offered, without charge, to all. Because of their charities, they were known in their time as the "moneyless ones." They gained the love and respect of the people to whom they ministered, both for their medical assistance and the zeal of their Christian faith. Like so many others, they were eventually arrested and put to death for their faith.

Cosmas and Damian's message today | The two brothers completely embraced and lived the Christian life. This was particularly exemplified by their unselfish behavior in caring for the sick. We are not asked to give nearly so much of ourselves as Cosmas and Damian did, but we are asked to give something. Think about volunteering some of your time to a local hospital or nursing home.
