Notes on the Mass | October 29, 2023

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time | For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Exodus 22:20-26 | Take care to be just, especially to widows and the poor.

Exodus 20-23 consists primarily of laws.

Today's passage reminds the Israelites to care for the poor and vulnerable in their midst.

Any mistreatment of the vulnerable people in the society would be interpreted as a direct affront to God.

Reading II: 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10 | Your faith is an example for others.

Paul's thanksgiving for the faith of the Thessalonians continues in today's passage.

The Thessalonians have endured with joy the suffering brought by faithfulness to God's Law.

As a result, they have become, in their turn, models of faith for the rest of the Near East.

Gospel : Matthew 22:34-40 | The great commandment.

The discussion of the Law in today's Gospel is one of the four conflict stories in this section of Matthew.

A scribe attempts to trap Jesus with the question: "What is the greatest commandment of the Law"?

Jesus answers by quoting two passages from the Hebrew Scriptures: the command to love God from Deuteronomy 6:5, and the command to love their neighbor from Leviticus 19:18.



Bring Home the Gospel | October 29, 2023

Reading I Exodus 22:20-26 | **Psalm** 18:2-4, 47, 51 | **Reading II** 1 Thessalonians 1:5c-10 | **Gospel** Matthew 22:34-40

Question For The Children We show our love for Jesus by loving our friends and family. Share one way that you show your love.

Question For The Youth Jesus tells us that we are to love others as we love ourselves. Do you love yourself? Can you see the good that God has put within you? Do you find it easier to love others or yourself?

Question For The Adults Repeat the two commandments which Jesus teaches today in your own words? For each of them, share how it has become part of your life.

Activity Of The Week Together with your family, draw a large heart on a blank sheet of white paper. Cut out the heart and write the passage from Matthew's Gospel 22:37-39 inside. Hang the heart in a special place to remind your family of Jesus' Great Commandment each day.



Saint Of The Week Jude, Apostle

Judas Thaddeus, called Jude to distinguish him from Judas Iscariot, is often regarded as the brother of the Apostle, Saint James the Less. Other than a mention in the listing of the Apostles in the Gospels, there is only one reference to Jude anywhere in the New Testament. At the Last Supper, Jesus tells the Apostles that he will reveal himself to them. Jude then asked him, "Master, what happened that you will reveal yourself to us and not to the world?" Jesus answered and said to him, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." (Jn 15:23).

Saint's message today:

In a vision to Saint Bridget of Sweden, Jesus noted that Jude would "show himself most willing to help." Many people who have called on Saint Jude, like Danny Thomas, have found work after extended unemployment. Others with terminal illnesses have recovered after turning to Saint Jude.

When you have reached the end of your rope and all seems lost, say a prayer to Saint Jude. He will help you.
