FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is an Education Savings Account?

An Education Savings Account (ESA) is a deposit of public funds into government-authorized savings accounts which eligible families may use to cover tuition, fees, and other qualified education expenses at accredited nonpublic schools in Iowa.

Am I eligible for tuition assistance if I receive an ESA?

Yes. You can receive an ESA in addition to other tuition assistance that may be available to your family. ESAs were not intended to replace School Tuition Organizations (STOs) and local tuition assistance programs.

Do ESAs take funding from public schools?

No. When students leave public schools using choice programs like ESAs, they free up money for the students who remain at the public school. Taking a student out of public school removes the cost of educating that student at that school. Most of these savings remain in local school budgets where they benefit other students; the rest of the savings go into state budgets. Additionally, for every student enrolled in an accredited nonpublic school, their public school district will receive \$1,178 of additional funding for the 2023-2024 school year – even if the student has never attended their local public school.

Do private schools accept students with diverse learning needs?

Accredited nonpublic schools are committed to working with all learners to the best of their ability, including children who may require additional support. Many schools work with parents and the local public school district of students with Individual Education Plans (IEPs) to provide the services identified to meet the academic and behavioral needs of the child. There may be some student needs that nonpublic schools are not able to accommodate, and these decisions are based on the best interests of the child. Contact your local nonpublic school for information regarding admission information and criteria.

How do I apply?

An application will be posted in May of 2024 to the Iowa Department of Education site (<u>https://bit.ly/3Yd4jJR</u>). Only one application is needed per household. Parents and guardians can add multiple students attending multiple schools from their households. The application process should take no more than 10-15 minutes, and results will be available immediately.

When is the application deadline?

Applications are due at the end of June 2024 for the 2024-2025 school year. Applications are valid for one year; a family must apply annually to remain eligible for the program.

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Wisdom 6:12-16 | Wisdom seeks those who seek her.

- In the Book of Wisdom, the author is associated with Solomon even though it was written after his death.
- Wisdom came to Solomon and he claimed that all the benefits he enjoyed came from her.
- Wisdom herself seeks those who wish to find her.

Reading II : 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 | The dead will participate in Jesus' return.

- The Thessalonians believed in the immediacy of Christ's return.
- They became concerned about members of their Christian community who had died.
- In today's passage, Paul assures the Thessalonians that the dead will participate in Christ's glorious return.

Gospel : Matthew 25:1-13 | Readiness is essential for the end time.

- Today's Gospel is part of the last long discourse in Matthew's Gospel.
- The subject of this discourse is the end time.
- The point in the story of the wise and foolish virgins is that readiness is essential.



Reading I Wisdom 6:12-16 | Psalm 63:2-8 | Reading II 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 | Gospel Matthew 25:1-13

Question For The Children If Jesus came to your house today, what would you do to get ready for him?

Question For The Youth Even though you are still young, what strategy do you have to make sure you are "ready" for the inevitable moment when you will die?

Question For The Adults How are you preparing to be ready for that moment that no one escapes, the moment when you come to the end of your life as you know it now?

Activity Of The Week Gather the family together for a family meeting. Focus on how your family can keep the door open for the coming of God into your household? Start by discussing ways that family members can be more patient with each other.



Saint Of The Week Margaret of Scotland

Margaret was born in Hungary, the daughter of royal parents. Margaret and her husband, King Malcolm, had six sons and two daughters. Contrary to the general practice of royalty in that time, Margaret took charge of raising and educating her children. King Malcolm was good-hearted, but rough and uncultured. Because of his love for Margaret, she was able to soften his temper and she became his advisor in state matters. It was said that the main goals of Malcolm and Margaret were to maintain justice, to establish religion, and to keep their subjects happy. Margaret encouraged arts and education in her adopted country and instigated religious reform. With her husband, she founded several churches. They cared for the poor and homeless, and allowed their faith to rule their lives.

Margaret's message today:

A heavy responsibility falls on those who have been given exalted positions. Margaret and her husband recognized the need to provide for those who were less fortunate than themselves. We too must do the same.
