



A note: as this is a bas relief sculpture, the flat stippled rectangular clay backdrop to the imagery will go away in the finished piece to keep the focus on the piece itself.

Notes on the Mass | November 26, 2023

Solemnity of Christ the King

Ordinary Time | For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 | I will tend my sheep.

- The shepherd image is a favorite in the Scriptures.
- In ancient times, the king was often called the shepherd of his people.
- In today's first reading, the prophet Ezekiel contrasts the wicked shepherds, who exploit the flock and neglect the weak, with God, who gives rest to the flock.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 | Christ has been raised from the dead.

- In Paul's description of the Resurrection, Christ was the King, the shepherd, who laid down his life for the flock.
- The Corinthians doubted the reality of the resurrection for humans.
- But, according to Paul, to deny the resurrection of believers was also to deny the Resurrection of Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46 | When did we see you hungry?

- Today's discourse on the end time in Matthew is a description of the final judgment under the figure of a king-shepherd who separates the good and bad animals in his flock. The bad are identified as goats and the good as sheep.
- The goats and sheep represent "all the nations," all peoples who had been called together for this judgment.
- The point of the image is that all people will be judged by God as to how well they
 care for the weak and disadvantaged. Caring for "the least" of our sisters and brothers
 seems to be our highest calling!



Bring Home the Gospel | November 26, 2023


Reading I Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 | **Psalm** 23:1-3, 5-6 | **Reading II** 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 | **Gospel** Matthew 25:31-46

Question For The Children Who are the people most in need of help who live around you, and how can you help them?

Question For The Youth What can you do (alone, with friends, or with your family) to help those who are without food, shelter, or have other needs? When have you seen Jesus in the poor?

Question For The Adults As you grapple with this very strong, direct and demanding Gospel passage, name the people for whom you have cared personally – or if there are none, those for whom you will offer care in the coming weeks.

Activity Of The Week Jesus calls us to be shepherds for others. Who are the weak in the community? Do you know anyone who is struggling to belong in your community? Do they need friendship, support, food, tutoring? What can you do as a family?



Saint Of The Week Andrew Dung-Lac

Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and his 116 companions represent the more than one hundred thousand martyrs killed during the persecutions of Christians which took place periodically beginning in the 17th Century and running though most of the 19th Century in Viet Nam. He was born Dung An Trân around 1795 to a poor pagan family in northern Viet Nam. He was instructed in the Christian faith and, three years later, he was baptized, taking the name Andrew at that time. As a parish priest, Andrew lived a simple life, fasting often and providing a model for the people in his town, many of whom were baptized by him. He was imprisoned and killed for his faith in 1938.

Andrew's message today:

Saint Andrew and his companions, as well as the many thousands of unnamed martyrs in Viet Nam, provide powerful examples of the perseverance that strong faith can bring to those who are persecuted. Even today in Viet Nam, as well as elsewhere, persecution of Christians continues, but prayer can strengthen our faith.

While not likely to face the kind of persecution that these saints experienced, is your faith strong enough to face the ridicule that is more likely to come your way? Pray that God will give you the strength to bear up to the scorn that may come your way and to pray for your persecutors.


