



#### What Should I Bake?

<u>Holiday Classics</u>: peanut butter blossoms, cake balls, spritz, snickerdoodles, gingerbread, and sugar cookies.

**Bars**: scotcheroos, seven layer, lemon, pumpkin, blondies, chocolate chip, or your favorite.

<u>Christmas Candies</u>: caramels, divinity, fudge, truffles, peanut brittle, peanut clusters, and pecan tassies.

Quick Breads: pumpkin, lemon poppyseed, banana, or your favorite.

Chex Mixes: salty and sweet, sugar cookie, caramel, puppy chow, or your favorite.

**Masculine Genius.** Masculinity is in crisis! Participation in religious worship, interest in marriage, and engagement in economic and political life has drastically declined.



# Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### **Ordinary Time**

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

**Reading I: Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10** | Honor God with your gifts. Be faithful one to another.

Malachi contrasted how God's people disrespected him to how other nations respected him.

For this dishonor the priests would be cursed.

The people were accused of infidelity in marriage

Parent-child and husband-wife relationships were compared to God's covenant with Israel.

**Reading II: 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13** | God's Word is at work in believers.

Paul said Sylvanus and Timothy, like parents, had spent their lives to bring the message of God to the Thessalonians.

Sylvanus and Timothy had functioned as true apostles.

They had not distorted the Gospel by their own self-seeking.

**Gospel : Matthew 23:1-12** | Seek God's honor, not your own honor.

Jesus told the Pharisees that they taught the law but did not practice it, not exhibit the compassion the law requires.

Some Pharisees used the Law and their office for their own benefit.

To seek exaltation was to be humbled; to seek humiliation was to be exalted.

Seek God's honor, not your own.



# Bring Home the Gospel | November 5, 2023

Reading I Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10 | Psalm 131:1, 2, 3 | Reading II 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13 | Gospel Matthew 23:1-12

Question For The Children How can you make the light of Christ shine through your life?

Question For The Youth What does it mean to humble yourself?

Question For The Adults Do you practice what you preach?

**Activity Of The Week** Discuss some Catholics who are being considered for sainthood. Have they exalted themselves, or humbled themselves? Sainthood is for all time, and not temporary glory. How does this equation work? Discuss how Jesus gave us teachings to help us be the best we can be for all time.



#### Saint Of The Week Rose Philippine Duchesne

Philippine, as she was called by her family, was born into an aristocratic family in France. The marriage of her mother, Rose Périer, to her father, Pierre-François Duchesne, had united the two most prosperous textile manufacturing families of the town. The family traits of strong will and determination were passed on to Philippine, along with a passion for reading and study. When Philippine was not yet ten years old, a Jesuit missionary enkindled a desire in Philippine to be a missionary to the Indians in the "new world." She entered the convent when she was old enough, and eventually arrived in New Orleans. From there they went up the Mississippi River to Missouri where she founded several schools. Her faith and prayerfulness were an example for all.

#### Saint's message today:

Philippine contributed much energy to organizing schools and convents in the diocese of New Orleans. But perhaps her greatest contributions came from her lifelong dedication to prayer. Much has been accomplished through prayer, and God certainly answered the prayers of this saint.

If you are having difficult in praying, perhaps you may want to look into a different way of prayer. Ask your pastor or a pastoral minister for some suggestions on resources that can help you in your search.
