
Holiday Bulletin Schedule. Due to holiday closures, we will publish a two-week bulletin before Christmas. We will publish the next bulletin the first weekend in January.





Advent - The twofold character of Advent calls us to prepare for the remembering of the Word made Flesh at Christmas, and directs us to wait with alertness for Jesus' second coming.

Reading I : Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11 - God is the joy of my soul.

- The third section of the Book of Isaiah was written shortly after Israel's return from exile.
- Today's passage connects anointing and being filled with the Spirit of God by using vocabulary similar to the servant songs in Second Isaiah.
- The prophet proclaims a year of jubilee when debts are forgiven and land is returned to its original owner.

Reading II : 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 - Do not stifle the spirit.

- At the end of the First Letter to the Thessalonians, Paul gives a series of directions to the faithful.
- Paul advises the Thessalonians to pray and give thanks without ceasing.
- The community is instructed to test everything and encourage that which is good.

Gospel : John 1:6-8, 19-28 - Prepare the way of the Lord!

- John's Gospel uses words from Isaiah 40 to identify John the Baptist as the one who prepares the way for the new exodus and return from exile.
- The priests and Levites ask, "Why then do you baptize?" Baptism was a form of initiation for Gentle converts to Judaism.
- John uses this opportunity to bear witness to the one who will come to baptize not in water but in Spirit.

Question for Children: As we get closer to Christmas, name one thing you really want for your home or the world, such as peace, friendship, or food for the poor.

Question for Youth: John tried to help people prepare their lives for the coming of the Messiah. What do you need to change about your life to be ready for Jesus' coming?

Question for Adults: If you were to write three suggestions for those who follow Jesus, to keep them strong in their faith, what would you write?

Saint of the Week - Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe

- Mary was chosen by God to be the mother of his son. By the simple act of saying "yes" to God's will, she became the greatest and first among all of our saints and a patron for all of us. Mary has been the intercessor for all people who call upon her and for many causes. As Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mary became a powerful intercessor for the indigenous people of Mexico at a time when the armies of Spain were conquering them. Her story is inextricably tied to the story of St. Juan Diego, to whom she appeared a number of times.
- As the pre-eminent saint of our Church, there are many feast days in honor of Our Lady. We honor her as Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. Under the title of the Immaculate Conception, Mary is also the patron of the United States.
- Mary's message today: Our greatest saint, Mary did one basic thing. She listened to God's will that she was to be the mother of Jesus and she accepted that will. "Let it be it done to me as you say." (Lk 1:38)
