




### From the Church | December 24 & 31, 2023



## Notes on the Mass | December 24, 2023 | Fourth Sunday of Advent

**Advent** - The twofold character of Advent calls us to prepare for the remembering of the Word made Flesh at Christmas, and wait with alertness for Jesus' second coming.

#### Reading I : 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16 - The Lord is with you.

- In today's reading, David wishes to build a temple, a house for the Ark of the Covenant, and so he consults his court prophet Nathan.
- Nathan relates to David the message that God does not want a house. The essence of God's message is: You will not build a house for me; I will build a house for you.
- The word house implies a temple or dynasty.

**Reading II : Romans 16:25-27** - The Gospel reveals a mystery hidden for many ages.

- In the letter to the Romans, Paul teaches about salvation and faith.
- Paul stresses that the Gospel, made known to all, is for the salvation of everyone who has faith.
- The mystery kept secret for ages is now made clear.

#### Gospel : Luke 1:26-38 - Blessed are you among women!

- The annunciation story in the Gospel of Luke presents Jesus as the fulfillment of the messianic hope.
- In today's passage, Mary of Nazareth humbly accepts the will of God, revealed by the angel Gabriel.
- Luke's Gospel highlights Mary's special role in God's plan of salvation.

Question for Children - If you were to tell someone one thing about Jesus' mother, Mary, what would you say?

**Question for Youth** - Gabriel's greeting to Mary was, "Hail, favored one! The Lord is with you." This is God's greeting to each of us – he loves us just as we are. What are some of your personal strengths that God rejoices in?

**Question for Adults** - Name one area of your life where God has surprised you with love, abilities, or even a pregnancy. How is God's Spirit upon you in this dimension of life?

#### Saint of the Week - Emily

St. Emily and her sister lived a monastic life, filled with prayer and sacrifice. While little is known of their day-to-day lives beyond their holiness, the manner of their deaths is remarkable. Emily's sister experienced a vision of their grandfather who told her of a place in heaven prepared for her and invited her to come to him. Soon after, she became ill and passed away on Christmas Eve. Within a few days, she appeared to Emily and called her to celebrate Epiphany in heaven. Emily suffered a short, sudden illness and joined her sister in heaven on the eve of Epiphany.

Few of us can follow the example of Emily and her older sister. In our world today, a life of constant prayer and reflection is difficult amid all of the distractions that we live with. Perhaps, like Gordiana, we can spend some time on retreat where we can thank God for all of his gifts to us and take a little time to reflect on what God is calling to do.

Do you try to take time for reflection each day? Have you considered joining your parish members in a retreat?



### Notes on the Mass | December 31, 2023 | Feast of the Holy Family

**Christmas** - During the Christmas season from December 24 until the Sunday after Epiphany, we reflect on the mystery of love made visible in the birth and early childhood of Christ.

Reading I : Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14 - Those who fear the Lord honor their parents.

- God appoints parents to care for their children.
- Whoever honors their parents atones for their sins.
- Care for parents as they age; be kind and considerate of them.

Reading II : Colossians 3:12-21 - Family life in the Lord.

- Live with heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience.
- Forgive one another.
- Live with gratitude and peace in your heart.

**Gospel : Luke 2:22-40** - The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom.

- Mary and Joseph took Jesus to Jerusalem to present him at the Temple.
- When Simeon held Jesus in his arms, he recognized him as the Messiah.
- As a child, Jesus grew stronger and he was filled with wisdom.

Question for Children - Why is it important for you to obey your parents or guardians?

**Question for Youth** - God chose to be among us in the person of Jesus. How does having a God who knows what it means to be human affect the way you pray or think about God?

**Question for Adults** - Whether single, married, or divorced, how does Paul's advice ring true in your own life? Choose one of his suggestions and share how it touches your life.

Saint of the Week - Thomas Becket, Bishop and Martyr

Thomas Becket was the son of the sheriff of London, and was well educated. His parents died when he was 21, and he went to work for a relative in London. Later, he joined the household of a local bishop and was eventually ordained and then made Archbishop of Canterbury himself. As Archbishop, he gave up the rich life style of England's rulers and adopted an austere life instead, centered in prayer. He was known for his generosity to the poor and greatly assisted King Henry in formulating the reforms in the justice system that were instituted during his tenure. He was forced by his own conscience to come into conflict with the King, who later murdered Thomas in his cathedral at Canterbury.

Thomas Becket is an excellent example of someone who made drastic life changes in order to follow his calling. Although his personality and methods could be offensive to others, he lived by what he believed was right.

What are the causes and issues in our times that you feel are worth fighting for?
