



## Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

#### Reading I: Malachi 3:1-4

There will come to the temple the Lord whom you seek.

- Malachi was faithful to his Jewish faith; yet, he was critical of the priesthood of his time.
- God visits the temple.
- God's visit results in purification of both the sacrifices and the ministers.

#### Reading II: Hebrews 2:14-18

He had to become like his brothers and sisters in every way.

- Jesus shares in the flesh and blood of humanity.
- Jesus is the compassionate high priest.
- Because Jesus suffered he is able to help those who suffer.

#### Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

My eyes have seen your salvation.

- Jesus grew up in a devout Jewish family and society.
- Simeon predicts that Jesus will cause conflict and division within Israel.
- Simeon and Anna knew that Jesus was God's promised Redeemer



#### Bring Home the Gospel | February 2nd, 2025

Reading I Malachi 3:1-4 | Psalm | Reading II Hebrews 2:14-18 | Gospel Luke 2:22-40

Question For The Children What do you want to tell others about Jesus?

**Question For The Youth** Simeon said that Jesus would be a "light to all nations." When, where or how do you see the light of Jesus?

**Question For The Adults** Mary and Joseph took their faith seriously enough to make a return to the Lord of the most precious thing in their lives, their son, whom they presented to God in the Temple. How do you return to God that which is most precious to you?

#### **Activity Of The Week**

Saint Of The Week Blaise, Bishop and Martyr, c. early 4th Century Bishop Blaise (sometimes spelled Blase) was martyred around 316 by order of Governor Agricolaus in Sebastea, Armenia, during Licinius' persecution of Christians. That is the only certain knowledge that we have about this saint.

According to legend, Blaise was born in Armenia to wealthy Christian parents and was made a bishop in his youth. He was known as a good bishop who encouraged the spiritual and physical health of his people. When the persecution of Christians began in Armenia, Blaise was forced to flee. He went to live as a hermit in the back country, where he cured wild animals that were sick or wounded.

One day, while seeking animals for the amphitheater, a group of hunters, came across Blaise kneeling in prayer in a cave surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions, and bears. Recognizing him as a Christian, the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison. On the way there, a mother came to him with her young son who was choking to death on a fish bone caught in his throat. Blaise cured the boy; thus, he later became the patron and protector of throats. Many Catholics in this country still have their throats blessed on St. Blaise's feast day, February 3.

**Blaise's message today:** All of God's creatures, great and small, are entitled to our care and compassion. There are many people, young and old, who may not be able to look after their own needs. It is up to us to help them in whatever way we can.

Are you aware of the needs in your own community? What can you do to alleviate the suffering of others?
