

Notes on the Mass | February 9th, 2025

Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Here I am! Send me.

- In the first reading, Isaiah gives an account of his prophetic call.
- Isaiah has a vision in which one of the seraphim touches his lips with a hot coal from the incense burner.
- This is a sign that his lips are cleansed to preach God's word.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

The grace of God is with us always.

- The reading from 1 Corinthians precedes the Gospel of Mark and is the oldest statement of resurrection faith recorded.
- Paul presents the Gospel's general outline in the formal pattern of rabbinical tradition.
- For Paul, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is the culmination of things written long ago.

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

The apostles were called and so are we.

- Today's Gospel story presents Luke's account of the call of the first disciples.
- In contrast to the story told by Matthew and Mark, here the disciples had a more resounding reason to respond to the call from Jesus.
- Simon Peter's response to the call reminds us of the response of Isaiah: "Leave me Lord. I am a sinful man."



Bring Home the Gospel | February 9th, 2025

Reading I Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 | Psalm | Reading II 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 | Gospel Luke 5:1-11

Question For The Children What is a way that you can follow Jesus?

Question For The Youth Following Jesus can mean leaving some things behind. What do you need to let go of to follow Jesus more fully in your life?

Question For The Adults When recently did God call you to do something that was difficult?

Activity Of The Week The readings for this Sunday remind us that we are called by God to go forth and share the Good News. Decide as a family upon one action that would show your willingness to follow the way of Jesus. For example, visit a neighbor who is sick, offer to take a homebound person shopping, invite someone who lives alone to dinner.

Saint Of The Week Apollonia, Virgin and Martyr, died 249 St. Dionysius wrote an account of the heavy persecution of Christians by the pagan populace in the city of Alexandria in the last year of the reign of the Emperor Philip. An enraged mob killed several older Christians who would not blaspheme God or worship the false gods. Many other Christians fled the city, leaving all of their possessions behind rather than renounce their faith. St. Dionysius noted that he knew of none who yielded to the pressure.

Among the Christians martyred at this time was Apollonia, a deaconess. The pagans first beat her severely, knocking all of the teeth out of her head. Then, dragging her out of the city, they lit a great fire and threatened to throw her into it unless she blasphemed God. Apollonia asked for a moment's delay which, interpreted by the pagans as a sign that she was considering it, was granted. When she was freed, Apollonia threw herself onto the flames. While we, as Christians, believe it a sin to hasten one's own death, St. Augustine was of the opinion that Apollonia was guided by the Holy Spirit in her action.

St. Apollonia, the patron saint of dentists, is invoked against toothache and all dental diseases. In ancient art, she is often depicted holding a tooth in a pair of pincers or with a golden tooth hung from a necklace.

While this saint is no longer listed on the universal calendar of the Church, she is honored by dentists and others on February 9th.

Apollonia's message today: Standing up for one's faith is easy only if that faith is strong. Faith will remain strong only if we ask God to give us the strength we need to face the many obstacles and temptations which cross our paths.
