





Dear Parents and Guardians,

Last month I provided an update on progress in determining teacher compensation for the coming year. I am pleased to share that we are on track with our multi-year regional goal to match public school compensation scales. Never before have our schools been in a position to provide pay raises that truly account for a teacher's education and years of experience. Some of our most tenured teachers will see significant increases - a well-deserved acknowledgement of their dedication and loyalty. Marty Flaherty, principal at Holy Family, is just one administrator who has shared how grateful he is to provide just compensation for teachers. In his words: "Our teachers are committed, faith-filled professionals who provide our kids with an exceptional education. The regionalization process put us in a position to compensate our teachers in a way that they deserve."

If you haven't already seen this video, I encourage you to take a few minutes to learn about the new regional approach to tuition affordability, teacher compensation and stewarding our collective resources.

In addition, I want to provide some reminders regarding the tuition assistance process and ESAs:

- The tuition assistance application process is open now through April 18. There is just <u>one application</u> per household for all available programs including CTO and the new Diocesan Tuition Assistance Endowment. <u>Click here</u> for income guidelines.
- The process and time frame for the distribution of <u>ESA funds</u> is still being determined, therefore it is imperative that families proceed with the Fair application. Receiving tuition assistance does not affect ESA eligibility and can only help a family's financial situation.
- Families are invited to join me in a virtual meeting to learn more about tuition assistance and ESAs on Friday, March 3 at noon or Tuesday, March 28 at 5:30 p.m. You do not need to register simply click here to join.

We are grateful to our regional board for developing an ambitious but attainable plan to meet this goal, only possible with the collaboration of Bishop Joensen, pastors, administrators and diocesan staff.

## Third Sunday of Lent

#### Lent

Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

#### Reading I: Exodus 17:3-7

Is the Lord in our midst or not?

- In the Exodus reading, the Israelites grumble about their experience in the desert.
- Their thirst represents Israel's real question, "Why did God make us leave Egypt?"
- Yahweh responds graciously to the needs of the people.

#### Reading II: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

We are at peace with God through Christ.

- The wonder of God's free gift of salvation in Jesus is subject of the passage from Paul's Letter to the Romans.
- God responds to our need with compassion and mercy.
- God's love is poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit.

#### Gospel: John 4:5-42

Whoever drinks the water I give, will never thirst again.

- In the story of the Samaritan woman, Jesus uses water as a symbol of God's revelation and God's Spirit.
- The exchange between Jesus and the woman causes conversion to take place.
- The woman identifies Jesus several times, each time with greater understanding. First, he was a Jewish man, then a prophet, and finally she makes a comment about the Messiah.



### BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | MARCH 12, 2023

**Reading I** Exodus 17:3-7 | **Psalm** 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 | **Reading II** Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 | **Gospel** John 4:5-42

Question For The Children How do you experience Jesus helping and loving you?

**Question For The Youth** Jesus revealed himself to an outcast of society. How can you be "living water" to the outcasts of your school? Society? The world?

**Question For The Adults** When you are tempted to try to satisfy your "thirst for meaning" through some other means, what keeps you coming back to the living water of intimacy with Christ? Through what means do you experience Christ's power in your life: Sacraments? Scripture? Prayer? Others?

**Activity Of The Week** Create a centerpiece for the dinner table on the theme of water. You may want to use a dish of water, a flower to float in the water, or a candle that floats in the water. Go around the table and have family members answer this question. How is Jesus satisfying a thirst of yours?



#### Saint Of The Week Mark of Arethusa

Mark was the bishop of Arethusa (in present day Syria), and he had gained many converts to Christianity, but he was punished for this and eventually tortured and killed. And even though he himself was an old man at this time, Mark did not yield to his tormentors. His strength was so strong that they feared if they killed him, he would only draw more people to the faith. So they released him and his good work continued.

It is never easy to stand up for one's beliefs. Most of us will not have to endure torture to support our values and standards. But we can't turn away from our faith because someone ridicules us.


