#### Notes on the Mass | March 10th, 2024

# Fourth Sunday of Lent

Lent: Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

#### Reading I: 2 Chronicles 36:14-17, 19-29

Early and often did God send messengers to them.

- The Second Book of Chronicles was written after the Babylonian exile as a reinterpretation of history for the new situation in which the people found themselves.
- A major focus of hope for the returned community was the rebuilt temple, a sign of the return of God's
  presence.
- The people saw the destruction of the former temple as a punishment for their sins and a fulfillment of the prophets' warnings.

#### Reading II: Ephesians 2:4-10

God is rich in mercy.

- The Letter to the Ephesians emphasizes that God's salvation is a gift and not something earned by human effort.
- In the Hebrew Scriptures the major covenant virtues of love and fidelity are manifested in God and demanded of humans.
- In Ephesians we are told again that it is because of God's great love and abundant mercy that we are brought to life in Christ.

#### **Gospel**: <u>John 3:14-21</u>

The light came into the world.

- In today's Gospel, Jesus explains the truth seen in faith to Nicodemus.
- Those who choose eternal life receive it because of faith in Christ.
- Humans choose salvation or reject it just as they choose or reject life.



#### Notes on the Mass | March 17th, 2024

# Fifth Sunday of Lent

Lent: Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

#### Reading I: Jeremiah 31:31-34

I will make a new covenant with Israel.

- The prophecy of Jeremiah in today's first reading was spoken to the people of Israel while they were in exile.
- The people had not remained faithful to the covenant made at Sinai.
- The old covenant was written stone; the new covenant will be written in the people's hearts.

#### Reading II: Hebrews 5:7-9

Jesus learned to obey God.

- The reading from the Letter to the Hebrews describes the prayer of Jesus during his passion.
- It is his reverence that makes Jesus perfect and the source of salvation for all who obey him.
- Salvation comes through obedience bought with suffering.

#### Gospel: John 22:20-33

If it dies, it produces much grain.

- The author of today's Gospel is writing for a Greek audience.
- Jesus' response to some Greeks asking to see Jesus becomes a prediction of his death and glorification.
- In the image of the grain of wheat that dies to produce life we see that God will be glorified in the death of Jesus. Jesus will be exalted, drawing all persons to himself and thus to eternal life.
