

From Father Mark | March 30th, 2025

Greetings.

Throughout our Annual Appeal I am trying to provide some information and updates. Again, our parish assessment for this year is \$105,708. As you know, we made our assessment the last several years and we want to continue this trend each year.

A few weeks ago I shared how the appeal helps to support the priests and seminarians of our diocese. There are many other essential programs and ministries also supported by the Annual Appeal that a single parish simply cannot do on its own.

Another important ministry supported by your appeal pledges is our Catholic Charities. Catholic Charities assists in many areas, and each year helps with the following:

- Counsels hundreds of individuals and families who are dealing with various issues and challenges
- Provides expanded sexual abuse and domestic violence programs in our diocese
- Assists refugee families from a variety of countries and assists them in finding shelter and work
- Feeds and clothes thousands of individuals at no cost through St. Mary's Family Emergency Center
- Houses families who are homeless and provides services to assist in transition into a self-sustaining situation

The above is yet one more essential ministry that is supported by your contributions to the Diocesan Appeal. As of March 21st^h, we have 118 pledges and gifts totaling \$47,280 for our Holy Trinity effort. We would like to see all parishioners participate. I invite all to give this your most prayerful consideration. All gifts, no matter the size, will help us to do our part as members of Holy Trinity Parish to support the work of our Church. Again, we need everyone's help; long time parishioners, newer parishioners, school families; all of the Holy Trinity community is needed in this annual effort. Notes on the Mass | March 30th, 2025

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Lent Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

Reading I: Joshua 5:9a, 10-12

They ate the produce of the land.

- The first reading recounts Israel's rebirth in the land of promise.
- As the people crossed the Jordan River, they celebrated Passover, just as they had when they crossed the Red Sea.
- The period of wandering in the wilderness was over.

Reading II: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

We are reconciled with God through Christ.

- The main subject in Paul's second letter to the Church of Corinth is reconciliation.
- Paul stresses reconciliation with God, with himself, and with the Corinthian Community.
- Through Christ, sinners are reconciled to God.

Gospel: Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

The son that was lost came back home.

- In the presence of the Pharisees and Scribes, who are outraged by Jesus' treatment of sinners, Jesus tells the story of the return of the prodigal son.
- Today's parable shows that God's forgiveness is for everyone.
- God's mercy and love is immeasurable and beyond human understanding.



Bring Home the Gospel | March 30th, 2025

Reading I | Psalm | Reading II | Gospel

Question For The Children Who is the one person you most need to say, "I'm sorry" to in your family?

Question For The Youth Is it difficult for you to say "I'm sorry" when you hurt another or get off track in your own life? Why or why not?

Question For The Adults How have you or your family welcomed a family member who has been distant and/or absent from you?

Activity Of The Week Agree, as a family, to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation together with the Parish family during Lent. Check to see that everyone is comfortable and remembers how to participate in the sacrament. Plan a family treat after the celebration.

Saint Of The Week

Joseph, Husband of Mary Joseph, we know, was engaged to Mary. Upon learning that she was pregnant, he resolved to divorce her. Described in Matthew as a righteous man, Joseph did not want to expose Mary to public disgrace; therefore he intended to dismiss her quietly. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream to tell him, "do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit." (Mt 1:20). He remained her faithful husband and helped raise Jesus. Joseph worked as a carpenter. We know that he taught his trade to Jesus, as was the custom of the times. We can also assume that Jesus, like most boys, picked up the mannerisms and speech of Joseph.

Devotions to St. Joseph began to grow in the Middle Ages, but only became widespread in the fifteenth century when his feast day was added to the Church calendar in 1479. St. Teresa and St. Frances de Sales particularly popularized devotion to the foster father of our Lord. Pope Pius IX declared St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870 and later popes pronounced St. Joseph the patron of workers and of social justice, with Pope Pius XII establishing May 1 as the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. He is also honored by a Solemnity on March 19.

Joseph's message today: In a time when families are breaking up, often with fathers abandoning their wives and children, Joseph provides a model for fathers who love their families.

• When the weight of the world seems to have settled on your shoulders, try saying a prayer to St. Joseph.

Ask him to help you carry your burden.
