From Father Mark | March 31st, 2024

Greetings....Happy Easter!

In the Gospel today we hear of Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb of Jesus and finding it empty. We hear her say, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." She is confused, what has happened to Jesus, where has he been taken? When Peter and the other apostle arrive, we hear one believes, we don't know about the other. More confusion?

Aren't we sometimes confused in our own lives and unsure of how to proceed as we try to move forward? Don't we sometimes doubt ourselves and the decisions we have made in life. On Good Friday, we heard Jesus cry out "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" But moments later, we hear him say with his dying breath, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." The scriptures tell that Jesus was like us in all things except sin. Maybe in his humanity, Jesus had that moment of confusion, but he quickly places his life in the hands of His Father; God.

What of ourselves? We all have those moments of human weakness; those times of doubt and confusion. When the apostles are told Jesus has risen; that he has defeated death, they have a difficult time believing, even though they have been told all along that this is what would happen. In seeing the risen Jesus, they finally come to believe. As we celebrate Easter, are we able to see God at work in our own lives; do we recognize Him even amidst those times of confusion and doubt?

As we celebrate Easter, as we spend time with family, friends, and loved ones, let's all take some time to give thanks for the gift of our faith and for our God who assures us that if we persevere in the faith, we will not be defeated, not even by death itself; that if we are looking for God and are willing to see him; we will see His presence and his work all around us.

Easter Sunday

Easter- The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I : Acts 10:34, 37-43

After Jesus was raised from the dead, we ate and drank with Him.

- In the first reading, Peter's speech is a typical recital of the essential preaching about Christ.
- Peter and all the disciples are commissioned to bear witness to the good news.
- Those who received their commission from the Risen Lord were eyewitnesses of his glory.

Reading II : Colossians 3:1-4

You have died!

- Paul uses the image of yeast to remind the Corinthian community that one person's evil influence can harm the whole community.
- The image of unleavened bread is used to expose our need to purify ourselves.
- In the context of the Easter celebration, we are reminded to renew our Baptism.

Gospel : John 20:1-9

Mary Magdalene came to the tomb.

- In the Gospel of John, Mary runs to tell Peter and John about the empty tomb.
- John is the first to arrive at the tomb which shows his special position as the beloved disciple.
- Upon entering the empty tomb, John makes his profession of faith, "he saw and believed."



Reading I Acts 10:34, 37-43 | Psalm 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23. | Reading II Colossians 3:1-4 | Gospel John 20:1-9

Question For The Children What sacrifices do you make for those whom you love?

Question For The Youth Even the disciples had a hard time understanding Jesus' Resurrection – it is that surprising. What does Resurrection mean to you? What does Easter mean to you?

Question For The Adults In what ways has God called you to die in Christ? How is this expressed in your own life?

Activity Of The Week Make an Easter card to send to those who were baptized at the Easter Vigil or to those baptized Christians who became full members of the Catholic Church.

t Of The Week Bernadette, Virgin, 1844-1879 The oldest child of a family living in extreme poverty in Lourdes, France, Bernadette was born in January, 1844. Never healthy in her lifetime, she suffered asthma and other maladies during her childhood that stunted her growth and kept her from attending school. The result, and Bernadette's inability to read, meant that she could not receive her First Communion until she was about fourteen. It was at about this time that Bernadette experienced her visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary. These visions continued for some time, and in the end, many people believed because of her. The city of Lourdes remains a holy place and a pilgrimage destination for many today.
