



## First Sunday of Lent

Lent Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the

paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

Reading I : Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Worship the Lord your God.

- Today's reading from the Book of Deuteronomy reflects the central beliefs of the Israelites.
- The people offered a portion of the first harvest of the year to acknowledge that the land belonged to God.
- The recited creed was an expression of gratitude to God.

#### Reading II : Romans 10:8-13

There is only one God.

- The passage from the Letter to the Romans stresses Paul's belief that Jesus is Lord.
- Jesus trusted in God, his Father, and was raised from the dead.
- What we must do to share in that salvation is simply to believe in the risen Lord.

#### Gospel : Luke 4:1-13

Jesus is led into the desert and tempted.

- In today's Gospel passage, the Spirit drove Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the devil.
- Just as God led Israel out of Egypt, nourished them for forty years in the desert, and gave them the Promised Land, so God would care for Jesus during and after his forty days in the desert.
- Jesus passed the test because his trust in God never wavered.



Reading I Deuteronomy 26:4-10 | Psalm | Reading II Romans 10:8-13 | Gospel Luke 4:1-13

Question For The Children When you feel tempted to do wrong, how do you remain strong in your faith?

Question For The Youth What is one thing you will do during Lent to become more open to God in your life?

**Question For The Adults** As you come to understand the temptation of Jesus in the desert, which one of the devil's offerings is hardest for you to resist?

**Activity Of The Week** Lent is a time of prayerful reflection. Discuss with your family a time during the week or day that all radios, stereos, televisions, computers, and telephones will be shut off so family members can pray. Call it the family's prayer time. At the end of the week, ask family members to share what they have learned or gained from the experience.

#### Saint Of The Week Jerome Emiliani, Religious

Jerome was born in Venice and became a commander of the League of Cambrai and was captured and imprisoned during a battle. He spent the time in prison learning to pray. When he escaped, he returned to Venice and began studies for the priesthood and was ordained in 1518. He decided to devote himself to care for orphans during the plague and eventually founded the Clerks Regular of Somascha to care for orphans and to educate children and priests. He died of an infectious disease that he caught while caring for the children. He is the patron saint of abandoned children and orphans.

Jerome's message today: Jerome was a good and caring person, even a heroic one. Though we may not be able to help abandoned children and orphans in the same manner as he did, we all know someone who has been abandoned by friends or family, or who is spiritually "orphaned." We, like Jerome, can reach out to these abandoned ones.

• Is there someone in your life who needs God's healing touch right now? As a follower of Christ, are you willing to offer it?
