Notes on the Mass | March 16th, 2025

Second Sunday of Lent

Lent: Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

Reading I: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God makes a covenant with Abram.

- In the reading from Genesis, God promises Abram many descendants.
- God seals the covenant with Abram by appearing as a flaming torch between the carcasses of the sacrificial animals.
- This was symbolic because the ancient way of sealing an agreement was for both parties to walk between the split bodies of sacrificial animals.

Reading II: Philippians 3:17-4:1 or Philippians 3:20-4:1

Christ will transform us.

- In the second reading, Paul encourages the Philippians to trust God and wait.
- Those who lose faith search for immediate gains.
- Those who wait for God's promises will share in Jesus' glory.

Gospel : Luke 9:28b-36

As Jesus prayed, He was transformed.

- Immediately after Jesus told the disciples that he would suffer, die, and rise again, he takes a select group of them to a mountain to pray.
- While on the mountain, Jesus reveals his divine identity to Peter, John and James.
- Peter, captivated by the transformation of Jesus, wanted the scene to last.



Bring Home the Gospel | March 16th, 2025

Reading I Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 | Psalm | Reading II Philippians 3:17-4:1 or Philippians 3:20-4:1 | Gospel Luke 9:28b-36

Question For The Children Jesus invites you to be close to him, to see him with clear eyes. What is Jesus like as a friend?

Question For The Youth What do you most want God to help you with?

Question For The Adults Sometimes we can see Christ with clear eyes, as the disciples did on that mountain. Share about such a time in your own life.

Activity Of The Week As a family, brainstorm goals that you want God to help you with. List the goals on a sheet of paper. For each goal, discuss: Why is this goal important to the family? What must the family do in order to accomplish this goal? How can each member of the family participate?

Saint Of The Week Peter, Apostle, Pope and Martyr Even the great saints need God's forgiveness and grace. Peter, like the rest of us, turned away from Jesus for a time. He was a son of John and the brother of Andrew, but as a leading disciple of Christ, he famously denied even knowing him! Nonetheless, Christ built his Church on Peter, as his rock. And after the Resurrection, in a wonderful scene on the beach, Jesus invited Peter to reconciliation and forgiveness, and asked him to "feed my sheep." This feast is called the Chair of Saint Peter and commemorates Christ handing over the leadership of the Church to Saint Peter and his successors. We celebrate the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29.

Peter's message today: Peter provides a good example of Jesus' love for us. Peter denied Jesus three times, yet Jesus still loved Peter and did not withhold the position he had promised. Likewise, Jesus loves us and forgives us our sins when ask his forgiveness.

• Have you asked for Jesus' forgiveness? If you will be received into the Church at the Easter Vigil, have you begun to prepare for the sacrament of reconciliation?



Notes on the Mass | March 23rd, 2025

Third Sunday of Lent

Lent: Forty days before the Triduum, the Lenten season disposes Catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery through prayer and penitential practices.

Reading I: Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15 God's name is: "I AM WHO AM".

- In the first reading from Exodus, Moses questions God's call.
- God's answer, "I AM who Am" has lead believers to contemplate the meaning of God's reply to Moses.
- Today's passage shows that even in the moment of personal revelation, God remains a mystery.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12

What is written about Moses is to help us.

- The reading from 1 Corinthians is Paul's meditation on the fate of the people who were delivered in the Exodus.
- Not all of the people who were freed remained faithful to God.
- Paul stresses that being delivered from sin through Baptism is not enough. We must continue to turn back to God when we have turned away.

Gospel : Luke 13:1-9 Jesus tells us to repent.

- Today's Gospel story was Jesus' answer to those who judged others through the theory of retribution.
- Humans cannot see enough to judge God's purpose in events.
- The parable illustrates God's patience concerning human sin.



Bring Home the Gospel | March 23rd, 2025

Reading I Exodus 3:1-8a, 13-15 | **Psalm** | **Reading II** 1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12 | **Gospel** Luke 13:1-9

Question For The Children God wants your faith to result in good living. What steps can you take during Lent to make sure that happens?

Question For The Youth What needs changing in your life right now? How will you invite God into that change?

Question For The Adults What steps are you taking this Lent to make sure that your faith bears fruit in good works?

Activity Of The Week Plan to attend your parish Lenten Reconciliation service as a family.

Saint Of The Week Paul, Apostle and Martyr This saint was originally called by a Jewish name, Saul. He was born in the year A.D. 5 and studied under a renowned rabbi in Jerusalem. He became a rigid adherent of Jewish law, and an obsessed persecutor of the Christians. But one day, Christ appeared to Saul and his heart and life were turned around forever. He took on the name Paul and became a great missionary for the early Church, writing many letters to support or challenge new Christians, and helping expand the faith around the Mediterranean Sea. Paul was an important writer and apostle who had a tremendous impact on the early church. His influence shaped the entire Christian experience, and continues to this day. His epistles to the Romans, his pastoral letters to his Timothy and Titus, and his letters to the various Christian communities which he was instrumental in converting form an important part of church teaching. We celebrate the conversion of St. Paul on January 25, while the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles, is celebrated on June 29.

Paul's message today: None of us are likely to have as strong an influence on the Church as Paul has had through history. However, we are all capable of influencing our community and those with whom we live and work.

Ask yourself: what kind of an influence have I been on my family? My neighbors? My co-workers?
