From Father Mark | April 20th, 2025

Greetings,

Happy Easter! In the Gospel today we hear of Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb of Jesus and finding it empty. We hear her say, ""They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." She is confused, what has happened to Jesus, where has he been taken? When Peter and the other apostle arrive, we hear one believes, we don't know about the other. More confusion?

Aren't we sometimes confused in our own lives and unsure of how to proceed as we try to move forward? Don't we sometimes doubt ourselves and the decisions we have made in life. On Good Friday, we heard Jesus cry out "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" But moments later, we hear him say with his dying breath, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." The scriptures tell that Jesus was like us in all things except sin. Maybe in his humanity, Jesus had that moment of confusion, but he quickly places his life in the hands of His Father; God.

What of ourselves? We all have those moments of human weakness; those times of doubt and confusion. When the apostles are told Jesus has risen; that he has defeated death, they have a difficult time believing, even though they have been told all along that this is what would happen. In seeing the risen Jesus, they finally come to believe. As we celebrate Easter, are we able to see God at work in our own lives; do we recognize Him even amidst those times of confusion and doubt?

As we celebrate Easter, as we spend time with family, friends, and loved ones, let's all take some time to give thanks for the gift of our faith and for our God who assures us that if we persevere in the faith, we will not be defeated, not even by death itself; that if we are looking for God and are willing to see him; we will see His presence and his work all around us.

I also want to send a big thank you to all of our volunteers; altar servers, lectors, MCs, choir, musicians and especially Tom Quiner and Eric Sharp who coordinate our liturgical music, our cantors, ushers, greeters, our Holy Thursday foot washing volunteers, and all who make our liturgies possible here and who helped make our Holy Week and Easter liturgies especially meaningful. Thanks also to our own deacons Jim Obradovich and Doug Renze for their help. They make my job much easier.

Special thanks to Lori Marso and her team for once again coordinating our Easter Vigil reception; it was great! Big thanks also to Brad Rea and his team for always making our church look so beautiful for our liturgies and liturgical seasons. I regularly hear how much people appreciate these efforts and want to pass along my thanks as well.

Finally, welcome to all those who received the Easter Sacraments of Initiation....congratulations!

Notes on the Mass | April 20th, 2025

First Sunday of Easter

Easter- The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

They were witnesses to all that Jesus said and did.

- Peter announces to the Gentile household of Cornelius, that all who believe are forgiven of their sins.
- Today's passage highlights the expansion of the Church.
- The disciples spread the good news to the far ends of the earth.

Reading II: Colossians 3:1-4

Seek to be like Christ.

- Paul calls for a new way of life in today's second reading.
- In Baptism we have "passed over" from death to life.
- Those who participate in Christ's death and Resurrection through the sacrament of Baptism are on a journey of faith.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

Jesus is raised from the dead.

- In John's Gospel, Mary Magdalene is first to arrive at the tomb early on the morning after Jesus rose.
- The second and third visitors come to the tomb because of Mary's incredible story.
- Before Jesus appeared to anyone, Mary visited his tomb and was the first to announce the events of the resurrection.

Saint Of The Week Julie Billiart, Virgin and Religious, 1751-1816 Mary Rose Julie Billiart was born in northern France. She was exceptionally gifted, but with little education at the age of seven, she memorized the catechism and taught the children in her village its lessons. She celebrated her First Communion at the age of nine, ordinarily reserved for adults. Because of a robbery, then later a shooting of her father, she became partially paralyzed and confined to bed. She spent several hours a day praying, and catechizing young children gathered at her bed. She had to escape persecution for her faith and eventually began the Sisters of Notre Dame. She is the patron of those suffering from illness or impoverishment.




