Notes on the Mass | June 22nd, 2025

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Reading I: Genesis 14:18-20

Blessed by God most High!

- The first reading describes Melchizedek, king and priest in what would later be called Jerusalem.
- Melchizedek blessed Abraham and offered him bread and wine.
- The offering of bread and wine to Abraham relates to the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Mass.

Reading II:

Each time you eat this bread and drink from this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord.

- In the passage from 1 Corinthians, Paul is scolding the wealthy members of the community for having special dinners and excluding the poor.
- The Corinthians misunderstood that their sharing in the Eucharistic meal made them one body with each other, the Body of Christ.
- Paul reminded the Corinthians that Jesus was present whenever they told the story and shared the meal.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Christ feeds us.

- Luke's version of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes has been influenced by the liturgical practices of the Christians.
- The words describing Jesus' actions reflect the telling of the Eucharistic story.
- Jesus does not feed the crowd but instructs the disciples to do so. This suggests the ministries in the Church of distributing the Eucharistic food and sharing meals with the hungry.



Bring Home the Gospel | June 22nd, 2025

Reading I Genesis 14:18-20 | Psalm | Reading II 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 | Gospel Luke 9:11b-17

Question For The Children How can you share what you have received from Jesus with others this week?

Question For The Youth Each week, when we celebrate the Holy Eucharist we are asked to "do this in remembrance of me". How else do you acknowledge the importance of Jesus in your life? Through prayer? Through the ways that you treat others?

Question For The Adults How can you prepare yourself to be nourished by Jesus in the Eucharist this week?

Activity Of The Week The Eucharist is the center and heart of Catholic Christian life. Make a loaf of bread for the evening meal. Light a candle and say a blessing for the family. Have each member pull off a piece of the loaf as a reminder that we are one in unity with each other.

Saint Of The Week Thérèse of the Child Jesus, Virgin, 1873-1897

When Thérèse was very young, she wanted to serve God. She gave money to the poor because she worried about them. She entered the convent when she was fifteen years old. Thérèse wrote about serving God in little ways. She trusted God and loved him very much. Thérèse taught other sisters about God. She also wrote a book. People still read her book. People still read her book to learn how to serve God and other people.

Due to her popularity and the miracles which were attributed to her soon after her death, the Holy See dispensed with the period of fifty years which ordinarily elapsed in those days before the beatification process could begin. Pope Pius XI beatified her in 1923 and declared her a saint in 1925.

St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus is the patroness of all foreign missions and of all works for Russia. She is also a patroness of aviators. We honor St. Thérèse with a Memorial on October 1.

Thérèse's message today: "To pick up a pin for love can convert a soul." Thérèse understood that anything we do for another in God's name is done for love. Even in doing the humblest and most mundane of chores, Thérèse was serving God in the most magnificent manner. We too should dedicate our daily tasks to God and do them with love.

Do you go about your daily tasks with joy or do you complain about what you are asked to do?

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul

Reading I: Acts 12:1-11

Now I know for certain that the Lord rescued me from the hand of Herod.

- King Herod was persecuting Christians.
- Peter was arrested.
- An angel of the Lord rescued Peter from prison.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18

From now on the crown of righteousness awaits me.

- Paul's letter is like an obituary for himself, assessing his work.
- Peter says that he has competed well, finished the race, and kept the faith.
- Paul and all who faithfully follow Christ will wear the garland of victory.

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-19

You are Peter, and I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

- Jesus says to the disciples, "Who do you say that I am?"
- Simon Peter replies, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."
- Jesus says to Peter, "Upon this rock I will build my Church."



Bring Home the Gospel | June 29th, 2025

Reading I Acts 12:1-11 | Psalm | Reading II 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18 | Gospel Matthew 16:13-19

Question For The Children Who do you say that Jesus is?

Question For The Youth How does the way you live your life show that you are a follower of Christ?

Question For The Adults Before the Resurrection, Peter denied Jesus three times. But in today's Gospel, we hear about a Peter who has unshakable faith. He clearly proclaims that Jesus is Christ, the Son of the living God. What can you do to strengthen your faith and draw nearer to Christ?

Activity Of The Week In order to love someone, we need to really get to know that person. And getting to know someone takes time. Invite family members to share about a person they really know well and love. Then discuss how we can really get to know Jesus.

Saint Of The Week Peter, Apostle, First Century Saint Peter was named Simon and he was the brother of Saint Andrew. They were both fishermen in Galilee. Peter's brother introduced him to Jesus. Peter was a zealous follower of Jesus. He was the first disciple to recognize that Jesus was "the Christ, the Son of the living God." However, we also know that Peter doubted Jesus when walking on water and betrayed Jesus three times on the night Jesus died.

In spite of Peter's doubt and betrayal, Jesus recognizes God at work in Peter. Jesus chooses Peter to lead his Church. Jesus said, "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church" (Matthew 13:18). As the leader of the Church, Peter endured persecution and imprisonment. Yet, Peter remained faithful. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith.

St. Peter lived his last years in Rome. He was martyred in the year 64. He was crucified upside-down at his own request, because he claimed he was not worthy to die as Jesus had.

Paul, Apostle, First Century

Before his conversion on the road to Damascus, Paul was known as Saul. Saul was a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians.

Paul's recollection of his amazing conversion is told in the Acts of the Apostles 22:6-16. Saul was traveling to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" He answered, "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said, "I am Jesus of Nazareth whom you are persecuting." Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel fervently.

Saint Paul became the Apostle to the Gentiles, those who were not Jewish. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

Eventually, Paul suffered persecution and was imprisoned. He was beheaded in the year 67.

Peter and Paul's message today: Both Peter and Paul devoted their lives to spreading the Good News. They both led the church and helped it to grow.
