



#### Notes on the Mass | July 14th, 2024

## Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Ordinary time: For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Amos 7:12-15

The Lord has called and sent me.

- The prophet Amos preached at a time when God's people were divided into two kingdoms, Judah in the south and Israel in the north.
- God calls Amos to give the northern kingdom of Israel an unpleasant message.
- When Amos's message is not welcome, he points out that the choice to become a prophet was not his own.

Reading II: Ephesians 1:3-14

We have been chosen in Christ.

- The letter to the Ephesians begins with a great hymn of praise.
- All people have been chosen by God in Christ, even before creation.
- Christians are redeemed by Christ and sealed with the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

He sent them out to preach and teach, giving them power to do so.

- In the Gospel story from Mark, Jesus sends the disciples out to do his work.
- Today's passage immediately follows the story of Jesus' rejection in Nazareth.
- If Jesus is rejected, the disciples continuing his work should also expect rejection.



#### Bring Home the Gospel | July 14th, 2024

Reading I Amos 7:12-15 | Psalm | Reading II Ephesians 1:3-14 | Gospel Mark 6:7-13

Question For The Children What can you do to help your friends and classmates know more about Jesus?

**Question For The Youth** Jesus knew that his mission was for everyone, not just one village or group of people. How can you reach out to others (outside of friends and family) and offer them hope and Good News?

**Question For The Adults** If you were going to pray for healing for any reason, what would it be? What needs to be healed in our world and society?

**Activity Of The Week** Tell a story about a time when you shared the Good News with a coworker, a neighbor, or a family member.



#### Saint Of The Week Josephine Bakhita, c. 1870-1947

St. Josephine Bakhita (born c. 1869, Olgossa, Darfur (now in Sudan)—died February 8, 1947, Schio, Italy; canonized October 1, 2000; feast day February 8) was a Sudanese-born Roman Catholic saint who survived kidnapping and enslavement. She is the patron saint of Sudan and of victims of human trafficking.

Josephine was born in the Daju village of Olgossa in Darfur. Her uncle was a tribal chief, and her family was relatively prosperous. Her life was forever altered when she was kidnapped from her family as a young child and enslaved by Arab slave traders, likely in early 1877. The terrified girl was bought and sold at least two times over the next few months and forced to walk hundreds of miles on foot to a slave market in Al-Ubayyid in south-central Sudan. Over the next decade of enslavement, Josephine was passed from owner to owner, bought and sold so many times that she forgot her birth name. At some point during her captivity she was given the name Bakhita, which is Arabic for "fortunate."

Pope John Paul II beatified Josephine Bakhita in 1992 and canonized her on October 1, 2000. She is the patron saint of the Sudan and is honored by a feast day in that country on February 1.

#### Notes on the Mass | July 21st, 2024

## Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Ordinary time: For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Jeremiah 23:1-6

Woe to those who mislead their sheep.

- Preaching just before the Babylonian exile, Jeremiah warns the people that they will lose the land and be driven into exile unless they turn from their evil ways.
- The people do not turn from their evil ways. They and Zedekiah, their ruler, are taken into exile.
- The leaders of the exiled people, like good shepherds, kept the people united and nourished them with hope.

Reading II: Ephesians 2:13-18

He announced the Good News to those who were far off and to those who were near.

- The Letter to the Ephesians emphasizes the unity between Jews and Gentiles.
- All who are redeemed through Christ are one body in him.
- Christ is the way to peace for all people.

Gospel: Mark 6:30-34

They went to a deserted place to rest.

- The disciples have just returned from their first missionary journey and Jesus knows that they need rest.
- The attempt to get away from the crowds is useless because the people are hungry to hear the word of God.
- Jesus, the Good Shepherd, responds to the people with compassion.

#### Reading I Jeremiah 23:1-6 | Psalm | Reading II Ephesians 2:13-18 | Gospel Mark 6:30-34

Question For The Children What do you want to ask Jesus to do for you?

Question For The Youth How has Jesus touched your life? How are you changed because of that touch?

Question For The Adults Name a time when you experienced Jesus' healing touch.

#### Saint Of The Week Paul Miki and Companions, Martyrs, d. 1597

During the 1550s, St. Francis Xavier evangelized much of Japan and made hundreds of thousands of converts to Christianity. Some forty years later, one of those, Paul Miki, a Jesuit scholastic studying for the priesthood, and twenty-five others died for their faith at Nagasaki. The group included Jesuit and Franciscan priests, brothers, laymen, a doctor, teachers, a soldier, old people, and young altar servers. Their nationalities included Spaniards, a Mexican, and an Indian, as well as native Japanese. Of this group of twenty-six, Paul Miki became the best known. As he was dying on the cross, Paul, who was native Japanese, preached to the crowds and prayed for his executioners.

The Shõgun who had these martyrs killed wished to wipe out Christianity in Japan, calling it a religion brought by foreigners intending to conquer the country. A great show was made of the killing. The victims were maimed and then led, bloodied, through several towns to a hill, known today as Holy Mountain, for their execution. This action was meant to terrorize the people into giving up their Christian faith.

When missionaries returned to Japan almost three hundred years later, they initially found no sign of Christianity. After they were established, they found thousands of Christians living around Nagasaki who had secretly preserved their faith, a tribute to the steadfastness of Paul and the others, as well as to St. Francis Xavier. Paul and his companions were beatified within a few years after their deaths, but were finally canonized in 1862.

**Paul's message today:** Like many other martyrs, Paul forgave and prayed for his slayers. It is never easy to forgive those who have hurt us in some way, but if Paul could forgive those who killed him, can't we forgive those who have caused us to suffer in some lesser way?

• Do you have some family member or close acquaintance who has hurt you? Think about how you can shed this burden by forgiving that person.


