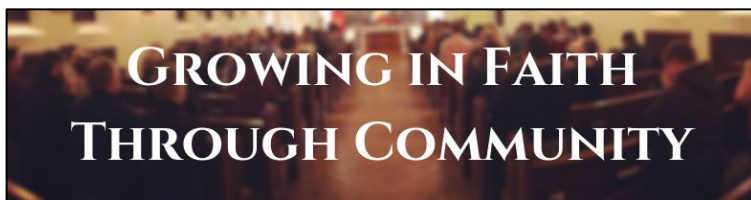

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a

Elisha is a holy man of God, let him remain.

- A Shunammite woman recognizes Elisha as a holy man of God and she urged him to dine with her.
- Elisha promises the Shunammite woman that she will give birth to a son as a reward for her generous hospitality.
- The Shunammite woman shows us how to receive both a prophet and the prophetic word, with openness and an eager welcome.

Reading II : Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

Buried with Christ in baptism, we shall walk in the newness of life.

- We who were baptized into Christ have been baptized into Christ's Death.
- We no longer need to fear death.
- Sin and death no longer hold any power over us. We are to live for God!

Gospel : Matthew 10:37-42

Whoever does not take up his cross is not worthy of me. Whoever receives you, receives me.

- Jesus explains the demands of discipleship.
- Those who welcome disciples welcome Jesus himself. They will be rewarded.
- Disciples are also included among the "little ones." Those who welcome them will also be rewarded.



Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Zechariah 9:9-10

Shout for joy! He comes in peace!

- The verses in the reading from Zechariah describe the messianic king in terms familiar to the tradition.
- Jerusalem was personified as a sentinel waiting for the king's arrival.
- The new messiah, who came like Solomon, would banish all instruments of war; his kingdom would be a kingdom of peace.

Reading II : Romans 8:9, 11-13

Live by the Spirit.

- The Letter to the Romans describes the activity of God's Spirit.
- Paul uses the image of flesh without spirit to describe the person who does not live by God's Spirit.
- According to Paul, that "Spirit-less" person is already dead.

Gospel : Matthew 11:25-30

Come to me all you who are weary.

- In the Gospel today, Jesus speaks, not only as a wisdom teacher, but as Wisdom herself.
- Jesus borrows the language of wisdom to praise God for revelation through him.
- He is the perfect revelation of God because Jesus is God's Son, knowing God perfectly.



Bring Home the Gospel | July 2, 2023

Reading I 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a | Psalm 89:2-3, 16-19 | Reading II Romans 6:3-4, 8-11 | Gospel Matthew 10:37-42

Question For The Children How can you live as a follower of Jesus?

Question For The Youth What does Jesus demand of his followers?

Question For The Adults What does this Gospel teach you about the cost of discipleship and how does it relate to your experience so far?

Activity Of The Week Jesus teaches us that our relationship with him needs to be the most important relationship in our lives. Then everything else will fall into place. Invite family members to share how putting Jesus first can have a positive effect on your family.

Saint Of The Week Junípero Serra

No person had more influence on the settlement of California than Padre Junípero Serra. He was born Miguel José Serra to parents of humble means, living in Petra on the Mediterranean island of Majorca. His early education took place on the island at the Franciscan convent of San Bernardino. Miguel was ordained in 1737, and took the name Junípero at that time. In the same year, he was named a professor of philosophy at the university in Palma, Spain as well as to other posts. He could have worked at this the rest of his life, but since he was a boy, Junípero Serra had dreamed of becoming a missionary in the New World. He accepted an appointment to help establish the church in Mexico and the United States and spent the rest of his life doing so with great vigor and many good results.

Saint's message today:

Junípero Serra undertook a bold journey in coming to the New World. Our physical travels may not be as far-reaching as Serra's, but we are all on a spiritual journey whose course can often be as dramatic. We, too, can hold steadfast to our goal of reaching God's kingdom.

Bring Home the Gospel | July 9, 2023

Reading I Zechariah 9:9-10 | **Psalm** 145:1-2, 8-11, 13-14 | **Reading II** Romans 8:9, 11-13 | **Gospel** Matthew 11:25-30

Question For The Children When you are generous, honest, and loving, how do you know it is Jesus who helps you do that?

Question For The Youth Jesus invites us to bring him our burdens and promises us that he will give us rest. How do you rely on Jesus during times of trouble? When has Jesus helped you?

Question For The Adults As you go about your daily life, dying in love for others, how do you experience Christ giving you consolation and peace?

Activity Of The Week Prayer allows us to let go of our burdens. Have each family member think of one person in the community who has an extra burden of illness, financial trouble, and so forth, and pray for him or her for the week, asking Jesus to lessen his or her burdens.



Saint Of The Week Elizabeth of Portugal

Elizabeth from was a royal family and was destined for a throne from birth, but her early upbringing taught her humility and a strong sense of charity. At the age of twelve, Elizabeth was married to Denis, King of Portugal. Elizabeth earned the title of “Peacemaker” because she frequently intervened between quarreling members of her family. In the royal milieu of the time, family quarrels often turned into wars. On two occasions, Elizabeth came between the forces of her husband and of her son. Two other times, she either averted war or intervened in disputes between rulers of Spanish kingdoms.

Saint’s message today:


In our times, maintaining peace in one’s family does not usually involve averting a war. But peace among family members is no less important—or no less difficult to achieve—than it was in Elizabeth’s time.

Where do you stand in your family? Are you a peacemaker? The contentious one? What can you do to bring peace where there is dissension?
