



Notes on the Mass | July 30 & August 6, 2023

Fifteenth & Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12 - Give your servant an understanding heart.

- The reading from 1 Kings presents Solomon at the beginning of his reign.
- When God promises to give Solomon whatever he desires in a dream, Solomon makes a single request; a listening heart.
- Today's passage is the foundation for the tradition that Solomon was the wisest and richest person who ever lived.

Reading II : Romans 8:28-30 - God makes all things work together for good.

- The second reading continues Chapter 8 of Paul's Letter to the Romans.
- Paul describes the fruit of wisdom, as the single-hearted commitment to God.
- Those who abandon everything for the treasure of loving God are truly wise.

Gospel: Matthew 13:44-52 - The reign of God is a treasure.

- The first two parables in the Gospel reading make a point similar to that of the first reading; everything can be given up joyfully for the sake of the Kingdom.
- Similar to the parable of the weeds in the wheat, the third parable teaches that there is an appropriate time for sorting out good and bad.
- Jesus ends his discourse with a question to the disciples: "Have you understood all this?" They answer, "Yes". But we know they may not have understood as fully as they claimed to.

Reading I: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 - His clothing was snow bright.

- Daniel describes a powerful vision.
- God sits on his throne amidst many angels.
- God the Father entrusts the world to the care of his Son, Jesus Christ.

Reading II : 2 Peter 1:16-19 - We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven.

- Peter describes what he saw and heard on the mount of the Transfiguration.
- He saw the glory of Jesus, the Father's Son. He heard the words, "This is my Son, my beloved."
- We can cling to these words in times of difficulty.

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9 - His face shone like the sun.

- Jesus takes Peter, James and John with him.
- Jesus appears glowing with light. Moses and Elijah appear with him.
- The disciples witness the Transfiguration, but they do not understand it.



Bring Home the Gospel | July 30, 2023

Reading I 1 Kings 3:5, 7-12 | **Psalm** 119:57, 72, 76-77, 127-130 | **Reading II** Romans 8:28-30 | **Gospel** Matthew 13:44-52

Question For The Children If you could be with Jesus, what would you trade from your own things for that?

Question For The Youth Today's gospel reminds us that God's kingdom is worth sacrifice. What do you need to sacrifice in order to follow God in your own life? Why are you willing to make that sacrifice?

Question For The Adults Using Jesus' parable as your starting point, describe in your own words what the Reign of God is for you personally, and use a parable to describe it: "The reign of God is _____."

Activity Of The Week Jesus told some parables to help his disciples understand the Kingdom of God. Read the parables from today's Gospel to your family. Discuss: Which parable do you like best?



Saint Of The Week Christopher, Martyr, Third Century

One of the most popular traditions holds that Christopher was a strong giant who made his living by carrying people across a raging stream. One of his passengers was a small child who grew so heavy as they crossed the stream that Christopher thought they would both drown. The child then identified himself as Christ and the heaviness was caused by the weight of the world on his shoulders.

Christopher's message today:

We are much luckier than Christopher. While we can all carry Jesus within us, he does not burden us with the weight of the world. Rather, he lifts our burdens from us and helps us to carry them if we follow him.

When your burdens seem too heavy for you to carry, do you turn to Jesus for help? Perhaps Saint Christopher will intercede on your behalf if you say a prayer to him.



Bring Home the Gospel | August 6, 2023

Reading | Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 | Psalm 97:1-2, 5-6, 9 | Reading | 2 Peter 1:16-19 | Gospel Matthew 17:1-9

Question For The Children How do you show that you listen to Jesus?

Question For The Youth How does your faith in Jesus as the Son of God affect your life?

Question For The Adults When have you had a "transfiguration" experience? What was it like?

Activity Of The Week With the more relaxed schedule of summer, this is a perfect time to invite another person or family to join your family at Mass or another parish event. Talk together about whom you might invite. If appropriate, invite the person or family to Mass followed by breakfast or lunch together.



Saint Of The Week Dominic, Priest, 1170-1221

Saint Dominic was a priest and teacher, whose wisdom and ability to speak about the faith was legendary. Once on a trip, he and his companion passed through a town in France which was beset by a great heresy of belief. Dominic, feeling kindness toward their host who professed this heresy, spent the whole night in discussion with him. As a result, the man rejected the heresy. It is commonly thought that this was when Dominic recognized what God's work for him was to be. Following this time, Dominic took the first steps toward establishing a preaching order to become known as the Dominicans who helped stop heresy throughout the Church. Dominic was known not only as a great preacher, but also as a gentle, charitable, and humble person.

Christopher's message today:

Dominic had great faith in God. With this gift, he was able to turn back a heresy and perform miracles. God has given the same gift to each of us and if we strengthen that faith, anything is possible to us. As Jesus told us, "if your faith is the size of a mustard seed...nothing will be impossible for you." (Mt 17:20)

Are you working to make your faith grow strong? Prayer, attendance at Mass, and frequent reception of the sacraments will help you to move mountains, if you so desire.
