



Greetings.

A few updates:

- We have made our Annual Diocesan Appeal assessment in pledges and gifts. At present, we have approximately \$9,000 dollars left to pay in outstanding pledges. If all of these are completed, we will receive a refund of \$6,000 for use here in the parish. We are still about 20 pledges short of the number that we typically have. It is not too late to participate and the donations that come in now should remain here in the parish for our use. Thank you to all who have participated so generously!
- Additionally, there had been an adjustment to the Ignite Capital Campaign.
 Originally, parishes were required to reach 75% of their goal in pledges to receive
 the parish share. We made 67% of our goal in pledges. The threshold has been
 adjusted and we will receive the full 15 % parish share of all pledges collected. We
 have pledges of \$920,000. If all pledges are completed, we will receive a \$135,000
 share for use here at Holy Trinity. Thank you to all who have contributed!
- Moreover, I have an update on our parish staff. Carolyn Rainey, our long time Administrative Assistant, will be retiring. I want to thank Carolyn for her work over the years. She has made my job much easier and will be missed! Seth Austin, our Facilities Manager, will also be leaving us to return to a previous position that will allow him to spend more time with family. I want to thank Seth for his work on our facilities and we wish him the best! Please be sure to thank them both when you see them.
- One more thank you to Teresa Parmenter and her army of volunteers who put on another successful Garage Sale August 3-5! This is a great deal of work and is very important to our parish community. It is also a good way to help those in need, as any unsold items are donated to St. Vincent De Paul. Many thanks!
- Finally, our St. Joseph statue is back at Holy Trinity! Stop by the church and see this beautifully restored statue.
 Our hope is many will enjoy this wonderful prayer space.

Bishop's Celebration of Catholic Schools This event is August 26 at St. Francis of Assisi in West Des Moines.



Notes on the Mass | August 13 & 20, 2023

Nineteenth & Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a - The Lord will be passing by.

- The reading from Kings refers to a time after the death of King Solomon, when the Israelite kingdom was split in two.
- Elijah confronts the unfaithfulness of the people and their leaders.
- God comes to Elijah in the stillness of silence.

Reading II : Romans 9:1-5 - I speak the truth in Christ.

- In the letter to the Romans, Paul declares the revelation of God in the Israelites.
- The Messiah, God's fullest revelation, came into the world through them.
- Paul is grieved that so many of the Israelites refuse to accept Jesus.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33 - Lord, save me!

- The story of Peter walking on the water is found only in the Gospel of Matthew.
- Peter is being prepared for his role as leader. He begins to sink when he takes his eyes off Jesus.
- The presence of God in Christ is Peter's strength.

Reading I: Isaiah 56:1, 6-7 - Observe what is right and do what is just.

- The final chapters from the Book of Isaiah proclaim a hopeful message.
- In today's reading, the prophet declares that God's covenant will be extended to all nations.
- Everyone who does what is right and just, will be answered by God's righteousness.

Reading II: Romans 11:13-15, 29-32 - God's gifts can never be taken back.

- In the Letter to the Romans, Paul addresses the Gentile Christians and declares that they should not consider themselves better than the Jews.
- Paul points out that the Gentiles should be grateful to the Jews, whose rejection of Jesus was the catalyst that sent the Good News of the Gospel to the Gentiles so quickly.
- God, who has been so merciful to the Gentiles, will also be merciful to the children of Abraham, the people of the covenant.

Gospel : Matthew 15:21-28 - She insisted that Jesus help her, and he did.

- The Gospel today presents a story of exclusion that ends with inclusion.
- In Matthew's Gospel the disciples were frequently referred to as "those of little faith." The only person praised for having "great faith" in today's Gospel is the Canaanite woman.
- The woman was not a Jew, but because of her great faith in God's mercy, mercy was granted to her.



Bring Home the Gospel | August 13, 2023

Reading I 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a | **Psalm** 85:9-14 | **Reading II** Romans 9:1-5 | **Gospel** Matthew 14:22-33

Question For The Children What does God's voice sound like when you pray and listen to Jesus?

Question For The Youth In today's Gospel, Peter began to walk on the water when he was focused on Jesus. He began to sink when he got distracted by the storm. What is your life like when you are focused on Jesus and your relationship with God? How is it different when you get caught up in other things?

Question For The Adults Tell about your experiences of hearing God speak in "tiny voices" rather than in the winds and earthquakes of life.

Activity Of The Week Tell about a time when you were involved in a stormy situation. What went wrong? How did you feel? What did you do? Did your faith in God help you to change the situation?

Saint Of The Week Lawrence, Deacon and Martyr

It was Lawrence's job in his local Church community to handle the treasury, distribute alms to the poor, and take care of the sick, of which more than 1000 were under the care of the Church at this time. He set out to find all of the poor, the widows, the orphans, and all others cared for by the Church. He distributed to them all of the money which he had and even sold the chalices and other sacred vessels of the Church to support the poor. A Roman official assumed that Lawrence was very wealthy, so he demanded that the treasures of the Church be handed over to him. Lawrence promised that he would hand over these treasures, but needed time to assemble and inventory them. He was granted three days. On the third day, Lawrence had assembled hundreds of poor, the old, the lame, the blind, lepers, widows and orphans. Then, going to the Roman official, he presented these as the treasures of the Church.

Saint's message today: We sometimes have a tendency to take ourselves too seriously, and forget that God has the ultimate sense of humor. We too are blessed with this gift, and should manage the sufferings which we experience with the best possible grace. Are you able to use a bit of humor when navigating through life's trials?





Bring Home the Gospel | August 20, 2023


Reading I Isaiah 56:1, 6-7 | Psalm 67:2-3, 5-6, 8 | Reading II Romans 11:13-15, 29-32 | Gospel Matthew 15:21-28

Question For The Children What is your favorite way to talk with Jesus? What words do you use?

Question For The Youth Do you trust that God hears your prayers? Do you believe that your prayer makes a difference?

Question For The Adults When you pray, how do you know that Jesus will really respond?

Activity Of The Week Spend time as a family writing letters to Jesus. The letter may be as simple as completing the following: Dear Jesus, the one thing that I most want you to do for me is... Let the young children in the family dictate their letters to an older family member. Place the letters in a prayer space and talk about the need to persevere in prayer and never lose hope.



Saint Of The Week Stephen of Hungary, King

In 997, Stephen worked very hard to establish the Church in Hungary, receiving the title of King for himself. He encouraged the growth of the Church, working against pagan forces to do so. He was a just King who governed by law based on Christian principles. Although meant to improve living conditions for all people, it made enemies for Stephen among those who were less fervent Christians. Nevertheless, Stephen was successful in bringing the local tribes together as one people and establishing the independent kingdom of Hungary.

Saint's message today:

Stephen, a ruler with all the power and wealth in his kingdom at his disposal, recognized that he had obligations reaching far beyond governing his people and used Christian principles to create an environment of change. We too can use our Christianity to better the lives of those around us. What opportunities do you see for Christian service in your neighborhood? Parish? Community?
