

Students accepted for enrollment are able to utilize their ESA at Holy Trinity. At this time we do not know all the details of how the ESA will be implemented.

Dear Friends in Christ,

The period between the Christmas and Lenten Seasons includes a weekend designated for a special collection benefitting the new Parish Solidarity Fund. Our Diocese has a long and rich history of responding in solidarity to the needs of missions throughout the world and to needs arising closer to home caused by natural disasters.

That same spirit of solidarity was evident last year when I related the need of one of our own diocesan parishes who faced challenges introduced by the flooding of the Missouri River and the impact of COVID. Together, those factors had nearly doubled the estimated cost of the proposed St. Mary Parish Faith Formation Center in Hamburg, IA. Your remarkable generosity in reaching out to a "mission" in our own Diocese was inspiring. It was my privilege to present a substantial check to Fr. Tom Thakadipuram and parishioners when I visited the site last March, and then to rejoice and give thanks to God for YOU when I dedicated and blessed the center this past November. What a joyful "thanksgiving day" that was!

In the end, your generosity exceeded what was needed to support St. Mary Parish, and so those remaining monies are the "seed" for our new diocesan Parish Solidarity Fund. As we build the Solidarity Fund, we will be more consistently able to respond to critical needs that arise in any of our parishes.

I recall the words of Pope Francis in an address to world leaders. "Solidarity entails the awareness of being part of a single body, while at the same time involving a capacity on the part of each member to sympathize with others... Solidarity is no mere ideal; it is expressed in concrete actions that draw us closer to our neighbors."

Thank you in advance for your support of our Diocese of Des Moines Parish Solidarity Fund. Together we strengthen the spirit of solidarity our Holy Father recounts; we will be equipped to lift up our brothers and sisters in other parishes who face urgent challenges.

At the same time, I pray that the God who is never outdone in generosity supplies abundant graces in the face of your own spiritual, familial, and personal needs.

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

Seek justice. Seek humility.

- In the First Reading, Zephaniah announces that the humble of the earth will find shelter on the Day of the Lord.
- The prophet Zephaniah preached at a time of great turmoil.
- This reading asserts that the humble and lowly are the hope for the future.

Reading II : 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

God chose those whom the world considers absurd.

- In 1 Corinthians, Paul tries to convince the Corinthians that their significance comes from God, and that their power is the power of the cross.
- The Corinthians, who accepted the Gospel eagerly, then began to try to outdo each other in importance, even in their Christian faith.
- Paul challenges the Christian community to rely, not on human power, but on God alone.

Gospel : Matthew 5:1-12a

The Beatitudes

- Today's Gospel begins the Sermon on the Mount, a collection of Jesus' sayings describing the qualities of his followers.
- The way righteousness is described in today's reading is through a traditional Hebrew form called Beatitude. Beatitudes simply declare that someone is happy or blest.
- The list in Matthew's Gospel is surprising, however. The poor and suffering were not ordinarily described as happy.




Reading I Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13 | Psalm 146:6-10 | Reading II 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 | Gospel Matthew 5:1-12a

Question For The Children Choose one of the Beatitudes and share how you will make it part of your life.

Question For The Youth Jesus gives us a plan for our happiness in the beatitudes. Do the things that make you happiest also lead you towards God? Do they follow God's plan?

Question For The Adults How do you describe what it means to be "blest" in your own life?

Activity Of The Week As a family, read the Beatitudes together. Have each family member reflect on one of the Beatitudes that he or she finds most meaningful. Invite each person to share his or her Beatitude out loud. After one of the Beatitudes is shared, everyone prays, "Blessed are you!"
