



FROM FATHER MARK | JANUARY 8, 2023



Greetings.

You may have noticed over the past few weeks that we have been using the altar bells at various Masses. There had been some requests, so I wanted to try them out and make sure the servers would be able to handle this action in the liturgy. They have done very well. It is important that this be done appropriately if it is to enhance our liturgy.

Symbols are very important in our Catholic tradition and liturgy. To assist us in our prayer and worship, we employ the use of incense, candles, sacred music, as well as various postures and gestures when we engage in our celebrations.

Traditionally, bells are used to call the faithful to prayer. At Mass, they ring during the Eucharistic prayer both at the epiclesis (calling down of the Holy Spirit) and at the words of Institution. When the priest elevates the Precious Body and Precious Blood after saying the words from the Last Supper ("This my Body... This is my Blood...") and presents them to the gathered assembly, the bells ring as a reminder of the great miracle taking place at the altar.

We really cannot pinpoint the exact moment that Transubstantiation (when the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ) takes place. However, we customarily ring the bells after praying the words of Jesus from the Last Supper, as the bread and wine are elevated and presented to the people. I hope you find our bells helpful in your own prayer and worship.

Furthermore, a big thanks to all those who made our Christmas Masses so prayerful and joyful; our Deacons, Mass Coordinators, Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Server, Ushers, Greeters, and all of our talented musicians and singers. Special thanks to Tom Quiner and Fran Paterik for coordinating our musical efforts. Another big thanks to Brad Rea and his team of volunteers for making our church so beautiful with all of the decorations!

Finally, thanks to everyone who sent cards, gifts, and well wishes at Christmas. They are much appreciated!



Solemnity of the Epiphany

Christmas

During the Christmas season from December 24th until the Sunday after Epiphany, we reflect upon the mystery of love that is made visible in the birth and early childhood of Christ.

Reading I: Isaiah 60:1-6

Your light has come!

- The reading from Isaiah refers to a time of great hope in ancient Israel.
- Jerusalem, which had been destroyed by the Babylonians, was about to be rebuilt.
- In today's passage, Isaiah associates light with the glory of God's presence.

Reading II: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

We all share the same promise!

- In the second reading, we glimpse a beginning of God's Kingdom in time.
- Paul stresses that God's promise to Israel is fulfilled in Jesus.
- All people, both Gentiles and Jews share in salvation in Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

They opened their coffers and presented him with gifts.

- The Gospel reading today links Jesus to God's promise to Israel.
- The royal title given by the Magi to Jesus points to his role as Messiah.
- In ancient times, the birth of a great person was often associated with astrological events.

Reading I Isaiah 60:1-6 | **Psalm** 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13 | **Reading II** Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6 | **Gospel** Matthew 2:1-12

Question For The Children In your life, who helps you to see Jesus in other people such as a classmate or a friend?

Question For The Youth Life can sometimes be rough: losing your home, moving, feeling fear or danger. How do you experience God being and staying with you in such times?

Question For The Adults How this past week did you demonstrate God's love at home and at work?

Activity Of The Week The three kings gave gifts to Jesus, and we just received Christmas gifts. Go through your books and toys. Make a special Epiphany box for the poor and donate the box to the St. Vincent de Paul Society or another place in your community that helps those in need.



Saint Of The Week Agnes

Agnes may have been a young girl when she died. Legend has it that she was very beautiful and from a wealthy Roman family. Many young men wanted to marry her, but she decided to commit herself only to God. One of the men who wanted her eventually reported her to the authorities for being a Christian, which was then against the law. She was eventually martyred for her faith and is honored today for that.

When we dedicate ourselves to God as the most important thing in our lives, we have to give up some other things. What would you give up in order to dedicate yourself entirely to God?

Agnes' message today:

Agnes dedicated herself to God. None of the threats or the prospect of death could turn her from this course. Like many martyrs, indeed, like Jesus himself, Agnes prayed for her persecutors.

How do you treat those who persecute you: the person at work who spreads gossip about you, the neighbor who constantly complains, or the merchant who tries to cheat you?


