FROM FATHER MARK | OCTOBER 16, 2022

Greetings.

I have an update on one of the restrictions that was put in place for the covid pandemic; namely the suspension of Communion from the cup. At the end of this month, parishes will have the option of reinstating this practice. It will not be a mandate but parishes may reinstate this practice on their own schedule. We will plan to reinstate this practice here at Holy Trinity. To do this, we will need to do some preparation work. I would like to get out ahead of this so we can be ready.

My feeling is that there may still be some reluctance to drink from the cup at least for a while. So in the next couple of weeks, we will have some sheets out at the weekend Masses so that you can indicate (just a number, no name will be needed) how many from your household will be receiving from the cup for the Mass you typically attend. This will help us be sure to have enough Precious Blood while not running short or having an inappropriate amount left. It will not be exact, but I think this will help.

We will also need more Eucharistic Minsters. Please contact Carolyn in the parish office to volunteer. With this reinstatement, we continue our move back toward normalcy.

Finally, a BIG thanks to all those who planned and participated in our Walkathon last Saturday. A special thanks to our Knights of Columbus for putting on another excellent meal. The Walkathon was a great success!

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I: Exodus 17:8-13

God is with us, even when the going is tough.

- The Exodus story is part of the wilderness narrative. The Israelites had recently left Egypt and were on the way to Sinai through the desert wilderness.
- One of the difficulties they encountered was conflict with the Amalekites, a nomadic people who warred against anyone who encroached on their territory.
- As long as Moses prayed, Israel won the battle. With the help of the community, Moses was able to persevere in prayer.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Be faithful to what you have learned.

- The reading from the Second Letter of Paul to Timothy confirms Timothy's commission to leadership in the Church.
- The responsibilities are wide-ranging and the author warns Timothy of the difficulties of this job.
- Timothy's greatest hardship is dealing with the opponents who are seen as rejecting all law and order in the Church while others seem to be set on binding the Church with rigorous laws and practices.

Gospel : Luke 18:1-8

Pray always and never lose heart.

- The point of today's parable is perseverance in prayer.
- The story is aimed to bring comfort to the disciples as they await the coming of the Son of Man.
- The final sentence connects the delay of an answer to prayer to the delay of the coming of the Son of Man. Only those who continue to have faith will be able to persevere to the end.



BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | OCTOBER 16, 2022

Reading I Exodus 17:8-13 | **Psalm** 121:1-8 | **Reading II** 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2 | **Gospel** Luke 18:1-8

Question For The Children Jesus teaches us to trust God. How does God help you in your daily life?

Question For The Youth Jesus tells us that persistence will pay off, if we continue to pray to God. How and when do you pray? How could you grow in the ways that you pray?

Question For The Adults When you pray, what do you ask for most often? How do you know God gives you this request?

Activity Of The Week Take turns leading the family meal prayer, allowing each person a chance to make up a prayer or say the usual prayer alone. At the end of the prayer, ask family members to add any petitions they may have to offer.



Saint Of The Week John of Capistrano

John was the son of a German knight who was brought into the service of the King of Naples, Louis I. While his father died when John was quite young, he had the advantage of access to education. Having studied law, he was appointed governor of Perugia. After bubonic plague claimed thirty percent of the population, many city-states were often at war with each other. John tried to arrange a truce with Malatesta with which Perugia was at war. They threw him into prison and he learned that politics was not his calling. He entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained in 1420 and began working on reform of the order. He turned thousands away from heresy and converted many Jews and Moslems. He organized a crusade and turned back the Turks to save Europe. He contracted the plague and died a few months later. He is the patron saint of jurists and military chaplains.

John of Capistrano's message today:

Having changed careers close to mid-life, John undertook several missions during the remainder of his life. It is possible, with God's help, to accomplish much in your life.
