LENT...IT'S CLOSER THAN YOU THINK! In six short weeks, Lent takes us into the desert of prayer and fasting, along the way of the cross, and ultimately ends with the glorious empty tomb at Easter.

Ash Wednesday is February 22. We will celebrate with services at 8:30 a.m. with the school children and 6:30 p.m. in the evening. Begin the Lenten journey with us on Wednesday, February 22.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting for Catholics age 18 to 59. A person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. ALL Fridays are days of abstinence (no meat) for all Catholics age 14 and older.



BRING OLD PALMS TO CHURCH We are collecting palms to be burned and used for Ash Wednesday services. Bring your palms to church and place them in the baskets by the doors by Tuesday, February 14. Ash Wednesday is February 22.

EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNT BILL SIGNED BY GOVERNOR The "Students First" Education Savings Account (ESA) bill was signed into law on January 24. It will provide scholarships for students to attend an accredited nonpublic school.

The ESA amount will be about \$7,600, the same average amount the state provides to a public school for each student. Roughly \$1,205 per student with an ESA will go to the public school district that the student lives in.

ESAs will be available based on the following eligibility:

**School Year 2023-24** All entering kindergarten students, all students enrolled in a public school, and students enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 300% of the 2023 Federal Poverty Guidelines.

**School Year 2024-25** All entering kindergarten students, all students enrolled in a public school, and a student enrolled in a private school with a household income at or below 400% of the 2024 Federal Poverty Guidelines.

**School Year 2025-26** All K through 12 students in Iowa regardless of income.

# Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### **Ordinary Time**

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

#### Reading I: Sirach 15:15-20

Human beings have free will. The Law is a gift from God.

- Sirach was written very late in Old Testament times.
- The author of Sirach lived in a cosmopolitan, pagan community that did not support his religious values.
- He asserts that we are responsible for keeping God's law regardless of the prevailing culture.

#### Reading II: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Happy are they that follow the Law of the Lord.

- God's law is contrasted to prevailing culture.
- Following Christ in radical obedience was the true wisdom of the Christian.
- The reward of radical obedience was beyond all human imagination.

#### Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37 or Matthew 5:20-22a, 27-28, 33-34a, 37

The Law is God's gift of life. The holiness of Jesus' followers is a choice of life.

- Jesus gave six examples of how to follow the Law. Four of them are read in this Sunday's Gospel.
- He declared that the sin really begins with the decision, before the action is taken.
- The Law is God's gift of life. The wholeness of Jesus' followers is a choice of life.



## BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | FEBRUARY 12, 2023

**Reading I** Sirach 15:15-20 | **Psalm** 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34 | **Reading II** 1 Corinthians 2:6-10 | **Gospel** Matthew 5:17-37

Question For The Children Which rules cause you the most difficulty? Why?

**Question For The Youth** In your own words, describe what the spirit of God's law is.

Question For The Adults Have you considered that laws are made with love? Do you accept God's love in laws?

**Activity Of The Week** Sirach lived in a culture that did not support his religious values. Do your family members feel supported in religious values by today's culture? How or how not? What is the solution? How can values be upheld when the culture opposes them? How does the domestic Church, or family, support its members? Make a plan for supporting each other in times of opposition to the culture.



#### Saint Of The Week Cyril and Methodius

Cyril and Methodius were brothers who were born in Greece. They wanted to live quiet lives in a monastery, but were sent as missionaries instead, to parts of Europe not yet converted to Christ. They were very clever in their work and are considered the fathers of Slavic literature. They translated spiritual works into the Slavonic language, and allowed the local people to pray and celebrate liturgy in their own languages. This made some church leaders angry and the brothers spent their lives defending themselves and their work.

These brothers recognized the needs of the people among whom they were working. Over a thousand years ago, Cyril and Methodius translated Scripture into their language and used the vernacular in their worship. Ministering to their people in this manner brought condemnation from others, but Cyril and Methodius persevered despite obstacles.
