

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Leviticus 19:1-2, 17-18

To be like God is to be loving.

- Leviticus 19 is a collection of miscellaneous laws concerning conduct.
- Keeping the Ten Commandments, worshiping God, and living justly were prescribed.
- The reason for all the laws is to be like God.

Reading II : 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

To love one another is to live.

- Wisdom had divided the community.
- Worldly wisdom is folly to God.
- Obey God and be like God. To be like God is to love one another.

Gospel : Matthew 5:38-48

Forgive and love to conquer evil.

- The Old Testament "an eye for an eye," was an attempt to limit evil.
- Monetary fines had become more common.
- Jesus advised that evil is conquered by good.





Activity Of The Week Have each family member share a time that his/her weapon of choice against evil was "good." How was "good" used to conquer evil? How is Jesus' life an example of good conquering evil?



Saint Of The Week Peter Damian, Cardinal and Doctor

Peter was an orphan who was put to work doing household chores, until he was rescued by one of his brothers, who took pity on him. He is said to have fed the poor from his own table, and eventually he became a hermit. He was made Abbot of his monastery and governed with wisdom and piety. He became a great leader, and eventually a bishop. He welcomed people to the church and was compassionate with many. But he pushed reforms in the church, even though some leaders did not want them. He persevered and did great good for the church. In the end, he lived out his life as a simple monk, which was his greatest wish.
