
Greetings.

Fourth Sunday of Easter

The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I : Acts 2:14a, 36-41

You must reform and be baptized.

- In today's first reading, Peter poses some important questions about the meaning of life to the Jews assembled in Jerusalem.
- From Peter's perspective, those who had yet to recognize that "Jesus was both Lord and Christ" were a corrupt generation.
- In asking the Jews to believe that Jesus was "Lord and Christ," Peter was really saying that Jesus is God and Messiah.

Reading II : 1 Peter 2:20b-25

By his wounds you were healed.

- The reference to Isaiah's Suffering Servant in today's first reading, points to the example of Christ.
- Jesus Christ was truly innocent and when he suffered, he did not oppose with force.
- This message was important for the Christians who were suffering persecution at the time for living as followers of Jesus.

Gospel : John 10:1-10

I am the gate.

- The Gospel today portrays Jesus as the gateway through which we enter the Church.
- Besides drawing on a common image from everyday life at the time of Jesus, today's Gospel evokes several passages from the Hebrew Scriptures.
- In Ezekiel 34, the prophet reveals that God is the shepherd of the sheep. The author of today's Gospel understands that God has become the shepherd in Jesus.



Reading I Acts 2:14a, 36-41 | Psalm 23: 1-3a, 3b4, 5, 6 | Reading II 1 Pt 2:20b-25 | Gospel Jn 10:1-10

Question For The Children How is Jesus your example when others don't like you?

Question For The Youth Sheep know their shepherd and follow his voice. How hard is it for you to recognize the voice of God in your own life? Who has helped you hear God's voice?

Question For The Adults In what specific ways is Christ an example which you follow when dealing with others, especially with the ones against whom you hold a grudge or those who dislike you?

Activity Of The Week Who are the ones in need in your family, extended family, neighborhood, or community, for whom you can be a shepherd? In imitation of Jesus the Good Shepherd, help meet these needs in a caring way.



Saint Of The Week Bernardine of Siena

Bernardine was the son of a public official in a town in Italy. Orphaned at the age of seven, Bernardine was raised by an aunt. He chose to join the confraternity of Our Lady at seventeen and, by the age of twenty, was running a hospital in his hometown of Siena for victims of the plague. A dynamic person, Bernardine began to preach in Milan in 1417 against the evils of paganism which was widespread at that time. He soon became known for his eloquence and attracted crowds of as many as 30,000 as he followed Saint Francis' advice to preach about "vice and virtue, punishment and glory." Bernardine traveled on foot throughout Italy, and might preach for several hours in one town before walking on to speak in another town.

Bernardine's message today:

Sometimes it takes a while for God's call to take shape in our lives. While Bernardine learned fairly early in his life that he wanted to serve God, it was some years before he recognized his call to preach, as well as to lead his Franciscan order in reform.

Have you found your calling in life? If not, what are you doing in the meantime?
