FROM FATHER MARK | MAY 28, 2023

Greetings.

Last weekend at the Masses, I spoke briefly about both our current Annual Diocesan Appeal effort as well as our overall tithing in the parish.

I will begin with the Annual Appeal. Currently, we are significantly behind where we have been at this point the past 4 years. Overall, the entire Diocese is significantly behind this year as compared to last year. I know the economy is still difficult for many. However, over the past few months we have also received communications from a number of parishioners expressing displeasure with some Diocesan policies, in particular the Diocese's support of the educational savings accounts signed into law by the governor. Some have also referenced the Diocesan policy on gender identity. In addition, a good number of these communications stated that they would no longer support the Diocese through the Annual Appeal. I suspect there may be more than we have heard from who feel this way. This is not unique to Holy Trinity. I do understand these are issues that have brought about many passionate feelings in our communities and in our Church. I also understand that we must all act in accordance with our conscience. We all must do what we think is best and right. However, part of acting in conscience also entails having an accurately informed conscience. When we receive an assessment for the appeal each year, this is the amount that we are responsible for. When parishioners withhold their support, it is not the Diocese that is being penalized. Unfortunately, it is the parish. If we fall short in our pledges and gifts from the parish, the difference has to be made up out of our operating funds. I would not want to see the parish return to running an Appeal deficit each year since we have done so well as a parish these past few years.

Speaking to the subject of tithing, our tithing has been decreasing now for some time. However, like your own household budgets, our expenses do go up each year. As with the Annual Appeal, we have received more recent notifications from a number of parishioners who have stated that they will decrease or possibly halt their tithing support due to our diocesan schools now being eligible to receive funds from the recently passed education savings account law in our state. These parishioners have stated that they do not believe the parish needs their tithing any more. Again, I just want to be sure that we are all clear on this topic as well. The salaries we pay our school staff are woefully out of line and lower than public schools (and have been for decades). At present, we are raising tuition. This means more tuition assistance will be needed to assist those families who need help. A portion of the Ignite capital campaign will be used for this purpose. However, more funding will be needed to achieve our goals. Any funds received from education savings accounts will also be used for this effort. In other words, any funds that may be received from this source are already spoken for and will not simply go into our bank accounts. In our parishes, tithing support is still needed as much as ever. I will keep the parish apprised as these areas continue to evolve.

I know we have some recent issues that continue to elicit very strong feelings. Likewise, we all need to be free to express our feelings and concerns and I appreciate all those who have shared their concerns. I do understand that we must all act according to our own conscience. We also need to be clear on how our actions will affect our parish. I hope this has helped.

Finally, I just want to express my sincere gratitude for your historical generosity to Holy Trinity Parish. We try to use every donation as efficiently as possible. All of your support is greatly appreciated!

Pentecost Sunday

The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I : Acts 2:1-11

All were filled with the Holy Spirit.

- The Pentecost mystery reverses the Tower of Babel.
- In today's first reading, the many visitors to Jerusalem are foreigners, thus they are hampered by the diversity of their languages and regional dialects.
- Rather than being confused by the different languages, each person hears God's deeds proclaimed by the disciples, in his or her own language.

Reading II : 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

There are different gifts, but the same Spirit.

- Today's second reading underlines the necessity of unity in the Holy Spirit.
- The gifts of the Spirit are for the building up of the Church.
- However different the gifts, when members of the Church use their gifts to complement the gifts of others, they form the one Body of Christ.

Gospel : John 20:19-23

As the Father sent me, so I send you.

- In today's Gospel, the disciples pass from a state of fear to joy.
- Jesus breathes his Spirit on them and he commissions the disciples to continue his mission on earth.
- Enlivened by the Spirit, the disciples make the presence of God known throughout the world.

Reading I Acts 2:1-11 | Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-31, 34 | Reading II 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 | Gospel John 20:19-23

Question For The Children When have you heard your inner voice or conscience guiding you to do what is right?

Question For The Youth On Pentecost, the apostles were able to speak in a language that everyone could understand. As a young person, you have your own way of communicating Jesus' importance in your life. How will you make Jesus more known to others in your own way this week?

Question For The Adults Share about times when you felt the power of the Spirit, giving you the right words, giving you insight into a dilemma, or in other ways.

Activity Of The Week On Pentecost, God poured out upon the world the gift of the Holy Spirit. Gather your family outdoors and point out the force of the wind. Discuss with your family how the Holy Spirit is like a mighty wind. Talk about how the gift of God's Spirit strengthens your family. End your gathering with a family hug.



Saint Of The Week Anthony of Padua

Saint Anthony lived in Portugal, and studied at the cathedral schools there. He was ordained and became a Franciscan friar. He became a great preacher and attracted large crowds wherever he spoke. He lived much of his life in Padua, Italy, where he taught theology and worked for social justice, especially for prisoners and the poor. He died very young, at age 36.

Anthony's message today:

Anthony has been a favorite saint for hundreds of years because of the belief that he intercedes with God on behalf of many who have lost articles. Any Catholic who has, say, misplaced the car keys and said a short prayer to Saint Anthony can tell you how they "miraculously" found their keys virtually "under their noses." We can count on the saints to help us, knowing that they, too, experienced many of the difficulties we encounter in our own lives.

Is there a special need that you have at this time which may be helped by the intercession of a saint?
