NOTES ON THE MASS | MAY 7, 2023

Fifth Sunday of Easter

The sound of Alleluias fills the 50 days of Easter Sunday to Pentecost as we give thanks for the gift of our salvation. The Easter Triduum recalls the passion and resurrection of Christ in the sacred journey from Holy Thursday to Easter Vigil. "Dying he destroyed our death. Rising he restored our life."

Reading I : Acts 6:1-7

They chose leaders to care for the poor.

- It is made clear in the first reading from Acts of the Apostles, that the early Church had its conflicts.
- The widows were among the poor, for whom God had special concern, and for whom Israel was to be concerned.
- The concern of the early Christians for the Jewish widows in the community, and their apparent neglect of the Greek widows, gave rise to the conflict described in today's passage.

Reading II: 1 Peter 2:4-9

Come to the Lord, a living stone.

- While the setting of today's first reading was the daily life of the community gathered around the table, the second reading evokes the temple.
- The author of 1 Peter envisioned a new "temple" or place of worship.
- Christ Jesus is the cornerstone of this spiritual building and Christians, its building blocks.

Gospel : John 14:1-12

If you know me, you know my father also.

- The author of today's Gospel situated the words of Jesus, "I am the way"; in the context of the meal Jesus shared with his disciples the night before he died.
- His words brought comfort in the face of impending distress.
- Jesus' words also gave the disciples direction for the days ahead.



Reading I Acts 6:1-7 | Psalm 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19 | Reading II 1 Pt 2:4-9 | Gospel Jn 14:1-12

Question For The Children What are some ways that you can act like Jesus would if he were in your situation?

Question For The Youth Jesus is "the way, the truth, the life" and he asks us to do as he does. How do you try to follow Jesus' way?

Question For The Adults How are the promises of this Gospel passage made real in your own life? How do you experience yourself doing greater works than even Jesus did?

Activity Of The Week Talk to your family about someone who works for your parish or someone who volunteers time to serve the poor in your community. Write a letter of support to this person thanking him or her for living a way of life that Jesus calls us to follow.

Saint Of The Week Francisco and Jacinta

One has a tendency to think that, short of martyrdom, saints lived relatively long lives devoted to prayer and good works. Francisco and Jacinta Marto, ages 11 and 10 at their deaths, demonstrate to us that even young children – maybe especially young children – are very close to God and can also become saints. These children lived in a small village near Fatima, Portugal. Like other children, they were sent out into the fields to shepherd the flocks. Beginning on May 13, 1917, the children were visited several times by the Blessed Virgin Mary near Fatima. During these visits, Our Lady also exhorted them to pray for sinners and revealed three "secrets" to them. Today, Fatima is a holy shrine visited by many pilgrims.

Francisco and Jacinta's message today:

We are all "our brother's keepers" and our prayers and sacrifices are vital to the salvation of souls. In a world that seems to move further away from God with each passing year, we must redouble our efforts to bring about the conversion of sinners.

Do you say the Rosary often? Do you carry the Word of God with you in your daily life by your words and actions?
