Dear Friends in Christ,

Today, we have two messages that I wish we could shout from the rooftops, or more likely through social media, radio and our diocesan newspaper. I invite you to help spread the word through the Catholic Communication Campaign.

The first message is of hope. In the Gospel, we heard Jesus explain the Good News in a way that should give every person hope: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life."

The second message is of love. Last year, in celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, Pope Francis explained that through the evangelist St. John, we come to understand the Trinity as an expression of love: "The Father is love; the Son is love; the Holy Spirit is love. And inasmuch as he is love, God, while being one alone, is not solitude but communion, among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit."

In a world in which there is so much division, help us boldly communicate God's Spirit of hope and love using as many communication platforms as we can.

NOTES ON THE MASS | JUNE 4, 2023

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9

A merciful and gracious God.

- The event described in today's reading from Exodus happened just after Israel broke the covenant by making an image of God as the golden calf.
- As the reading opens, God's renewal of the broken covenant is symbolized by new stone tablets containing the Law.
- Then God stood before Moses and pronounced the Divine name. A name that means not only that God is but also that God is actively present.

Reading II : 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Brothers and sisters, mend your ways.

- The second reading concludes Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians.
- It is an exhortation on the virtues of the Christian life: conversion, mutual encouragement, harmony, and peace.
- These virtues live in the Christian community through the gift of God's presence.

Gospel : John 3:16-18

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.

- Today's Gospel passage tells us how deep God's love is.
- The statement about God's love was inserted into the middle of Jesus' conversation with Nicodemus concerning the new birth that leads to eternal life.
- According to John's Gospel, belief in Jesus is salvation.



NOTES ON THE MASS | JUNE 11, 2023

Solemnity of the Wost Holy Blood of Christ

Ordinary Time

For a large part of the liturgical year, we devote ourselves to listening to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects unfolded as we seek God's truth and understanding.

Reading I : Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

One does not live by bread alone, but by the Word of God.

- Moses reminded the Israelites that God has taken care of them in the desert, and they should trust him.
- Moses reminded them that everything they have comes from God.
- Manna sustained them as food in the desert and the Word of God sustained their spirit.

Reading II : 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

We are the Body of Christ when we participate in the Eucharist.

- The life of Jesus sustains our life.
- Sharing his life bonds us together as one.
- We are the Body of Christ when we share the Eucharist.

Gospel : John 6:51-58

The Word of God made flesh, Jesus, declared he was the Bread of Life.

- Jesus is the Word of God made flesh.
- Jesus is the Bread of Life.
- His flesh given for the world was a pledge of our resurrection.



BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | JUNE 4, 2023

Reading I Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9 | Psalm Dn 3:52-56 | Reading II 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 | Gospel John 3:16-18

Question For The Children When people love each other, how do they treat each other?

Question For The Youth The Trinity is celebrated today. How would you describe your relationship with God the Father? With Jesus? With the Spirit?

Question For The Adults If you were to encourage the members of your own parish to live as a "community of love," which is how we define the Trinity, how would you advise them to live? Use St. Paul's list of exhortations as your starting point.

Activity Of The Week Trinity Sunday is an excellent time to call attention to the use of the Sign of the Cross and the prayer that we say when we make the Sign of the Cross. Teach the very young this sign and prayer. Talk to your family about the need to say the prayer with meaning.



Saint Of The Week John Fisher, Bishop and Martyr

John was born in Beverly, York, England, and he was a gifted scholar. He eventually came to serve as bishop, chancellor of the University of Cambridge, and in other high positions. While he was advising Catherine of Aragon, wife of King Henry VIII, he began his final journey. When Henry tried to divorce Catherine, the bishop strongly defended the validity and indissolubility of the marriage. And as Henry took further steps toward separating the Church in England from Rome, John Fisher spoke out in defense of the Church and the supremacy of the pope. Eventually he was beheaded for his loyalty to the Catholic Church.

John's message today:

John Fisher refused to go against his principles. It can be easy to compromise one's beliefs for worldly gain, particularly when one's life is at stake. We can look to people like John Fisher as models when we are called upon to yield on what we believe in.

BRING HOME THE GOSPEL | JUNE 11, 2023


Reading I Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a | Psalm 147:12-15, 19-20 | Reading II 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 | Gospel John 6:51-58

Question For The Children How does receiving Holy Communion change how you treat those around you?

Question For The Youth Jesus tells us that through the Eucharist we will remain in him and he is us. How does the Eucharist keep you in relationship with Jesus?

Question For The Adults Share one way that the Eucharist connects us as "one body" – how does it change the way we relate to each other?

Activity Of The Week As a family, find a chalice and some wafers to represent the host. Practice the ritual and script for Holy Communion. Discuss the history of Eucharist and transubstantiation. Also discuss the tabernacle and the sacredness of Eucharist. Answer questions as they arise.

Saint Of The Week Junípero Serra, Priest

No person had more influence on the settlement of California than Padre Junípero Serra. He was born Miguel José Serra to parents of humble means, living in Petra on the Mediterranean island of Majorca. His early education took place on the island at the Franciscan convent of San Bernardino. Miguel was ordained in 1737, and took the name Junípero at that time. In the same year, he was named a professor of philosophy at the university in Palma, Spain as well as to other posts. He could have worked at this the rest of his life, but since he was a boy, Junípero Serra had dreamed of becoming a missionary in the New World. He accepted an appointment to help establish the Church in Mexico and the United States and spent the rest of his life doing so with great vigor and many good results.

Junípero's message today:

Junípero Serra undertook a bold journey in coming to the New World. Our physical travels may not be as farreaching as Serra's, but we are all on a spiritual journey whose course can often be as dramatic. We, too, can hold steadfast to our goal of reaching God's Kingdom.
