(A play for the whole family)

CAST: Narrator: Lazarus; rich man; rich man's friend or friends; Abraham.

SCENE I: The gate outside the rich man's home. Lazarus is sitting, shivering from the cold.

Narrator: Once there was a rich man who dressed in fine clothes and feasted splendidly every day.

(The rich man comes through the gate, talking with his friends, chomping on a chicken leg, tossing bones to the dogs.)

Narrator: At this gate lay a beggar named Lazarus who longed to get the scraps that fell from the rich man's table.

Lazarus (thinking out loud): Oh, if only he would throw me a bone. I am so hungry.

Rich man (bragging): Friends, I am a wealthy man. I have a fine house, good food, and lots of money. Just see this lovely coat, the finest in the village.

Lazarus (still thinking out loud): I am so cold. I wish I had an old coat to keep me warm.

Rich man's friend: God has been very good to you.

Rich man: Well, after all, I deserve it. I obey all the commandments and work hard.

Lazarus (prying): Lord, you take such good care of me. I love you very much. (The rich man and his friends walk away, Lazarus sinks slowly to the ground.)



SCENE II: Heaven. Lazarus is sitting in Abraham's lap. Off to the side, the rich man dances up and down from the heat of the flames.

Narrator: Eventually the beggar died. He was carried by the angels to heaven, where the holy man, Abraham, comforted him. The rich man also died and went to a place of flames. He raised his eyes and saw Abraham and Lazarus.

Rich man: Abraham, send Lazarus to give me just a sip of water.

Abraham: Sir, when you were rich and Lazarus was in misery, you never helped him. Now he has found comfort and you have found torment.

Rich man: Then send him to my father's house to warn my brothers so they will change their ways.

Abraham: People have told them how to be good many times. They never listen.

Rich man: They would listen if someone came back from the dead.

Abraham (scoffing): If they do not listen to the holy people, they won't ever change.

(The rich man hangs his head in shame.)

The rich man went to another place, where flames burned all around and made him hot and thirsty.

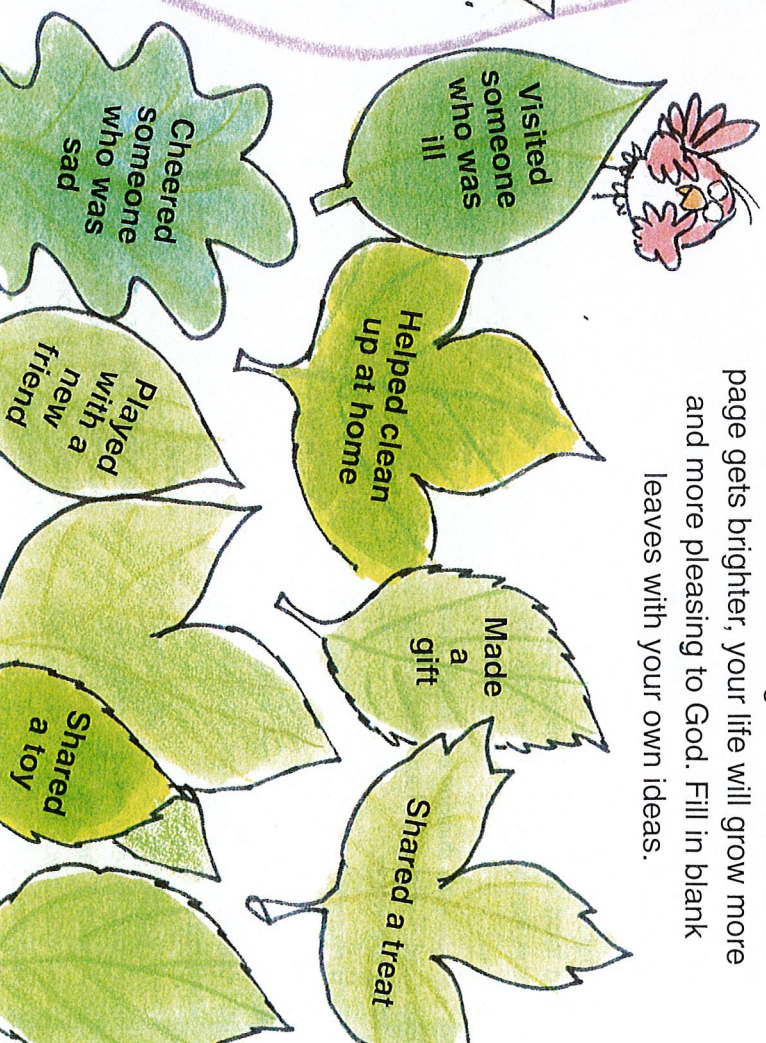
The rich man begged Lazarus for help, but Abraham reminded him how he had treated Lazarus when they were on earth.
