# Letter From *Father Mark*

Greetings-

Last week in one of our weekday Mass readings we heard from the Acts of the Apostles: "When the court officers had brought the Apostles in and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders did we not, to stop teaching in that name. Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching....But Peter and the Apostles said in reply, We must obey God rather than men."

Lately, in our own time, we have seen a similar scenario playing out in the public square. Pope Leo XIV, as the chief shepherd of our Church, has used his voice to advocate for peace and respect for all people even amongst our differences as peoples. We have seen government officials in our own nation criticize the Pope for his calls for peace and have gone as far as questioning his understanding of Catholic moral teaching and advising that he stick to matters of morality.

Matters of war and killing are matters of morality. We hear a great deal about the war currently being fought in Iran. Pope Leo has used his voice to point out that this conflict does not meet the criteria for a just war and encourages peace efforts instead.

Like the apostles who said they would continue to carry out their calling from God, Pope Leo has done the same, stating that he will continue to preach the Gospel of Jesus, especially its call for peace and unity among all people.

There are so many wrongs happening in our world at present that it is nearly impossible to keep track of all of them. As faithful we are called to do our best to promote peace and respect for all. There is likely no nation on earth that is doing this perfectly. There are problems and injustices in every corner of our world, including here at home and in the Middle East. However, like the Apostles and our own Pope, we do all have to decide who we will align ourselves with: will it be those who encourage us to seek the path of peace and unity among peoples, or those who encourage the path of divisiveness and destruction? It is a decision we are all called to make.

#### Learn more on how to save

The application cycle for tuition assistance through the Catholic Tuition Organization (CTO) and Diocesan Tuition Assistance (DTA) is now open for the 2026–27 school year.

Eligibility Highlights:

- Iowa families who meet income guidelines based on household size may apply.
- Students must be 5 years old by September 15, 2026 (Kindergarten or Transitional Kindergarten).
- Preschool students are not eligible.
- Only one application is required per family.

Important Details:

- Application deadline: May 5, 2026
- Application fee: \$31
- Families should be prepared to submit their 2024 or 2025 Federal Tax Return (Form 1040) and any required supporting documents.

Families are encouraged to apply if their household income falls within the eligibility limits.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

## Bernardine of Siena, Priest

Bernardine was the son of a public official in a town in Italy. Orphaned at the age of seven, Bernardine was raised by an aunt. He chose to join the confraternity of Our Lady at seventeen and, by the age of twenty, was running a hospital in his hometown of Siena for victims of the plague. A dynamic person, Bernardine began to preach in Milan in 1417 against the evils of paganism which was widespread at that time. He soon became known for his eloquence and attracted crowds of as many as 30,000 as he followed Saint Francis' advice to preach about "vice and virtue, punishment and glory." Bernardine traveled on foot throughout Italy, and might preach for several hours in one town before walking on to speak in another town.

Sometimes it takes a while for God's call to take shape in our lives. While Bernardine learned fairly early in his life that he wanted to serve God, it was some years before he recognized his call to preach, as well as to lead his Franciscan order in reform. St. Bernardine died on May 20, 1444, while on a mission trip. We celebrate his memorial on that date.

**Bernardine's message today:** Sometimes it takes a while for God's call to take shape in our lives. While Bernardine learned fairly early in his life that he wanted to serve God, it was some years before he recognized his call to preach, as well as to lead his Franciscan order in reform.

## VIRTUES, EXPLAINED!

## Goodness Explained

In the beginning, goodness was all there was. And in the end, only goodness will remain.

The word "good" is repeated so often in the first verses of Genesis that it has become almost cliché. God sees what He has made, and He calls all of it "good" (Genesis 1:31). Likewise, on the very first page of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read that God created man "in a plan of sheer goodness ... to make him share in his own blessed life." (CCC 1). When we see goodness, we cannot help but think of God (Wisdom 13:1).

In baptism, the Holy Spirit gives us the sanctifying grace of justification, which is, among other things, the ability to grow in goodness through an increase in moral virtue (CCC 1266). Baptism, therefore, disposes us toward goodness, and the more we ask the Holy Spirit for goodness, the more it will be possible for us.
