Letter From *Father Mark*

Greetings....

Happy Easter! In the Gospel today we hear of Mary Magdalene arriving at the tomb of Jesus and finding it empty. We hear her say, ""They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." She is confused, what has happened to Jesus, where has he been taken? When Peter and the other apostle arrive, we hear one believes, we don't know about the other. More confusion?

Aren't we sometimes confused in our own lives and unsure of how to proceed as we try to move forward? Don't we sometimes doubt ourselves and the decisions we have made in life. On Good Friday, we heard Jesus cry out "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?" But moments later, we hear him say with his dying breath, "Into your hands, I commend my spirit." The scriptures tell that Jesus was like us in all things except sin. Maybe in his humanity, Jesus had that moment of confusion, but he quickly places his life in the hands of His Father; God.

What of ourselves? We all have those moments of human weakness; those times of doubt and confusion. When the apostles are told Jesus has risen; that he has defeated death, they have a difficult time believing, even though they have been told all along that this is what would happen. In seeing the risen Jesus, they finally come to believe. As we celebrate Easter, are we able to see God at work in our own lives; do we recognize Him even amidst those times of confusion and doubt?

As we celebrate Easter, as we spend time with family, friends, and loved ones, let's all take some time to give thanks for the gift of our faith and for our God who assures us that if we persevere in the faith, we will not be defeated, not even by death itself; that if we are looking for God and are willing to see him; we will see His presence and his work all around us.

I also want to send a big thank you to all of our volunteers; altar servers, lectors, MCs, choir, musicians and especially Tom Quiner and Eric Sharp who coordinate our liturgical music, our cantors, ushers, greeters, our Holy Thursday foot washing volunteers, and all who make our liturgies possible here and who helped make our Holy Week and Easter liturgies especially meaningful. Thanks to our own deacons Jim Obradovich and Doug Renze for their help. Thanks also to John Mertes, our Faith Formation director, who helps coordinate our Holy week and Easter Liturgies. They make my job much easier.

Special thanks to Lori Marso and her team for once again coordinating our Easter Vigil reception; it was great! Big thanks also to Brad Rea and his team for always making our church look so beautiful for our liturgies and liturgical seasons. I regularly hear how much people appreciate these efforts and want to pass along my thanks as well.

Finally, welcome to all those who received the Easter Sacraments of Initiation.....congratulations!

OUR FAITH EXPLAINED



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Mark, Evangelist, d. c. 74

Mark's Gospel is very likely the first one written (sometime between 60 and 70 while in Rome) and is the shortest of the four. He often goes into much more detail in describing Jesus' ministry than the other evangelists. In the Acts of the Apostles and the Letters of Peter and Paul, Mark is mentioned several times. He was the son of Mary at whose house in Jerusalem Peter and the other Apostles stayed. He was a cousin of Barnabas. He accompanied Paul and Barnabas on Paul's first missionary journey, and he was with Paul in Rome during Paul's first imprisonment. Mark was evidently a disciple of Peter who refers to him as "Mark, my son." An early, though uncertain, tradition about Mark is that he was the first bishop of Alexandria.

Imagine telling the story of Jesus' life to people who have never heard it before. Some of today's evangelists are the teachers of faith formation who tell Jesus' story to children.

Saint Mark is the patron saint of Venice. This city claims that his body was brought from Alexandria to Venice, where it now lies in Saint Mark's Cathedral. He is also the patron of notaries. We celebrate the feast day of this Evangelist on April 25.

Mark's message today: Imagine telling the story of Jesus' life to people who have never heard it before. Some of today's evangelists are the teachers of faith formation who tell Jesus' story to children.

DAILY EXAMEN,
EXPLAINED!**Devotions Explained**

The daily examen is a spiritual practice derived from the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. A Basque nobleman, Ignatius underwent a series of religious conversions as a young man following a wound sustained in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521. His Spiritual Exercises were first published in 1548 and form the basis of what is known today as "Ignatian spirituality."

Many different versions of the examen have been developed over the centuries, but all are centered on the same five elements which themselves reflect Ignatius' process of self-review and spiritual discernment.

In completing the daily examen, an individual places himself in the presence of God, prayerfully reflecting on the blessings of the day, the actions he took, and the invitation God has for his future decisions. 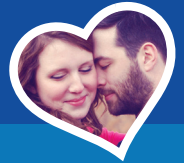
