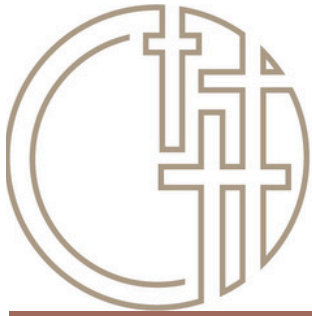

Letter From
Father Ray

We have come to the month of August, eighth month of the year in the Gregorian calendar. It was named in 8 BC to honor the first Roman emperor, Augustus Caesar. So, we still have the remnants of the Roman Empire with us. I guess it is not ancient history when we recall it every day.

Summer is drawing to an end. Some vacations are still planned and summer activities still continue but others have already ended. At the end of the month is school. Things are getting busy in the school. The summer work is mostly done and teachers are gradually coming into the building to get their classrooms ready for when the children return.

I recently watched "The Pope's concert for Peace." Afterwards he was interviewed for American TV. We are not used to hearing a pope speak with a Chicago accent. In his writings Pope Leo speaks to educators and students. He emphasized that educators, especially in Catholic schools, serve as witnesses whose work goes beyond contract, deeply rooted in love. Pope Leo encourages the students to follow the example of St. Carlo Acutis, who used technology to spread devotion to the Eucharistic but limited his time online and made sure he went to Mass, spent time in Eucharistic adoration and served the poor. "Be intentional with your screen time," Pope Leo told the young people. "Make sure technology serves your life and not the other way around."

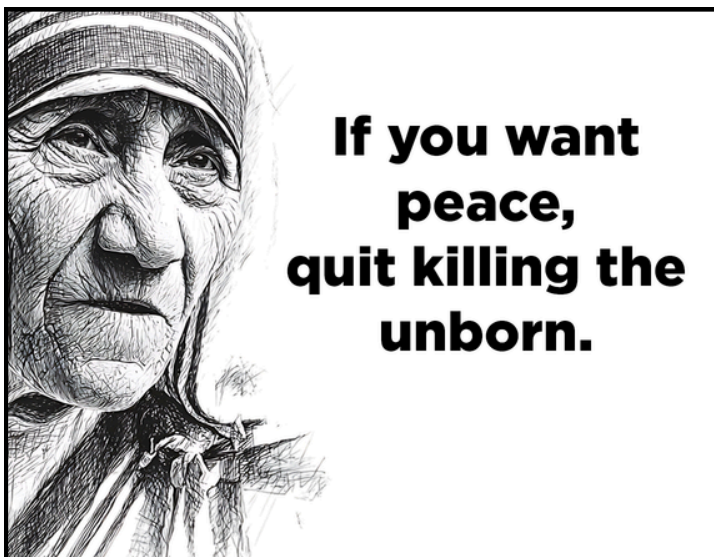

SUMMER NUTRITION PROGRAMS

Beautiful Campus Addition!

The Iowa Department of Education announced more than 530 sites across Iowa are serving free, nutritious meals and snacks to children through the Seamless Summer Option and Summer Food Service Program, known together as SUN Meals. These federally funded programs, which first began as a pilot program in 1968, are open to all children ages 18 and under in a variety of convenient locations across the state, including schools, churches, community centers, parks, libraries and camps.

OUR FAITH EXPLAINED



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Stephen of Hungary, King

In 997, Stephen worked very hard to establish the Church in Hungary, receiving the title of King for himself. He encouraged the growth of the Church, working against pagan forces to do so. He was a just King who governed by law based on Christian principles. Although meant to improve living conditions for all people, it made enemies for Stephen among those who were less fervent Christians. Nevertheless, Stephen was successful in bringing the local tribes together as one people and establishing the independent kingdom of Hungary. Stephen, a ruler with all the power and wealth in his kingdom at his disposal, recognized that he had obligations reaching far beyond governing his people and used Christian principles to create an environment of change. We too can use our Christianity to better the lives of those around us.

Stephen died on the feast of the Assumption in 1038 and he was canonized by Pope Gregory VII in 1083. Saint Stephen is the patron saint of Hungary, kings, the death of children, masons, stone cutters, and brick layers. His optional memorial is celebrated on August 16.

Stephen's message today: Stephen, a ruler with all the power and wealth in his kingdom at his disposal, recognized that he had obligations reaching far beyond governing his people and used Christian principles to create an environment of change. We too can use our Christianity to better the lives of those around us.

HOSPITALITY

Virtues, Explained!

When three strangers came to Abraham's tent at Mamre on a sweltering day, he rushed to offer them respite from the heat (Genesis 18:2-3). When the prophet Elisha visited Shunem, a woman set aside a special room in her house for him, so that he would return and feel comfortable (2 Kings 4:10).

These Old Testament examples show people living out the law of welcoming the sojourner (Leviticus 19:33), a law that found fulfillment in the Christian mandate to "practice hospitality" (Romans 12:13) and show "brotherly love" (Hebrews 13:1-2).

The virtue of hospitality is characterized by kindness and welcome, particularly to those who are strangers. Since the stranger, by nature, has no particular claim on our affections, the love we extend to him is true Christian love — love purely for the sake of the one "who loved us first" (1 John 4:19).

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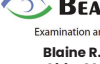
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
