DEVOTIONS, EXPLAINED!

Hail Mary

The words of the Hail Mary — undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer — are deeply rooted in scripture, but Catholics did not begin to utilize the Hail Mary prayer in its current form until around the 11th century.

Hail Mary, Explained

The words of the Hail Mary — undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer — are deeply rooted in scripture. The opening lines of the prayer are taken from the words of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation — "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." This line is known as the Angelic Salutation. The following words — "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus" — echo the sentiments expressed by Elizabeth at the Visitation.

The Angelic Salutation is regarded as the earliest devotional prayer to Mary, since it forms the very first words spoken to her as the Mother of God, but Catholics did not begin to utilize the Hail Mary prayer in its current form until around the 11th century.

An in-depth explanation of each line of this prayer is provided in the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>, <u>2676-2677</u>.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Camillus de Lellis, Soldier and

Priest

Camillus was born into a wealthy family, and when he was old enough, joined the army. He was addicted to gambling, and behaved badly toward others. But while in the military, he became very ill and was admitted to a hospital. Because of this illness, he came to have great faith, and spent his life caring for the sick and suffering in his home town. He eventually became a priest and invited others to follow him. He had painful sores and illnesses throughout his lifetime, but remained faithful.

God granted Camillus the power of prophecy and the gift of miracles. He also was known to have received personal revelation from God on many occasions. St. Camillus de Lellis was canonized in 1746 and declared the patron of hospitals, nurses, and of the sick. The health care professions honor this saint and celebrate his gifts to their field on this date.

Camillus' message today: This saint recognized the slippery slope down which he was descending and, with the grace of God, turned himself around. God's grace is available to everyone whether they need abundant help, as Camillus did, or just enough to keep them on the right path in their journey of faith.


